he Buena Vista Vinicultural Society, formed in 1863 by the winery's founder, Count Agoston Haraszthy to further improve its winemaking prowess and expand its vineyards, has been restored as a collection of unique small-production wines that honor the winery's pioneering spirit and contribution to California winemaking.

The Vinicultural Society explores clonal selections, varietals and the incredible terroir of Sonoma County. In keeping with the adventurous spirit of Buena Vista's founding, we are proud to bring you this delicious 2013 Karoly's Selection Petite Sirah.



Named for Count Haraszthy's father who spent much of his adult life following his passion for wine - from cultivating vineyards to selling wine - Karoly's Selection Petite Sirah celebrates this unique varietal hailing from Southern France. Typically used as a blending grape, this dark, intense berry has strong tannins and dark fruit flavors.

Dark and enticing in the glass, our 2013 Karoly's Selection Petite Sirah opens with aromas of blackberry, brambles and anise. Upon the palate, this commanding wine offers flavors of black cherry, blackberry and a touch of cedar. With soft tannins and a rich, enveloping mouthfeel, this wine pairs nicely with roasted meats and hearty stews.
