

Back to the Basics: Summer Fitness Challenge!

We walk, jog, and go to the gym to keep up our physical fitness recognizing that repetition has a way of shaping us over time. And, being in shape ends up proving beneficial not only to our health but to others around us as we find we have more energy and focus when our body is healthy! How about a spiritual challenge this summer? This summer we are inviting you to do a simple exercise each week: **memorize a portion of Scripture**. Each week in worship we will be looking at a passage from Scripture that articulates something essential about the Christian faith. You are then invited to memorize that Scripture during the following week. The hope is that by letting God's word dwell in your heart over and over during the week you begin to see God alive and working in, through, and around your life. Here is the scripture to begin memorizing for next Sunday:

John 3:16-17

16"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.
17Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."
