Trumpeter **Dr. Michael Davison** is a legendary performer, respected professor, published composer, and ethnomusicologist. Davison is in demand across the country as a classical and jazz performer and educator. As a performer, he has given jazz and classical recitals all over the United States, as well as in parts of France, the Netherlands, Spain, South Africa, China, and Cuba. Widely considered an expert in Cuban music, he performs and teaches Cuban music at the University of Richmond and worldwide. He has been the head of the jazz and trumpet programs at the University of Richmond since 1986.

Back to the Basics: Summer Fitness Challenge!

We walk, jog, and go to the gym to keep up our physical fitness recognizing that repetition has a way of shaping us over time. And, being in shape ends up proving beneficial not only to our health but to others around us as we find we have more energy and focus when our body is healthy! How about a spiritual challenge this summer? This summer we are inviting you to do a simple exercise each week: **memorize a portion of Scripture**. Each week in worship we will be looking at a passage from Scripture that articulates something essential about the Christian faith. You are then invited to memorize that Scripture during the following week. The hope is that by letting God's word dwell in your heart over and over during the week you begin to see God alive and working in, through, and around your life.

Here is the scripture to begin memorizing for next Sunday:

Matthew 11: 27-30

²⁷ All things have been handed over to me by my Father; and no one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him.

²⁸ "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.

³⁰ For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."
