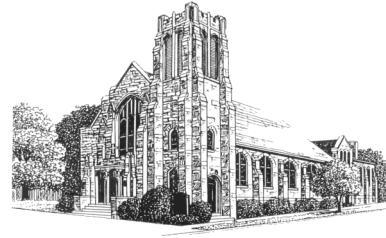

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PANDEMIC! The very word raises the hair on the back of my neck! I am in that older age group that is particularly at risk for what the world calls COVID-19! The government; our own national church body, the ELCA; and our own wisdom have caused us to cancel our live Saturday and Sunday services. Your congregation Council has directed that we reopen the sanctuary and invite you back to live services starting the first weekend in August. This was done by a very narrow vote and is contrary to the recommendation of the Worship and Music Committee and the advice of our pastors.

WHY? Well, many folks have called for reopening in view of what is happening around us at other churches. Others simply don't understand the risks of relaxing our vigilance at this time. However, there is neither blame nor censure for wishing a return to some semblance of in-person worship.

HOWEVER, any reopening will not look like what you may desire as you return to the sanctuary.

AT FIRST, there will be distancing as many areas of our pews will not be available for seating. You will be wearing masks. **REMOVAL OF A MASK BY ANY INDIVIDUAL WILL RESULT IN THE TERMINATION OF THE SERVICE AT THAT POINT!** We will be recording attendance for disease tracking purposes. There will be no singing or group response/recitation of any parts of the service. There will be no Sharing of the Peace. No communion. The Worship and Music Committee felt that the service would be so unlike anything we are expecting, that it just wasn't worth the risk of restarting at this time.

One thing to know — there will be no air conditioning or fans during the service.

There is no right or wrong in this decision. While we may put folks at risk, though that is uncertain, we will provide what some folks feel is a necessary part of their lives. We would also extend the invitation to join us to our Brothers and Sisters from Luther Chapel and the Campus Center.

SO NOW WHAT? We will be open on Sundays only at 9:30 for our truncated form of service. Come and spend 30 to 40 minutes with us if you wish. **IF YOU ARE AT ALL CONCERNED ABOUT YOUR HEALTH OR SUSCEPTIBILITY FEEL FREE TO STAY HOME!** We are not seeking to put you in harm's way. **IF YOU ARE ILL OR FEELING POORLY, PLEASE STAY HOME.** The service will also be live-streamed on Facebook.

I realize that many of you do not have access to the internet. For my failure to anticipate that and make arrangements for folks to copy and share the prior services with you, I apologize and take full responsibility. It was never our intention to leave you disenfranchised in that manner. It was simply a lack of forethought. I am asking members who are able to download future (and prior) services so that they may somehow be shared with our less tech-familiar members.

To our members who have taken the initiative to contact our fellow parishioners, I want to say thank you. I encourage you to continue to do so since many will choose to remain at home in their wisdom to not risk this contagion. To those who haven't reached out to other members, I ask you to start. What we can't accomplish in person, we may just be able to do by sharing our love and the love of Christ with our friends and neighbors by telephone.

I thank you for your forbearance during these many strange and confusing months. I pray for your continued good health and that somehow this period has and will continue to strengthen your individual relationship with our Savior, our God, and the Holy Spirit. May God bless you and keep you. May He shine His face upon you. May He grant you peace!

p.s. Any return to a higher alert status from the Governor for Indiana County will cancel live services at that point.

ANNUAL CONGREGATION MEETING

The Annual Meeting of the congregation will convene in the Social Hall on Sunday, November 15, 2020, at 6:00 PM.

There will be no potluck dinner.

The agenda for the meeting will include reception of the annual reports of the staff, committees and other parish groups, election of Council members, Nominating Committee, Mission Endowment Fund Committee, and Synod Assembly Representatives; and discussion of constitutional changes and discussion and adoption of a parish budget for 2021. The constitution stipulates that no other business shall be transacted.

ALL voting members are urged to attend and exercise their voice and vote. A voting member is one who has been confirmed, contributes to the ministry of the congregation (makes an offering of record) and communes.

The Church Council has determined that the inclusion of this notice in the newsletter constitutes the official notice being sent by mail!

LUTHER HAUS

We are moving forward with the demolition of Luther Haus. A few items will be removed for use in the church building. Beginning August 3, members will be able to schedule a meeting with our Sexton, Jerry, to walk through the building and select items they wish to purchase for themselves. Many items will be marked with price tags.

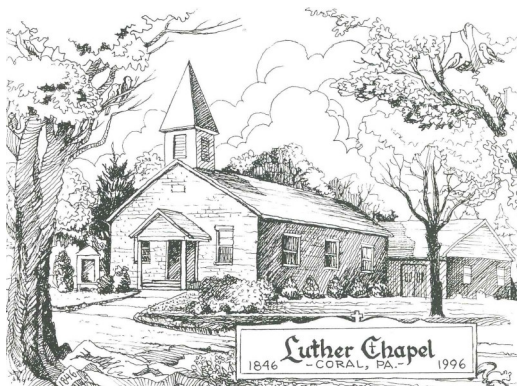
If you wish to purchase a priced item, you will write a check to Zion and give it to Beverly in the office. The item will be marked as sold with your name on it. If it's not priced you will be asked to make a fair donation to Zion for what you wish to remove.

All removal work must be done by the purchaser no later than August 31. If it is not removed by that date, the contractors will be able to consider it as part of the bid for demolition. Any openings in the building must be covered by the purchaser.

On August 17, the public will be able to purchase items under the same time constraints.

We will surely miss this grand old gal! But we have decided she must go and the space converted to quiet, green serenity.

MINUTES OF THE CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL

June 8, 2020 via Zoom

PRESENT: Ps. Sarah Aasheim, Ps. Tedd Cogar, Bob Gaylor, Kathy Gaylor, Barb Lockard, Brian Mehus, Gail Sechrist and Dory Campbell

EXCUSED: Kim Balcerak, Shirley Horner and David Keith

Bob **CALLED** the Council meeting **TO ORDER** at 6:40 PM. Following an opening prayer and attendance, Dory read a devotional story.

MAY 2020 MINUTES: Kathy moved and Barb seconded a motion to accept the minutes for May as prepared. The motion carried.

COMMUNICATIONS: Rik and the Steering Committee of the Trinity 321 Ministry sent each Council person a copy of the proposed survey asking that Council send it to Zion's members. Kathy moved and Gail seconded that we do just that. The motion carried. Another motion from Kathy and Gail came to add an N/A category to the choices of answers (allowing that there are some questions that a member would not have information on). That motion also carried.

FINANCES: A financial report came to Council as a recommendation from Admin/Finance to submit it for audit. Brian seconded that motion. Barb reported that for May we spent less than we took in! Yet, we are still receiving \$2700 below what is budgeted. However, spending is under control. Barb is going to look into the sudden increase in Paychex fees. Also reported was that online giving has begun and it is going well overall. The Admin/Finance motion carried.

Tellers for July: 18 & 19 – Brian and _____; 25 & 26 - _____ & _____

PROPERTY: David Keith reported via written report that the committee is gathering various insurance quotes for property, liability and workman's comp. They hope to bring recommendations to the July meeting. They also are getting demolition bids. The contractor who does the demo will make the green space application.

SOCIAL MINISTRY: The food pantry will begin again in July. In addition, the pantry and Katie's Closet will coordinate so patrons can stop at both on the same visit.

WORSHIP & MUSIC: Two motions came to Council from W&M.

Recommendation #1: Having received a request for an infant baptism, the Worship & Music committee makes the following recommendation, that the parents of the infant be offered the following options: **Option 1-** The font will be thoroughly cleaned and a crystal or copper bowl will be used for the

water. Because Baptism generally is regarded as part of the public assembly, the baptism will be recorded so as to provide the support and prayers of the church community. All will wear masks and will practice social distancing. The parents will hold the child during the baptism. The pastor/s presiding at the baptism and anointing will wear masks and gloves.

Option 2 -Wait until all is normal and proceed with usual practices of baptism and anointing.

This was seconded by Brian and it passed unanimously to give parents the choice of either mode of Baptism.

Recommendation #2 - Upon reviewing the ELCA document "Considerations for Returning to in-person Worship" and after thoughtful discussion the Worship & Music committee make the following recommendation: An advisory committee be established to carefully review the ELCA document and make recommendations as to making careful, deliberate and prayerful plans for future in-person worship as it pertains most directly to our church facility and congregation. This committee to be comprised of the pastors, 2-3 members of council, 2-3 members of the W&M committee and Jerry Ruffner, custodian. Dr. Christine Clewell has offered to be an ex-officio member of said committee. The committee would use the ELCA document as a guide in establishing safe procedures and practices including, but not limited to Physical Buildings and Grounds, Hygiene and Safety, Singing in Worship, Worship Practices, and Holy Communion.

This, too, was seconded by Brian, but it was defeated.

Offered in its place was a motion made by Barb and seconded by Kathy to have Worship and Music with Bob as ex officio bring to Council their recommendation for reopening Zion. This motion carried.

PARISH EDUCATION: Dory reported that VBS will be a virtual experience at YouTube with a link on Zion's Facebook and webs pages. Ps. Sarah has offered her video experience to assist PE. The committee is considering doing the same for Sunday School in September. More will be coming on that after Bible School.

Having no more business, **ADJOURNMENT** happened by acclamation at 7:08 PM followed by prayers and blessings.

ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE COMMITTEE MINUTES

JULY 8, 2020

Present: Kim Balcerak, Bob Gaylor, Barb Lockard, Don Seagren, Dawn Seagren, Becky Slade, Bev Swatsworth and Dory Campbell (via phone).

Meeting convened at 4:32 PM.

Minutes from last meeting: Don moved and Kim seconded a motion to approve the minutes of the June 03. The motion carried.

Financials: Barb shared that income was down about \$1150 over the last few months. Actual income was about \$500 lower than actual expenses. Barb called Paychex to review their charges. Through negotiations she was able to get our costs reduced back to the price from the last twelve months, about 50% less. These prices MUST be renewed every year. We must do that again next May. Barb will gather the MIF group in September to distribute the interest earned on that account. Motion to recommend this report to Council was made by Don and seconded by Kim. The motion carried.

Ongoing business:

Bob will talk to the Fire Department about the placement of the key to be used in case of an emergency.

Steve Higgins will begin seeking bids for the demo and cleanup of Luther Haus AFTER all the items that need to be removed are removed. Bob will inquire about an auctioneer. Items that the church can use need to be removed i.e. windows for the social hall and doors for Sunday school.

Motion by Don and Kim - Ask Council to remove any usable items from Luther Haus and determine the disposition of said items. Motion passed.

Bob is expecting a recommendation from the Worship and Music Committee about reopening the church. It is a very involved process and the insurance has warned Zion about being sued (no coverage).

Social ministry committee says the food pantry will not reopen in 2020. There are not enough workers. All are over 60, most well over 65. Zion will send most of its food to IC-CAP. Zion will retain enough food to give out emergency food as needed.

Motion to adjourn at 5:25 PM was made by Don and Kim. Passed.
