Where The Thirsty Find Life

"God heard...and said to her (Hagar)...'Arise, lift up the lad, and hold him by the hand, for I will make a great nation of him.'"

Genesis 21:17-18

Hagar was used; she was a pawn in the family drama of Abraham & Sarah. God had promised Abraham a son years ago. When that did not happen in accordance with their timeline, Sarah had a plan. In chapter 16, she told Abraham to sleep with her slave and conceive the child through her. Since Hagar belonged to Sarah, any son born to her would as well. In Sarah's eyes, this was the child they were promised. After the birth of Ishmael, for 14 years, her child was the only child of Abraham. And in the eyes of Ancient Near Eastern culture, he was the firstborn son and thus entitled to all the benefits of that position. But while Abraham and Sarah thought this was the fulfillment of God's promise, God had others plans. And so, at the ages of 100 and 90, Abraham and Sarah had Isaac. But Sarah was not happy. In fact, she was probably jealous. It caused a rift between Sarah and Abraham, who gave his wife permission to treat Hagar as she wished. As a result of Sarah's harsh treatment, Hagar fled into the desert. There an angel of the Lord found her and told her to go back to Abraham's household, but attached a promise to that-God would make a great nation from her son (most likely the Bedouin tribes of the Middle East that are the progenitors of the Arab nations today).

But then Isaac was born, and Hagar became used again. In Genesis 21:9, Ishmael did something to Isaac. We are not sure what it is because the Hebrew word has several diverse meanings. The NASB says that Ishmael was "mocking" Isaac. Whatever the case, Sarah wanted them gone. Now, Hagar was of no use to her. And so, Abraham sent them away into the desert. After using up all their provisions, Hagar is ready to throw in the towel in verses 15 -17 of chapter 21. She is waiting for her son to die, and she is ready to die herself. But God had other plans. An angel spoke to her, reminding her of his promise of a great nation, and showed her a stream of water from which to drink. They drank, and verse 20 tells us that God was with Ishmael, and he became a father of his own 12 tribes just like his half-brother Isaac. God used Hagar during great turmoil to bless her son & make out of him a great nation.

Have you ever felt like Hagar? Used as a pawn in someone else's game, tossed aside because you did not meet their needs anymore? Set aside because you did not fit their agenda? If you have, remember the story of Hagar. God can use you for his purpose. God can bless you for his glory. God sees you just like he saw Hagar. In the midst of the storms, God will care for you. When the world treats you like trash, and wishes you were gone, God holds you close and wraps you in his loving arms. Jesus says "Come, all who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28) Will you come to Jesus today to be used by him for God's glory & purpose?
