"If possible, as far as it depends upon you, be at peace with all men."

Romans 12:18

From June 27th to 30th, clergy & laity from across Mississippi gathered for the Mississippi Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. It is a time I usually look forward to, but not so much this year; I was nervous heading into it. The shadow of disaffiliation & separation hung over the conference, and I was expecting some unwelcome drama. On Tuesday, in our clergy session, we approved a report that listed some 100 pastors who had chosen to leave the denomination. On Wednesday, we approved the disaffiliation process for 189 churches. That's around 20% of our churches and 15% of our clergy. It is sobering to think about.

When I sat in the clergy session, I was dreading the vote of the report about pastors who were leaving-the part of getting to voting on clergy that had turned in their credentials or were leaving as local pastors. I had heard anecdotally from other annual conferences in which the dialogue & language had become heated & rancorous. But none of that materialized, and for that I give thanks to God for the leadership of our bishop Sharma Lewis. After the vote, she invited us into a time of prayer. She asked that all the clergy who were departing to stand; I believe several dozen stood up. She then asked the rest of us to walk over to the nearest person standing and lay our hands upon their shoulders; she encouraged us to pray for them, their churches, and their ministry as they followed their discernment of God's call. As I was standing there with my hand on the shoulder of another shepherd of God's flock & silently praying for him, tears began to form in my eyes. It was all I could do to keep from crying. I have no idea where this emotion came from (and even right now as I type this, my eyes are filling up with tears). It was a moment filled with the love, grace, and peace of Jesus Christ. It melted away all the fears that had been welling up in me prior to conference.

As we navigate this difficult time, I implore you to remember the words of Paul from Romans chapter 12 above: "If possible, as far as it depends upon you, leave at peace with one another." During this difficult time, it is essential that we live out the peace that Christ gives us and calls us into so that the world may see. The first church I served, St. Matthew's in Madison, is currently going through the discernment process. On Sunday, their pastor (who is a friend of mine), addressed some heated arguments that had spilled out into public view in Facebook. I watched part of his sermon, and there was a singular moment that struck me. He said "The devil doesn't win when we have disagreements. The devil only wins when we hate each other. And Jesus came to destroy the works of the devil." This is a hard time in the life of our church and the United Methodist Church. My pray for all of us is this: in the midst of disagreement, disappointment, anger, hurt, or whatever emotion may be welling up inside of us, may we seek to live at peace with each other and lift up the name of Jesus together.
