Are there blessings we need to acknowledge and give thanks to God? The Bible often speaks of harvest as a time of gathering and gratitude. Galatians 6:9 reminds us, "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up." This is going to be an important year of church transformation for us. Don't grow weary in doing good, and don't give up! In this season of change, take time to reflect on what God is inviting you to release and open yourself to new opportunities for growth and service. Consider what needs to be harvested and what needs to be composted. Just as fall leads to winter, which eventually gives way to spring, know that God's promises are faithful through every season. May we trust God, give thanks for all of our blessings, and glean what we need to carry with us into the next season.


