Happy New Year! It's a new church year as we begin the season of Advent on Sunday with our Sanctuary adorned in blue and surrounded by signs and symbols that point us to the journey of searching for hope, peace, joy, and love. We give thanks for all who helped transform the Sanctuary this past Sunday. Decorating our houses and the church is more than making things look festive for the holidays. Much of our decorations have rich historical and theological significance. The word "Advent" means "arrival." As everyone is getting ready for Christmas, we as a church remember the coming of Jesus in a manger and look forward to the coming of Christ in glory. It is a time of joyous remembrance and eager anticipation.

During our Hanging of the Greens service on Sunday, we will walk through each part and try to reclaim the meaning and spirit behind our holiday decor. I enjoyed watching folks put up the tree and fill it with cross-stitched Chrismons, or "Christ monograms," which are white and gold designs made from Christian symbols that signify Christ. Stars, crosses, fish, crowns, anchors, and the alpha and omega remind us of Christ's identity and of the Holy Trinity. They help to remind us of the bigger story of Christ coming to save us. Chrismons were first developed in 1957 by Frances Spencer and the women of the Ascension Lutheran Church in Danville, VA. I encourage you to come to the front of the Sanctuary to reflect on these beautiful symbols that remind us of some of the ways we experience Christ together in this season.

I hope that you will take time to slow down in the midst of the hustle and bustle to listen to the scriptures and allow the music to sink into your soul. Advent is the time that we look back to the birth of Jesus and look forward to the same time. It is a time of devotion and waiting, of repentance and faith in the promised Messiah of Israel. Consider all of the things that a family does as they prepare to welcome a child—making room in their home for a crib or a bassinet, receiving gifts of baby clothes, blankets, bottles, and bibs, and watching a baby bump grow with hopeful expectation. How will we make room and prepare for Christ's birth this year? Perhaps you will join us in our Advent study, Advent in Four Words, whether you read along with the lectionary passages or join us for weekly discussion on Tuesdays at noon. For those who have experienced loss or strained relationships, the holidays can be a particularly painful time, stirring up grief in acute ways. We will host a "Longest Night" service on Sunday, December 21 at 4 p.m. in the Parlor. May we open our hearts to reach out to all who are hurting to offer comfort and hope.

In the stories and season of Advent, God opens everything to us through hope born of expectation—expectation that Christ is coming to make all things new. May you like an expectant parent, use these days and nights to make room and patiently prepare your heart for the peace, hope, love, and joy that Christ brings.




