




Living life backwards from here

1. My life is short

Job 14:1-2 "Man who is born of woman is of few days and full of trouble. ² He comes forth like a flower and fades away; he flees like a shadow and does not continue.

Js 4:14 For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away.

Is 64:6 ... we all fade as a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind, have taken us away.

1 Cor 7:29,31 But this I say, brethren, the time is short, ... For the form of this world is passing away.

3. My heart is sinful

Ps 90:12 ... that we may gain a heart of wisdom.

Is 64:6 But we are all like an unclean thing, and all our righteousnesses are like filthy rags;

Rom 13:11-14 And do this, knowing the time, that now it is high time to awake out of sleep; for now our salvation is nearer than when we first believed. ¹² The night is far spent, the day is at hand. Therefore let us cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armor of light. ¹³ Let us walk properly, as in the day, not in revelry and drunkenness, not in lewdness and lust, not in strife and envy. ¹⁴ But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to fulfill its lusts.
