So, when the Greeks became Christians, they really struggled with the idea that their body and their soul were connected. They wanted to believe they could do whatever they wanted with their hands and feet as long as they believed in God.

But, of course, it doesn't work that way. If you love someone, your actions reflect that. If you love God, your actions should reflect that, too. That's why Jesus says, "Anyone who loves me will obey my teaching." (John 14:23)

A few weeks ago, Pastor Randy reminded all of us that we are the only Bible some people will ever read. In today's scripture, Paul reminds us that our bodies are "temples of the Holy Spirit." 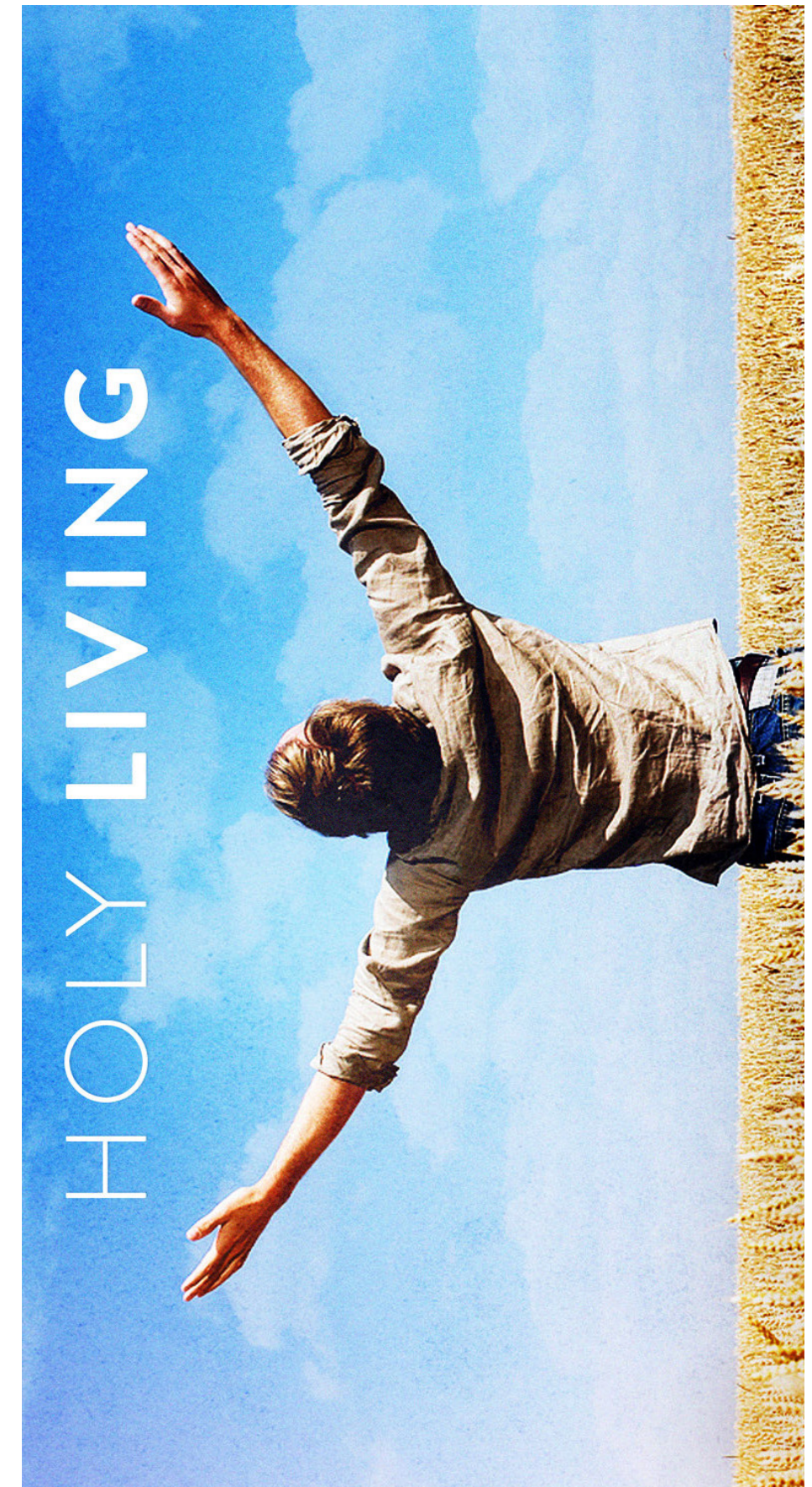

Keep watch over yourselves and all the flock of which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers. Be shepherds of the church of God, which he bought with his own blood.

- Acts 20:28

Famous Dutch reformed theologian Abraham Kuyper said in 1880, "There is not a square inch in the whole domain of our human existence over which Christ, who is Sovereign over all, does not cry, Mine!"

When we fail to remember or affirm that God is the creator of our physical bodies as well as our spirits, we can drift into the line of thinking as the Corinthian Christians did. We say to ourselves, "It doesn't matter, it's my body. Why would God care what I do with and to my body. It's just my spirit that matters... my body, my choice." But that is not the case. We are God's very creation over which he is sovereign. A creator knows how their creation best operates. It is for that reason that we are to honor God with our bodies as well as with our thoughts and our prayers.

The words that Abraham Kuyper spoke in the late 1800's are still to this day a message that needs to be heard both inside and outside the Church; God is sovereign. We are not our own and were bought at a price.

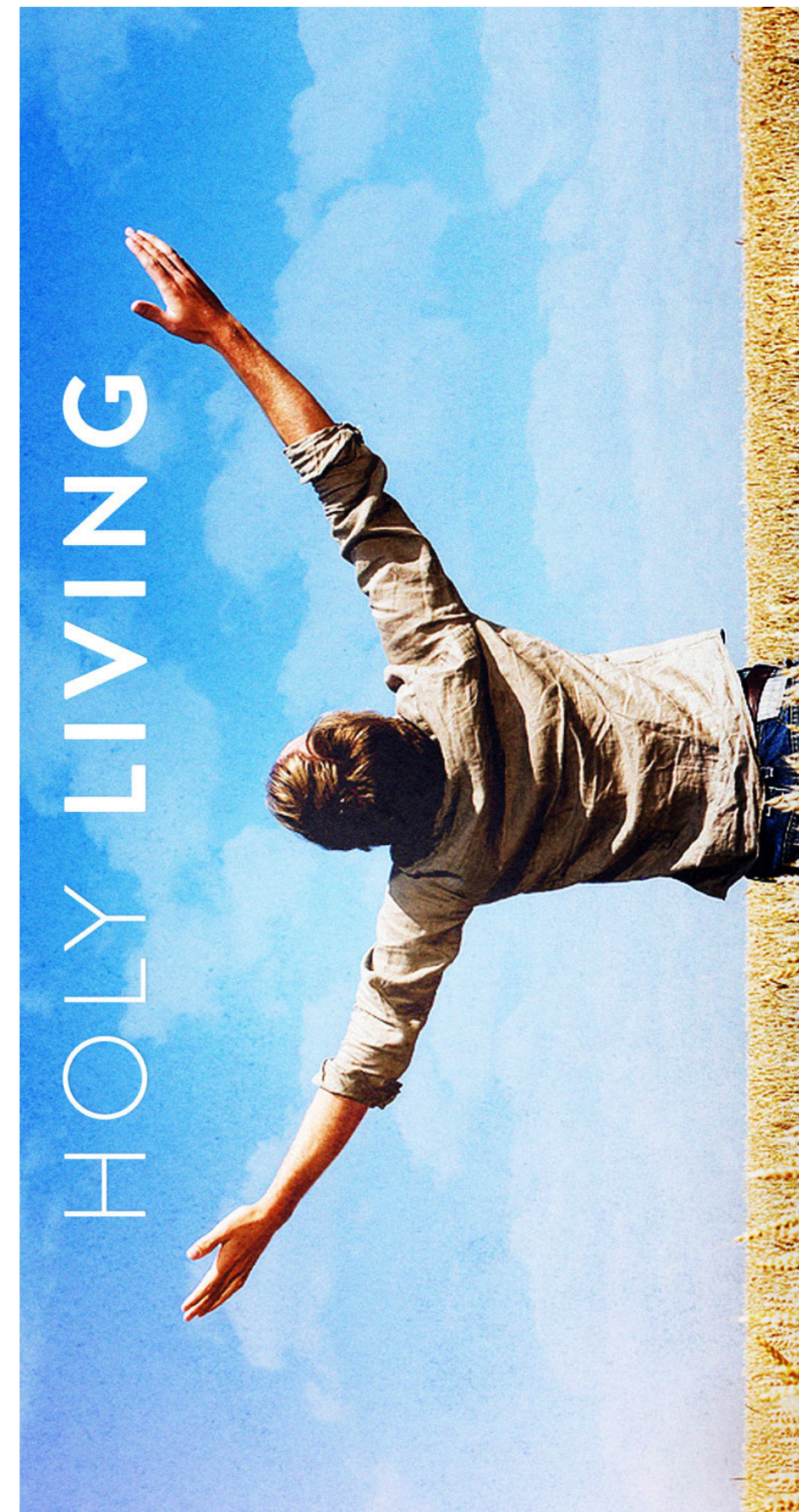
