I once read a comment from a professional chef about the importance of side dishes. In his experience cooking for other people, he noticed that many people will choose a main dish from his menus based on what comes with it rather than on the main dish itself.

If you love mashed potatoes and don't care whether they come with steak or chicken, then order whatever meal comes with mashed potatoes and enjoy every bite! But if we are doing the same thing with our faith, it creates a problem. We must choose Jesus first and not let anything else become more important. If we follow God's commandments but don't really believe that Jesus is the only way to heaven, we have chosen the wrong thing to put at the center of our faith. If we do good things and win awards but don't realize that we can't win eternal life for ourselves, we are missing what really matters.

It's All About Jesus

1 CORINTHIANS

15:1-11

Of First Importance

Keeping the Main Thing "the Main Thing"

Dr. Glenn Weekley, Pastor of the First Baptist Church, Hendersonville, Tennessee writes, "Of the five thousand new companies that are started each year, only one thousand remain two years later. After five years, only two hundred are left. Corporate consultants say that the common denominator among all those failed companies is that they have no clear purpose; they lack a specific goal and direction." Stephen Covey called it 'Keeping the main thing, the main thing.' The main thing in any church is to reach people for Jesus Christ. The mission of the church is given to us by our Lord (Matthew 28:19-20). We are to introduce people to Jesus Christ and help them grow spiritually. Evangelism should be the driving force behind everything we do.

Throughout our study of 1 Corinthians, we have watched Paul defend his ministry as some in Corinth regarded him as a "self-appointed, crazy peddler of the gospel." In our text for this morning, he summarizes the "Main Thing" for all churches.
