What a testament to God's faithfulness, the leadership of Bro. Dale and Mrs. Janet Brown (missionaries in NZ for 30 years, and our ministry partners) and the faithfulness of God's people who have given of their hard-earned money, even long before we arrived. It was a joyous day!

I have the privilege of leading our main adult/teen Sunday School class this year. We've had a good start, and I'm looking forward to it growing. Our discipleship class has also started again, after not having it while we were gone. It is the last book of this course, and we will have our first graduates when we finish later this year.

One of the struggles of ministering in NZ, is the transmigratory nature of the culture. It is quite common for people to move out of the area, or even the country in hopes of a better life. The cost of living here is very high and keeps going up, and it puts a lot of pressure on young people and families to be able to live. Where we feel it ministry wise is when a lot of our young people end up moving to a bigger city, or to Australia. People leaving the area isn't unique to us, but it can be hard after getting to know people for years, only for them to move on. We are happy for them in following God's leading in their lives, even if that moves them somewhere else. But, it is hard to see them leave nonetheless. A sort of constant bitter-sweet emotions that are part of life for missionaries.
