Why do we celebrate Christmas? Some would say in today's secular society that it marks the Advent of the Christ child. Multitudes seem to get swept up in the Christmas spirit even those who are not professing Christians. There is no solid, documented evidence that Christ was born on December 25th. Although the Bible does not provide a specific date for the birth of Christ, it does give us some important indicators describing the events that lead to His birth in the town of Bethlehem.

Jesus may not have been actually born on Christmas day but it doesn't really matter. What matters is that a Savior has been born to save people from their sins (Matthew 1:21).

Paul trusted Tychicus to encourage the believers with the knowledge that would help them grow in the Lord.

In many ways the attributes of Tychicus are reflected by your faithful prayers and financial support that enables me to continue serving the Lord here at home and in Brazil.
