The church construction in the hills of Cavaillon is only reachable by foot, motorcycle or donkey (used here to transport concrete). The man wearing the big hat is pastor Célarès.



The house of pastor Junot, who ministers up in the hills of Vilpiis, is being rebuilt - this time with concrete and rebar.
