The One Who Counts and Counts on Us

We live in a world that counts everything.

Banks count money. Social media counts followers and likes. Businesses count profits.

We count birthdays, anniversaries, and sometimes even the calories we eat.

How good are you at counting? It's absolutely astonishing how many things we count in our lifetime. From our earliest days we learned how to count.

How important we felt when we could make it to 100. Farmers count livestock and how many bushels to the acre. Governments have a census to count people, and on and on we could go.

I vividly remember in Freemantle, Western Australia, watching in awe as around 60,000 sheep were being loaded live on a huge multi-decked boat destined for the Middle East. I think my mouth dropped open seeing those thousands of sheep being counted manually as they ran up ramps onto the boat.

Even in Bible days they were counting. We find recorded in Luke 15:3-7, Jesus telling a parable about a farmer who had one hundred sheep, but when he did the head count, there was only ninety-nine. "He leaves the ninety-nine in the open country and goes after the one that is lost." (Luke 15:4)

What a message to us that to Jesus, every sheep matters. It tells us something powerful: Heaven counts differently than we do. It's a good thing for us to remember that God counts – He even knows the number of hairs on our heads! (Luke 12:7).

We may count crowds. We may measure success by how many are present. But Jesus is moved by the one who is missing. And his mission is still the same - to seek and to save those who are lost (Luke 19:10)

You may think no one sees you or values you. But heaven sees you. Heaven is counting you in. You're not just a number—you are a name, a face, a life that Jesus was willing to die for.

When the shepherd finds his sheep, what does he do? "He lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing." (Luke 15:5) Our God is not only a seeking God, but He is also a celebrating God.

Jesus says, "There is more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine who don't need to." (Luke 15: 7)

This parable tells that God Is Counting on Us to Join the Search. He's counting. Not just how many come through the doors. He's counting how many we are willing to go after.




Ladies Bible Study

- 1 Furnace filters changed January 1
- 2 Wiring on stair chair repaired April 25
- 3 Lawn rolled April 15
- 4 Lawn fertilized April 24
- 5 Stair Chair inspected and re-certified safe for use May 28
- 6 Harald Rust installed a speaker in kitchen so ladies can hear the service
- 7 New 2'x12' non-slip floor mat put in front of counter in kitchen May 27
- 8 Wiring re-routed under floor from projector stand to prevent tripping June 11
- 9 Joyce updated front flower bed June 9
- 10 Weeds sprayed around church building and parking lot June 18
- 11 Humidifiers in church basement started up and checked June 19

Another favourite recipe from Wyn's kitchen!

Roasted Cauliflower

1 large cauliflower

1/3 cup olive oil

1 tsp garlic powder


!/2 tsp onion powder

1/4 tsp paprika

1/4 tsp salt (can be omitted)

1/4 tsp pepper

1/4 cup grated parmesan cheese



CUT the cauliflower into bite size pieces. MIX all the other ingredients together.

TOSS the cauliflower in the mixture. **Make sure it is mixed well.**

COVER a cookie sheet with parchment paper bigger than the sheet and spread out the cauliflower.

BAKE at 400 degrees for about 40 minutes.

TEST with a knife and if needed, bake a little longer.

Most members of the church are doing labour jobs. They are part-time or occasional workers with no stable income.


