(2nd Quarter Apr-Jun) 2012

During the 2nd Quarter of 2012, (Apr-Jun) KZKZ aired programming that addressed issues of local concern. These issues included post office closings,, local neighborhood meetings in Ft. Smith, terrorism, local crime prevention, local environmental concerns, the manufacture and sale of methamphetamine, driving under the influence, legislative updates, local economic conditions, thye closing and loss of jobs at Whirlpool and Trane, local construction projects, road construction projects and detour information, and child abuse, and educating the public on local scams, particularly with the elderly.

We also did monthly interviews with the Community Services Clearinghouse, the Sebastian County Solid Waste Management District, and the Ft. Smith Police Department.

We did a month-long promotion with Hannah House, The Ft. Smith Pregnancy Help Center, and Heart To Heart Pregnancy Support Center to collect baby supplies. We did 2 hour broadcasts each Friday from a different center.

There's nothing that can separate us from his love. And although we're feeling perhaps alone and desperate even, please know that God is here for you. Transcription: Hi, this is Jim Daly, president of FOF. Before we go into today's program, can I take just a moment to say thank you for your prayers and concerns for FOF and for Colorado Springs. As most of you know, we have faced incredible wildfires that have taken out hundreds of homes here in our community. We have probably about 70 team members whose homes are in the evacuated area. Thank you for your prayers for them. Uh ... the things that we treasure most, family heirlooms, pictures or other belongings have been left behind in their homes or lost in the blaze. In a time of crisis, it's our nature to forget that God is in control. And uh ... we do believe that as Christians, even in the face of great adversity. Even with the evacuation of over 30,000 people, uh ... we are not aware of a single loss of life and that is a praise to Almighty God. We have stood by, ready to help the city and others in our community with our facilities and any help we can provide. Our counseling team has provided some help, as well. Some ministries that have been evacuated are now using facilities here on the Focus campus until they can regroup. Thank you to all the donors that have supported us and we're able to provide that space because of you. As we move ahead, I'm reminded

of Psalm 119:114. "You are my refuge and my shield; I have put my hope in Your Word." We remember today that the Lord is our refuge. There is no doubt about it and although we are facing a tragedy here in our community, uh ... we want to stand ready to show God's love and faithfulness to a community that desperately needs it.
