(2nd Quarter / Apr-Jun) 2011

During the 2nd Quarter of 2011, (Jan-Mar) KZKZ aired programming that addressed issues of local concern. These issues included improvements to public school facilities, rabid skunks in record numbers in Greenwood, terrorism, local crime prevention, local environmental concerns, the manufacture and sale of methamphetamine, driving under the influence, legislative updates, local economic conditions, layoffs at local factories, the proposed 1 percent restaurant tax in Ft. Smith, severe weather school closings, budget cuts within the City of Ft. Smith and City of Greenwood, local construction projects, road construction projects and detour information, and child abuse, pleas to the public for help in locating robbery suspects, credit card fraud, and tornado damage and recovery news from Franklin and Johnson sounties.

We also did monthly interviews with the Community Services Clearinghouse, Habitat For Humanity and numerous interviews with the Ft. Smith Police Department.
