FBC OF PLAINVIEW PRESENTS CHRISTMAS PROGRAM "EMMANUEL"

Many churches around the area celebrated the Christmas season with special music and special programs. One such presentation took place at FBC of Plainview, where they presented "Emmanuel" on two nights to their members, family and the community, utilizing the talents of Greg Hall, Minister of Worship, the sanctuary choir and the orchestra. What a beautiful service honoring the birth of Jesus Christ!



A BIT OF HISTORY: On November 23, 1890, a group of eleven met in a school house to organize the Plainview Baptist Church under the direction of Reverend L.B. Kimbrough and Reverend John C. Stamps. The first building was completed in August of 1893 where Reverend J.M. Carroll preached the dedication sermon. Buffalo bones were collected and sold to pay for furnishings and a church bell. The first mission offering was \$30. From humble beginnings, FBC of Plainview was born and has remained a strong and faithful congregation to Plainview and the surrounding area, with a strong dedication to missions and evangelism statewide, nationwide, and around the world.



Remembering Eddie "The Eagle"

The Winter Olympic Games are almost here. The games in Sochi will cost \$51 billion dollars, which is five times more than the cost of the last games in Vancouver. This cost includes building an entire village and sports complexes for the many events. The security will be the tightest of any of the Olympic Games on record. There will be 28 different events, most of which are for both men and women. You will see among other events bobsledding, ice hockey, figure skating, speed skating and ski jumping on both a normal and a long hill.

The other day I was listening to a television commercial with a young lady preparing to go down a ski jump. In the background were the words of Amelia Earhart talking about 'the joys of flight.' That is

what you hopefully do in ski jumping. The commercial was celebrating the fact that women will be competing in ski jumping for the first time on the normal hill this year. As you know, ski jumping can be very hazardous. In fact, an entire generation grew up with ABC Sport's "agony of defeat" symbolized by a ski jumper with whom it all went terribly wrong. The "agony of defeat" man was Vinko Bogato, who on March 21, 1970, realized he was going too fast and tried to slow down by lowering his body, which made him fall on the jump. We saw him careen off the jump hands and skis flailing then being planted in the snow bank after going through a fence. Fortunately, Vinko suffered only a slight concussion, but this video was played over and over reminding us that in sports and life it does not always turn out well.

Do you remember 1988 Olympic ski jumping champion? Probably not but do you remember the British ski jumper, Eddie "The Eagle"? Eddie did not win but he became the symbol of the competitive spirit of the British people and a little bit of all of us who participate no matter what. While other competitors were soaring well over a hundred meters down the mountain, Eddie was going 50-60 meters. How far he soared was not as important as the fact that he was giving it his all. The final winner was a man by the name of Matti Nykanen of Finland but Eddie "The Eagle" is remembered as the star.

Perhaps in 2014 will be the year that you participate in a mission trip or project. It might be in your community or internationally. You have heard others give their testimonies of mission trips. May this be the year that God uses you to share the Gospel, whether here or around the world. Remember the words of Jesus, "I am with you always, even unto the end of the world."

At the close of the 1988 Winter Games while many of the ski jumpers felt Edward had dishonored the sport and now there is the so called "Eddie the Eagle Rule of Eligibility" that makes a second Eddie almost impossible, the president of the Olympic Organizing Committee, Frank King, seemed to single out Edwards for his contribution: "At these Games, some competitors have won gold, some have broken records, and some of you have even soared like an eagle."







the average income of Detroit residents is less than \$10,000 a year. The average home sells for \$3,400. That figure is not a typo! This marvelous mission group teamed up with Pastor Darrel Gates of Victory Fellowship Baptist Church to go door to door, many of which were boarded up, yet people were at home. They were blessed with 114 decisions for Christ and 92 would join various churches in the area.

I rejoice in this marvelous trip and am reminded that pastor Gates is supported by monies from the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering. In fact, he is one that is featured in their promotional materials. His work and that of Dr. Shaw's mission team is a great example of being "Firmly Planted" in the Gos-

Monument Man

It is sad when a church closes its doors for the last time. At one time the church was filled with people from the surrounding farm houses. The houses are mostly gone now and so are the people. The church continues to live on for a while as people often travel back to their home church. Then the burden is too great and the church officially disbands. It is an unfortunate but inescapable part of life on the South Plains of Texas. There have been scores of such churches such as Pansy, Mount Blanco and Cedar Hill to name a few.

One such church in recent days was FBC Spade. Those who were left wanted all the church contents to go to other churches or missions. That has been accomplished. The church is now empty. Except, one last item remained, the baptismal mural.

Several weeks ago. Betty and I went to see the movie, "The Monuments Men," directed by and starring George Clooney. It is based on the true story of the greatest treasure hunt in history. "The Monuments Men" is an action drama focusing on an unlikely World War II platoon including seven museum directors, curators, and art historians. They worked to protect monuments and other cultural treasures from the destruction during World War II by Hitler and the Nazis. This movie told their role in preserving cultural treasures.

I decided to be a 'monument man' and singlehandedly take the baptismal mural down by myself. Bad idea, too large and the folds made marks on the beautiful painting. Standing in the baptistery I was holding the painting up but could not get it out without damaging it. I reached for my cell phone to call for reinforcements. There are not many in Spade Texas! Finally the gin manager arrived and we got the painting out. He was excited for he had been researching the artist of the mural who was very well known for her baptismal paintings which were in churches from Texas to the East Coast. This was one of her first done in 1944.

We are hoping to display the painting in our area office. This will be a reminder of our heritage in rural churches and our continuing mission purpose of, "baptizing them ... " This will allow us to celebrate the growth of the kingdom, past and present!

Postscript: The Mount Blanco church was moved to Crosbyton and became the Galilee Baptist Church. The Pansy Baptist church was moved to Floydada and became the Mount Zion Baptist Church.





2014 Gordon Benson Associational Offering

The 2014 Gordon Benson Associational Offering will focus on "Completing the Task" to build a chapel at the Formby Unit east of Plainview. The material costs are approximately \$200,000 with the construction to be done by our own Texas Baptist Builders. Last year's goal of \$19,000 was exceeded by over \$5,000. These funds have been added to funds raised in the area by outside

groups, and we stand today at approximately \$193,000. Our goal for this year's offering is \$20,000.

You will notice that that goal is \$17,000 over the approximately \$200,000 goal materials. That is correct! Have you ever been part of a building project where the cost stayed true? Also, this cost does not include our architectural drawings, furniture or a sound system. You do need to be aware that your Director of Missions as well as two representatives of the Caprock Plains Baptist Area sit on the steering committee for this project. If the project is fully funded with extra funds left over, they will be applied to next year's Associational Missions Offering.

We have received funds for the Gordon Benson Offering all of last year. However, those gifts that have been given since May 1, 2014, will be applied to the 2014 goal.

This project is more than an offering of dollars or even the building of a chapel but more about the hope in Christ that is brought to the inmates of the Wheeler/Formby Units. I will soon complete my volunteer certification to minister at this unit on a regular basis. I have preached in many different venues but find my greatest joy in sharing God's Word in this unique environment. The appreciation is overwhelming. You too can be a part of this ministry, as much or as little as you like. I would be more than happy to share with you how you and your church can become more involved.



As a pastor for thirty-seven years pastorless churches was not a major concern of mine. I was always member of a church that had a pastor! I did know about pastor search committees but that was about it. I knew that when a pastor search committee shows up, it can cause apprehension with both pastor and people! I personally remember one such committee coming on a Sunday night. It was five men who all had on dark suits and set together in the center section. It was like they were late for the funeral! However, as Director of Missions, I have become acutely aware that when one of our churches becomes pastorless it is of concern to that church. Being without a pastor brings a season of uncertainty, reevaluation, and many other things, including hope for the future.

Simply put, the choosing of a pastor is the most important decision a church ever makes. It affects everything. Perceptive church people know this. A church's dependence upon God is critical during the search, and also just good common sense helps.

Therefore, may we be in prayer today for our pastorless churches, and hold them up before the Lord that they might find His perfect will during this time of transition. Our pastorless churches are: FBC Matador, FBC Anton, FBC Dimmitt, Primera Littlefield, Bethel of Plainview, College Heights of Plainview, Gethsemane of Plainview, Northside of Plainview, and Stonebridge of Plainview. FBC Hart is removed from this list as they unanimously called last Sunday Josh Faucett.

I am grateful that over the past two years our Caprock Plains Baptist Area churches have given over \$26,000.

When linked with other resources in the area almost \$200,000 has been given or pledged to this effort, but still there is no chapel or a projected start date to begin building. This is sad. However, a long-awaited key meeting with officials from Huntsville of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice will take place at the Wheeler Unit on Friday, November 14. The local committee that is guiding this project, From Here to Eternity, Inc., will meet with the decision makers from the TDCJ on where exactly to place the chapel and move toward final approval of our architectural plans. For various reasons this meeting and these decisions have been a long time in coming.

My prayer request is that you pray for this meeting and that we would find favor in a place to build the chapel and approval of the plans. The decision makers will be in the room. Join me in prayer that things will move forward.

Two weeks ago our chapel committee met with the new warden at the Wheeler Unit, which includes the Formby Unit as well, Warden Charles McDuffie. It was a wonderful meeting. Warden McDuffie is excited about this project and has assigned it a high priority. That is wonderful news! Also, a side note, on November 1, the Wheeler Unit will be welcoming a new chaplain. This is critical in our ongoing ministry to the inmates and staff of this institution.




