All that we ask is that you be over 18 and that you present your Texas driver's license or identification. No purses, billfolds or cell phones are allowed. You can only carry your driver's license and your keys into the facility.

I want to express special appreciation to the **Area Committee** that voted in February of 2013 that we would participate with **Here To Eternity, Inc.**, a multidenominational group, to share in the accomplishment of this project.


Dedication of the James and Eva Mayer Chapel "The House That Love Built"

This edition of our newsletter marks the introduction of a New Logo and Branding for the Caprock Plains Baptist Area! This logo will be seen on all our communications to you. We trust this will help you identi-

fy quickly and easily the information you receive from the area office.

The process for developing the logo began at the start of the year with a meeting with our designer Ian Pyeatt, assisted by Katie Woody. They listened carefully as we explained the basic characteristics of the ministry of CPBA. These ideas were then incorporated into the logo.

The logo communicates several things. First, the three leaves stand for the three associations. They are autonomous and yet in a circle together to show that we partner with each other. The leaves are random to symbolize being "blown by the wind" as with the winds of the South Plains, but more importantly the movement of the Spirit of God among us! The leaves are not alike and no one of our associations, churches, or individuals are alike, but all are loved and directed by God individually and with collaborative kingdom goals.

Color and words complete the "branding." In our name we see that "Caprock" refers to a specific area of Texas where we live and where our churches are located. "Plains" speaks not only of a place but a way of life that is short on trees but long on relationships. "Baptist" expresses a common core of beliefs that are dear to all of us. 



Mission Trips and FBC Tulia at 125th Anniversary

This newsletter celebrates church mission trips. A trip can be around the block or around the world.

However, when we think of overseas mission trips it was providential that we attended the first of many churches celebrating their 125th anniversary this year at Tulia. We also need to remember that FBC Plainview celebrated theirs last year.

When I arrived in 1984 at what would become my final pastorate, I noticed on the office wall a three-dimensional picture which was a map of Texas and Brazil with pins around these two locations and red string strategically linking them together. They told me that this celebrated a mission trip that the church had taken a few years ago to Brazil with what was called "Partnership Brazil." This was started with then pastor Charles Davenport at FBC Tulia in the early 1980s. What is now such a common part of ministry today was new and novel at that time. Before we would pray, give, perhaps be appointed as a missionary, and now we are going on short-term trips to the actual mission field. The purpose of a mission trip can be as varied as the church that goes. In the case of FBC Tulia and other South Plains churches with them it resulted in the establishment of 12 churches. This made "Lottie Moon" up close and personal. In those early days there was something of a novelty to going. Today it is an ever-expanding ministry.

But, let me be very clear. Missions is anywhere you go to influence others for Christ to see the Kingdom of God grow. This is done in a variety of ways and places. The ramifications have been far reaching. It has changed the face of how we do missions. Even the emphasis of the International Mission Board has been restructured because of this changing face of missions.

So, look carefully through this newsletter. Celebrate what others have done and creative ways of following Jesus to the ends of the earth. Perhaps there is a specific place for you as well.







FBC FLOYDADA CELEBRATES 125 YEARS "From the Dugout...to the Steeple"


