

Treasurer, or Bookkeeper to make disbursements of up to \$75.00 \$125.00 without the approval of the Finance committee, if a purchase order Request for Expenditure has been filled out in advance. The Finance Committee shall in case of extreme emergency be allowed to approve an expenditure of up to but not more than \$100.00. All non-budgeted expenditures exceeding this amount must have the approval of the church. All designated monies must first be approved by the Finance Committee.
