"If everyone in your church is comfortable with who is showing up on Sundays, then you haven't opened the doors wide enough." I heard this quote from a speaker at the D6 Family Ministry Conference back in September 2017. These words have continued to stick with me as we have journeyed through several transitions here at Converse Church of Christ and I can't help but think of the day of Pentecost and the early church.

Could you imagine the scene on the day of Pentecost when 3,000 people were added to their number in one day (Acts 2:41)? All the people had gathered and heard the good news of Jesus from the mouths of foreigners but in their own language and they were "cut to the heart" and just like that there is massive growth. 3,000 people with their own opinions, experiences, and baggage at that moment become one. They become the Church. What if they would have shut their doors at that moment? Obviously, we aren't speaking of physical doors but what if they would have said "Wow, what a great day I can't wait to do that with you all again," and shut the doors on anyone else? What if they would have been so concerned about themselves and making sure everything was how they remembered it on that first day that they would have pulled the doors closed? Thankfully they didn't!

Acts 2:42-47 tells us how they responded to the blessing of growth and how they kept the doors wide open. They devoted themselves to the apostles teaching, fellowship, breaking of bread and prayer. They provided for each other's needs by selling property or possessions, so no one would be in need. They met together in the temple courts, they broke bread in their homes and were praising God and enjoying each other's company. And do you see what happened at that end of vs. 47? "And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved."

Not only did in one day God move in the hearts of 3,000 people to surrender and follow Him but as the Church continued to grow in truth, connect in fellowship, serve in love and share the good news God added daily to the number being saved. Daily new people with their own opinions, experiences, and baggage were becoming part of the Church. Daily new people being saved because the early church had no desire to be comfortable, rather they desired to bring as many people with them on their journey as possible.

We as a church have stated that what we do is "not about us it is about the lost" so do the doors of our hearts match those words? As we go about our daily lives are our hearts focused on who we can share the good news and hope of Jesus with or are we focused on our own comfort? Has the good news of Jesus transformed our thinking and our hearts to the point that we long for the lost to be found and the sick to be healed more than our own comfort? When we come together each week is the focus of our hearts on helping others be able to experience and encounter Jesus or is it on our own comfort?

May we continue to push the doors of our hearts wide open desiring for all to come to a saving relationship with Jesus. A former mentor of mine once said: "we should always be uncomfortable if we are comfortable." May the doors of our hearts always be open enough to make us uncomfortable for the sake of His Kingdom.
