## “The beginning of the end”


### Scripture Summary


The events of Daniel Chapter 11 are given in the 3<sup>rd</sup> year of the reign of Cyrus, King of Persia. This is in 536 B.C. (Daniel 10:1). In this message, Daniel is given great detail into the significant events to come in the latter days. He is told about the future kings of Persia, the coming of the Grecian Empire and significant kings that will rise and fall beginning with Alexander the Great and concluding with Antiochus IV in 164 B.C. He is being told all of this because it pertains to his people, the people of the Holy Covenant, the Children of Israel.

Esther 1:4 Now it came to pass in the days of Ahasuerus (this was the Ahasuerus who reigned over one hundred and twenty-seven provinces, from India to Ethiopia), in those days when King Ahasuerus sat on the throne of his kingdom, which was in Shushan the citadel, that in the third year of his reign he made a feast for all his officials and servants—the powers of Persia and Media, the nobles, and the princes of the provinces being before him— when he showed the riches of his glorious kingdom and the splendor of his excellent majesty for many days, one hundred and eighty days in all.
