Treasurer's Report July, 2022

Balance Sheet

⇒ The checking acct balance is \$4,583.40. The balance at the beginning of the year was \$20,780.34. General Acct Fund balance at the end of July is -\$16,618.21.

Income and Expense (7/12 or 58.3% through the year)

- ⇒ Monthly pledge income was under budget (budget \$6,500.00 vs. \$5,007.00).
- ⇒ Monthly total income was under budget (budget \$8,733.00 vs. \$5,227.67).
- ⇒ YTD pledge income is 68.38% of the budget \$78,000 (actual \$53,339.00).
- ⇒ YTD total income is 69.96% of the budget \$104,800.00 (actual \$73,323.03).
- ⇒ Monthly expenses were under budget (budget \$12,513.00 vs. \$10,473.44).
- ⇒ YTD expenses are 59.9% of the budget \$150,153.00 (actual \$89,941.24)
- ⇒ The utility bill was \$642.57. Monthly property insurance premium was \$501.08. Paid for new water heater and AC repairs for a total of \$1,980.73 (AC repair-\$406, water heater-\$1,574.73). We received designated monies of \$1,075 for the water heater and AC repair. The remaining monies were taken from undesignated memorials.




