#### **Balance Sheet**

⇒ The checking acct balance is \$3,874.16. The balance at the beginning of the year was \$9,372.02. General Acct Fund balance after January is -\$14,997.86.

Income and Expense (4/12 or 33.3% through the year)

- ⇒ Monthly pledge income was over budget (budget \$6,667.00 vs. \$11,647.00). Received an annual pledge from a church member.
- ⇒ Monthly total income was over budget (budget \$8,970.00 vs. \$13,980.71).
- $\Rightarrow$  YTD pledge income is 40.01% of the budget \$80,000 (actual \$32,009.00).
- ⇒ YTD total income is 37.52% of the budget \$107,600.00 (actual \$40,376.49).
- ⇒ Monthly expenses were over budget (budget \$12,511.00 vs. \$13,100.18).
- ⇒ YTD expenses are 36.92% of the budget \$150,004.00 (actual \$55,374.35)
- ⇒ The utility bill was \$2,009.34. Paid Otis Elevator \$500 for maintenance. Borrowed \$5,000 from the memorial fund to cover General Fund expenses.



In addition, there are several tasks that will be kicking off soon. I will be in touch with people who have volunteered to help to get them in motion.





# FRAUD ALERTS:

## SCAMMERS STEAL MONEY FROM THE PUBLIC THROUGH FAKE HHS WEBSITES, SOCIAL MEDIA SCHEMES, AND IRS SCAMS

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), Office of Inspector General (OIG) is alerting the public to a fraud scheme that uses social media and fake websites to steal money from individuals by offering fake **HHS grants.** 

The scheme involves scammers pretending to offer you grants from HHS and asking for payment or personal information to receive the fake grants. Scammers may use various social media platforms and chat applications to contact you and direct you to fake websites, online chats, chat boxes, or live customer support in order to lure you into providing your personal or information. financial scammers may pretend to be a "friend" or someone from HHS. Although the precise message may vary, the scammer provides fake HHS employee information or a link to a fake HHS website, tells you receive free that you will Government grant money, and then asks you for money or personal information.

Do not pay scammers. HHS will never ask you to pay money to receive a grant. Scammers may ask you to send gift cards or money to cover processing and/or delivery fees. Do not respond to, pay, or share any financial information with anyone contacting you via social media, email, or otherwise offering free HHS grants or money.

information. HHS will not message you through social media to begin a grant application. Scammers may offer fake HHS grant money in exchange for personal or financial Security number, date of birth, address, bank account number, login information, or copies of your The IRS does NOT initiate contact personal identification.

websites. HHS websites always use a .gov domain. HHS does not irs.gov/balancedue. use .org, .com, or .us domains.

scams. Never Report grant respond to any schemes that try to get you to pay money or give your personal information for an HHS vulnerable to a scam. Know what to grant. If you receive such a call or save and what to shred. hotline message, submit complaint

#### **IRS SCAMS**

According to the Federal Trade Commission, one of the longest running impostor scams involves the IRS, so tax time is a good time to draw attention to it.

Most IRS impostor scams begin as a robocall, with the message either directing you to press a number on

Do not share your personal your keypad to talk with a live agent, or to call back using the number provided. The messages can be negative, you owe back taxes, or positive, you're receiving a refund. #### WHEN TO SAVE, WHEN TO SHRED

During tax season, a great deal of personally identifying information is shared and can make you

Old tax returns: Unless you plan to run for president, you need only to hold on to your old tax returns and supporting documents for three years. If you're self-employed or have a complicated return, double that to six years.

Do you own your home? Keep financial records related to real estate for seven years after you sell. home-improvement using receipts, you can potentially reduce any taxes you might owe on the sale.

Banking/Investments: If you or your spouse might apply for Medicaid nursing for coverage, you'll need to produce

five years of financial records. Otherwise, keep banking and financial statements for a year.

**Own stocks or bonds?** Keep records of any purchase for six years after you file the return reporting the sale of that security.

**Medical:** Retain all medical test results (such as blood-test results, X-rays, surgical reports, etc) indefinitely. Keep immunization and vaccination records permanently, too. Hold on to proof of payments to medical providers for six years.

**Final tip:** Dump that shoebox of old canceled checks. Electronic versions are retained by your bank or credit union.
