# Fr. Russell's Ruminations

Dear Beloved Friends in and of Christ,

I am writing to you just a few hours after we left a wonderful celebration of our Patronal Feast of Christ the King. By God's grace and provision, we now have a new church home and with it an opportunity for new ministry opportunities and a season for renewed commitment to reaching the people of Poway and Ramona with the Good News of Jesus Christ, Crucified and Resurrected—of God's desire that none should perish but have everlasting life through Jesus the Son. But with this great opportunity comes an awesome responsibility—to carry on the mantle of Resurrection Community Church and of Fr. Gary and Barbara Crandall by continuing their legacy of being a "City on a Hill", an outpost of Kingdom life and light. While there are and will be some challenges to just how we will grow into this opportunity, I am certain that it is an opportunity that comes with a promise of God's blessing of provision provided we keep our focus on Him as Lord of the Church and King of our hearts!

This reminds me of two important biblical truths. First, that we must be willing to partner with God and what HE is doing in the World. In other words, We join HIM in the work HE is already doing in a way that honors and glorifies HIM even as it seeks to bless and love others. St. James, offers a clear picture of what this should include when he writes, "**Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world James**". (James 1:27 ESV) For James, authentic religion what we might refer to as "discipleship" requires a practical application and outward focus. Our response to God's grace and salvation is to share our joy and blessings with those who are most vulnerable in our communities, both within and more importantly outside the present body of the Church. We must commit ourselves (CTK) to being a "**Church Community that Loves the Community around us!**" Our new Church home provides with an ongoing presence in Poway and a launching pad for reaching those who need Jesus and who desire to join us in building an Outpost for the Kingdom of Heaven.

The Second truth, is one that is recorded by St. Luke in the Second Chapter of the Acts of the Apostles, where he records the character of the early church and how they sought to fulfill God's call to live in and as a Community. He writes:

**And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. And awe came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. And all who believed were together and had all things in common. And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need. And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved.** (Acts 2:42-47 ESV)

Luke provides us a beautiful image and potent model for the new ministry for Christ the King Anglican Church at what I am now calling **Resurrection Hill**. It is instructive to take note of what those early Christians did and how God blessed them in the process.

First, what did they devote themselves to? They devoted themselves to four things: 1. The Apostle's Teaching (Scripture/The Word of God), 2. Fellowship (Sharing a life together), 3. Breaking of Bread (The Eucharist/Sacraments), 4. Prayer. By devoting themselves to these things, it means that the disciples made them a priority not in their individual lives but also in the corporate life of the church. That is they shared priorities which recognized and celebrated Jesus' sovereignty. If we are to fulfill the call God has given us in this new season then we must also make these things our focus and priority!

Second, notice the response and result of making the Kingdom of Heaven the priority. Awe descended upon all and there were attendant signs and wonders (miraculous signs). The lesson is clear that as we seek God we will indeed find HIM (c.f. Isaiah 55:6) and that He will pour out His power and the Holy Spirit upon His Church (Joel 2:28-32). So as the Church glorified and sought the Lord He blessed them with His power and grace to bring forth His Kingdom –through signs and wonders—which results in awe falling upon the people. Moreover, those early believers, that nascent church, was granted (DIVINE) favor with those around them. It was then and only then that the LORD ADDED TO THEIR NUMBERS! The Lord not only added to their numbers one time or even a few times but Luke records an amazing fact that it was “day after day”! There is no great mystery or trade secret, as to how or why this happened. It happened for one very simple reason. The Early Church devoted themselves first and foremost to God and His Kingdom—They were obedient! They kept doing the things that Jesus had commanded them and lo and behold, their obedience bore fruit!

My point, sisters and brothers, is this if we want to grow then we need to do the things that God has commanded us to do without pause or reservation, rather wholeheartedly, with zeal and with an earnest desire to be open to God and what He would do with and through us in this next season of life both as individuals and as a congregation. I am not talking about us simply doing the same old things with either a renewed vigor or greater determination. NO, I am talking about us having a fundamental shift in the way we think and act as a Church. We can no longer merely content ourselves on ministering to ourselves or just taking care of the “Home Front,” while watch the community and world around us descend further and further in to HELL’s grip. No we need to view ourselves as lifeguards who brave the waves to reach people with the lifesaving message of the Gospel of Jesus Christ! I will be writing and teaching more about the how we do this in the coming months.

In the meantime, I want to have us do three simple things that will prepare us for the battle that not only lays ahead but also is the one that our Lord has specifically, commissioned us to prosecute (c.f. Matthew 28:16-20 & Acts 1:8). First, we must have a fundamental change of attitude. By this I mean we must shift our focus from maintaining what we are/have and focus on reaching the lost. A lifeguard accepts risk when she or he wades out to rescue someone from drowning. The lifeguard could play it safe and simply yell at the drowning man and say, “Swim to shore, you will be much safer there—there is less water!” or they can do the job they were commissioned to do and go out and bring the man to shore. Our task as a Church, an outpost of Heaven’s Kingdom is to do the latter. We are called to rescue those who would perish amongst the waves of life. In other words, we must stop playing it safe, leave the shore and get into the water and DO OUR JOB! Second, every one of us needs to seek the Lord’s face in prayer and specifically entreat God as to what active part they are to take in this next season of ministry. There is no more—“Here am I Lord, send him!”. It is everyone’s duty to fulfill the Great Commission as it has been imparted by the Lord and now is being realized in our new circumstances with having been granted Resurrection Hill! This begins with prayer and second with actively participating in reaching out and loving the communities around us. Lastly, we will collectively commit to reading and actively living out the principles contained in the Robert Lewis’ book, *A Church of Irresistible Influence*, copies of which are available at CtK even now. Our Bishop, Keith Andrews, has made this required reading for all the Clergy and I have found the portion I have read thus far, to be extremely helpful in both understanding the challenges we face and the opportunities that await us.

Beloved, we have been given an amazing opportunity and I for one do not want to squander or in any way diminish it. God has given us the “Church” He promised twelve years ago so let’s be a congregation that makes Him proud and one which takes the TALENTS invested in us and multiplies them for the glory of our King! I wish you a blessed and wonder Advent!

# Vestry Report

Some highlights from the Vestry meetings in OCTOBER & NOVEMBER -

In October it was reported that several Bible Studies have or will be starting back up after the summer hiatus, including a new Sunday morning study in Poway from 9-9:45 with Dcn Jason.

Fr. Russell has made a connection with an organization called PRISON FELLOWSHIP and XTK will be providing some Angel Tree gifts for children of incarcerated inmates via this program. A Children's Advent Party is also being planned for December 1.

Pledge cards were handed out in Poway and Ramona on October 14 and are due back November 10th at the Annual Meeting.

Fr. Russell shared with the Vestry that Fr. Gary has made it clear he wishes to retire from active ministry by the end of November and has offered CTK the opportunity to renegotiate our lease to include sole use of the Sanctuary for worship and the fellowship hall as well. The Vestry authorized Fr. Russell to continue this discussion with Fr. Gary and to come to terms with him on financial and other obligations. Some joint services between CTK & RCC will be held in early November as Fr. Gary will be out of town.

The Annual Parish meeting will be held on Saturday, November 10th from 9:30-1:30 and will include worship, business meeting, reviews and future plans, Vestry election, and a fellowship lunch. Final details will be worked on at the November Vestry meeting, which is set one week early on December 6. Several other items were postponed due to lengthy discussion on RCC.

In November it was reported that Mac Nibbs and Brian De Pierre have agreed to stand for Vestry election to replace Jim and Mary Carol. The Vestry made a motion to appoint Jim Heaton to fulfill the remainder of Wesley Jenkins vestry term and the motion was seconded and passed. The Vestry appointed Mary Carol Johnson as our Lay Delegate for the Diocese during 2019 and Molly Martin as the alternate.

More details of the agreement with Fr. Gary were shared and discussed. Our current sanctuary will become a Multi-purpose room with possible future designs as a ministry space for an outside group if needed. The RCC sanctuary and kitchen/bathroom building will be the responsibility of CTK both in terms of use and of upkeep/maintenance. Several storage areas will be available to CTK eventually once some of the RCC things have been cleared. CTK will also continue to clean up and out our current storage areas (shed, trailer, etc) as we transition into the new spaces.

The CTK Annual Parish Meeting was held on November 10th and began with Morning Prayer and ended with a Fellowship Lunch. Mac Nibbs and Brian De Pierre were elected to the Vestry by acclamation. A quick review of current 2018 financials showed a very good year in terms of both Income and Expenses. A very rough draft of the 2019 budget was presented with the biggest changes being an increase in the Rent for the RCC campus spaces and an additional contingency/maintenance fund. Fr. Russell outlined the new lease agreement with Fr. Gary and fielded many questions from the congregation. Plans were shared for a Celebration of Ministry all-CTK service on November 25 (Christ the King Day) and a Reception Luncheon in honor of the Crandalls.

**Homeless Veterans' Stand Down** is set for 2-7-19 through 2-10-19 at Green Oak Ranch in Vista. This four-day event is aimed at providing a respite from the streets for homeless vets in the form of cabin living, catered dining, indoor VA services, medical dental, legal aid, clothing distribution, housing assistance and an array of other "Veterans and homeless assistance services." As we did last year, we will be collecting socks, underwear, twin blankets, adjustable belts, sweat pants, and other gently used clothing items as we get closer to the event. A large, suitably decorated, box has been brought to church and will be used to collect donations for the event. Stand by for lots more info!

**What is the purpose of outreach?** It is not just to meet needs in the community, important as that is, it is to fulfill God's commandment to love our neighbors and to prepare people to hear the Good News of Jesus Christ. It is reaching out to the community in a personal and loving way. Dr. Rick Warren, author of the Purpose Driven Church, writes that "anybody can be won to Christ if you discover the key to his or her heart...the most likely place to start is with the person's felt needs." As we go about reaching out to our community and beyond, we need your prayers and your help. If you are new to Christ the King Church, we would love to have you join our team. Happy Advent! Any more it seems like we rush from Halloween to Thanksgiving to Christmas to Valentines day, with barely a pause for breath. I would highly encourage you to take this Advent season as a time to pause, take a breath, and take your mind off your to-do list. Here are some thoughts:

1. Now is a great time to consider doing morning or evening prayer (or both!). Take time to meditate on the readings assigned during this time – maybe even journal about them. There is also a “Family Prayer” version (which is a little shorter). What a great tradition to start with your children or grandchildren. You can find all these resources at [http://anglicanchurch.net/?/main/texts\\_for\\_common\\_prayer](http://anglicanchurch.net/?/main/texts_for_common_prayer)
2. “The Advent Conspiracy” (<https://adventconspiracy.org/>) is a website with great resources and ideas that pursue 4 goals: “Worship Fully, Spend Less, Give More, Love All”.
3. Make an advent wreath for your home. Use our Sunday worship as a guide for lighting the candles, or google your own.
4. Have a “Reverse Advent” calendar. The basic idea is that instead of “getting” something every day, you “give” something. Find out more at <https://www.goodtoknow.co.uk/family/reverse-advent-calendar-94087>
5. Make a Jesse Tree. This is a cool thing that I never knew about until a few years ago. This will take some planning, as you’ll need the tree and ornaments. One “easier” option (and popular with younger children) is to use felt. There are many resources for this, but here is one: <http://www.crivoice.org/jesse.html>

Keep in mind that the purpose behind these “activities” is not to be more active, but to be more intentional about advent, so that we can appreciate Christmas all the more!

Also, happy New Year (since this is a dual-edition)! This greeting actually serves two purposes as Advent ushers in the church new year, and January 1<sup>st</sup> ushers in 2019. Either way, CTK is looking forward to God working in wonderful ways. That will only happen if we allow Him to work in wonderful ways in us and through us. So, now is a good time to re-look at your Rule of Life (you can find my “D Word” article on that in the April 2018 Monarch (which you can find at our website <http://ctksd.org/news/newsletter> ).
