Minutes October 17, 2023

The Worship Committee met on Tuesday, October 17, 2023, at 5:30 p.m. in the Wesley Center Library.

Those present were: Shirley Textor, Sue Meeks, Dana Rembold, Chris Marshall, Alison Greiner, and Anthony DeVaughn. Jean Potratz and Linda Soukup were unable to attend. Minutes from the September 19, 2023 meeting were approved as presented.

Pastor Anthony opened the meeting with prayer.

Committee Reports:

Technology: Anthony said the audio-visual system upgrade as discussed at the last meeting is in a holding pattern, as we wait for DB Acoustics' availability. As noted last month, this is going to be a two-pronged process. New projectors, motorized screens and a new mixing board will be added, according to the system design by DB Acoustics. On the audio side, they want to replace everything, because the speakers and some of the microphones have been in the sanctuary since 1980. We still need to get to the point where we have somebody to run the system. The system will be put together in stages, which will also include accommodations for the hearing impaired. Alison noted that the Youth Group TV was buffering a lot during Sunday School this past Sunday, and wondered whether the wi-fi or the TV was the issue.

Gratitude: Shirley said the care notes group continues to meet the last Thursday of each month at 1:00 p.m., and they continue to ask for volunteers.

Ushers/Greeters/Hospitality/Welcome: Shirley noted we have badges now for ushers and greeters. Anthony said we haven't done any hospitality training yet, which continues to be a work in progress. Passing the plate was completed a couple of times, but now offering plate locations are noted in the bulletin so that guests have an opportunity to give. In addition to automatic bank debits, options for online giving by phone, tablet or computer are being discussed.

Altar/Decorations: Thank you to Roger & Lisa Crawford for the beautiful indoor and outdoor church decor!

THE RECIPE CORNER

Recipes taken from the: "Heavenly Fare for Saints & Sinners" Cookbook

Cheezy Lasagna Soup

From the kitchen of Tammy Negrete

1 lb. ground beef

2 lg. green peppers-chopped

2 cloves garlic-finely chopped

6 c. water

2 c. uncooked Mafalda (mini lasagna) pasta

1/4 tsp. pepper

1-1/2 c. (6-oz) shredded mozzarella cheese

1 med. onion, sliced

1 (6-oz) can tomato paste

1 T. packed brown sugar

1-1/2 tsp. Italian seasoning-crumbled

2 (14-1/2) cans diced tomatoes in olive oil, garlic & spices-drained

1 can Italian tomato soup

1-1/2 c. Italian-style croutons

Cook beef, onion, green pepper, and garlic over medium heat, stirring occasionally until beef is browned and onion is tender. Drain. Stir in water, diced tomatoes, and tomato paste until blended. Stir in brown sugar, Italian seasoning, tomato soup, pepper and pasta. Heat to boiling, reduce heat, cover and simmer 10 minutes until pasta is tender. Top with croutons and cheese when serving.

Cheddar-Garlic Biscuits

From the kitchen of Joyce Peiffer-Smith

2 c. Bisquick original baking mix

1/2 c. shredded cheddar cheese

1/8 tsp. garlic powder

2/3 c. milk

2 T. melted butter or margarine

Heat oven to 450°. Stir baking mix, milk and cheese until a soft dough forms. Drop by 9 spoonfuls onto ungreased baking sheet. Bake 8 to 10 minutes or until golden brown. Stir together margarine and garlic powder. Brush over warm biscuits. Makes 9 biscuits.
