

Hosting this inspiring study is Pastor Alyssa Nantt

Starting November 30, Washington UMC will host a book study and sermon series led by Pastor Alyssa based on "*The Heart That Grew Three Sizes*" by United Methodist Pastor Matt Rawle. During each Sunday of Advent, we will gather to study one chapter of this book and then enjoy a light dinner and fellowship together.

We will begin the study at 5PM and have a light dinner at 6:00 p.m. on the following Sundays: November 30, and December 7, 14, and 21. A sign up sheet will be available to sign up to bring a crockpot or casserole dish for dinner.

Here is a description of the book that we will be using:


"We don't know why the Grinch hated Christmas. We just know he did. In this new Advent study, Matt Rawle explores the faith themes in the Christmas classic, How the Grinch Stole Christmas! including, how did the Grinch's heart grow three sizes come Christmas morning? How did Christmas save the Grinch? Could it be that the very thing we think we hate is the one thing that changes our lives? This Advent and Christmas season, look at a familiar classic through the lens of faith and see how Christ speaks to us through our culture."

The cost is \$14 and we will need your cash, check, or money order to the Washington UMC office no later than Friday, November 14.




What is Pastor Alyssa reading?




The Early Church: The Story of Emergent Christianity, Revised Edition by Henry Chadwick.

This book explores Christianity's roots from a historical perspective. It's interesting to read what other people who were not Christians thought about the spread of this new faith. It's on the scholarly side, but still an interesting read for Christian history nerds like me.



Take This Bread: A Radical Conversion by Sara Miles

Sara Miles, a self-described lesbian atheist, wandered into a church one day and took Holy Communion. She was transformed by this and embraced the Christian faith that she scorned. She then centered her faith on feeding others as she was fed by Holy Communion and established multiple food pantries in poor communities. I haven't started this yet, but it inspires me to consider how we can respond to be more Christ-like through Holy Communion and to be open to the Holy Spirit's work in our lives.




Celebrate Recovery

Minutes from the September 2025 meeting were approved.

Committee Reports:

Technology: Linda noted that things are going okay technologically. The group discussed replacing mikes for the singers at some time in the future, as they are often staticky online.

Gratitude: Shirley reported that in September, the committee completed care notes to visitors. For October 30 at 1:00 p.m. in the library, they will be sending cards to the homebound.

Youth and Adult/Education: Alison reported that Sunday School progress with helpers is going well, though attendance is not always predictable. Our next meeting will be on Tuesday, November 18, 2025, at 5:15 p.m., at the Church library.



Finance Committee

Finance Meeting October 13, 2025

Present: Chairman Rick Meeks, Tom Patterson, Bob Helscher, Karen Norman, Chris Marshall and Jennine Wolf.

Rick opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes from the last meeting were reviewed. Tom made a motion to approve the minutes, Karen seconded; Motion passed.

Chris presented month to date and year to date for the General Fund. The big expenditure for September was roof repairs, totaling \$3,850.00. She explained about a gift of \$12,800.00 the church received in September. This resulted in the month of September being \$3,900.00 in the positive thanks to the \$12,800 gift. Chris showed where the church has a year-to-date loss of \$48,000.00.

Chris gave the consolidated report. The end of September has the consolidated fund at \$37,452.00. She explained Richard Gilmore was buying a new refrigerator for the Church kitchen with funds from the kitchen appliance account. She further explained the funds from the undesignated memorials and bank interest was moved to the general fund each quarter. A new account in consolidated is Bridges out of Poverty, that is headed by Kim Charlier. She said it is just a holding account like Celebrate Recovery.

Bob Helscher handed out information for the Endowment fund. He suggested we offer a scholarship to youth in the Church who are active members getting ready to go to college. Everyone thought this was a good idea. Bob will put together a proposal and bring it to the next finance meeting.


Chris presented another gift the church received of \$50,000. It was discussed what the money was to be used for. It was decided to contact the person who gave the gift to ask where the funds should go. It will go into the consolidated account until then.

There has been no update on the daycare since the last meeting on September 24. There is a nomination committee meeting for October 22.

Chris has received the budgets from the trustees, missions and worship and should receive SPRC next week.

Chris presented the financial statement for the Townhall meeting for October 19. Tom made the motion to accept the report-Karen seconded-motion passed.

Tom made a motion to close the meeting-Bob seconded-motion passed.





Turkey Casserole

From the kitchen of Betty Stephens

2 c. Turkey, diced (or chicken)

1 c. celery

1 can cream of chicken soup

4-oz. can sliced mushrooms, drained

Potato chips

1/4 c. mayonnaise

2-1/2 T. chopped onion

3 hard cooked eggs

1/2 c. slivered almonds

Mix ingredients together. Crumble potato chips in bottom of casserole and on the top. Bake at 350° for 35 to 40 minutes. Freezes well.





Easy Cranberry-Orange Salad

1 (3-oz) pkg. orange Jello

1 (8-oz) can whole cranberry sauce

1/2 c. chopped celery

1/2 c. boiling water

1 (8-oz) can crushed pineapple




