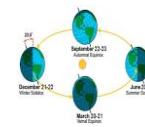

June 2026 Pastor's Corner

In Genesis 12:2, we read the following words from God speaking to Abram: “I will make of you a great nation and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing.”

Before God spoke these words to Abraham, we see the people build a large city and tower to make a name for themselves (Genesis 11:4). God responds by scattering the people and they begin to speak different languages. This causes misunderstanding and confusion among the people. Ten generations pass, and it seems like God is silent. Then, God speaks to Abram.

Abram later becomes Abraham. Out of the blue to a nobody, God makes a covenant with Abram to make him a great nation. As with all covenants, there is an agreement that the two parties need to do something to keep the covenant. God tells Abram that God will make a great nation out of Abram, bless him, and make his name great. However, Abram needs to do his part of the covenant, which is to be a blessing.

Maybe we can extend this to the United States, which is getting ready to celebrate its 250th birthday. The United States is a young nation when considering our global neighbors. **I think that we are asked to follow the covenant God made with Abram, to be a great nation with the blessing of God, and with the expectation that in response, we are to be a blessing to other people.**

Maybe we can spend some time reflecting on how we are doing in keeping up with our part of the covenant. How is the United States using the blessings that God has given to our nation to be a blessing to others? How have we as individuals and as a Church been a blessing to others?

During the summer months, we will be looking at the Old Testament lectionary readings from Genesis during worship. We will be starting with Abram in Genesis chapter 12 who later becomes Abraham and we will end with Joseph. We will look at the relationships the people had with God, with their family members, and with other people around them. Like all families, sometimes they live at peace within a covenant with each other, and sometimes the covenant is broken into a million pieces.

Even when family members are abandoned, God does not abandon the people. Family life back then was difficult, just as it is today. The good news is that God helps us pick up the pieces of the covenant to restore us and to encourage us to try again. We see glimpses of grace and forgiveness over and over again in the Genesis texts. The covenant is restored so that we can be blessed and that we can be a blessing to those around us.

What can we do to be a blessing to others in our Church and in our community?

The BUMP Mission is located on the Blackfeet Indian Reservation in north central Montana. It consists of two churches, Browning UMC and Babb UMC. Both churches are led by Pastor Gail Hoyt, a member of the Blackfeet Tribe.

Substance abuse is a part of everyday life on the Blackfeet Reservation. Pastor Gail has started three sobriety programs and they are growing in number. These groups gather together to talk about the challenges of living in sobriety and they discuss strategies to help them live sober lives. The groups also spend time in fellowship, watching Christian movies and programs on a DVD player. They also create Native American arts and crafts to sell.

Pastor Gail and Pastor Alyssa have worked together in ministry when Pastor Alyssa lived in Montana. Pastor Gail is asking if there are Christian DVDs that our Church would be willing to donate for the sober living program participants to watch during their meetings.

Pastor Alyssa spoke with the missions committee and they agreed to buy two DVD sets for the BUMP Mission: The Chosen and Women of the Bible. If you wish to donate any DVDs for the BUMP Mission sobriety programs, please bring them to the Church office by June 30. Pastor Alyssa will take the collection of DVDs to the BUMP Mission when she goes on vacation in July.

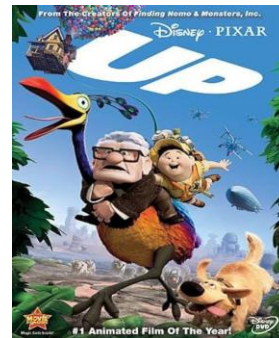

Present:

Main Topics Discussed

Reviewing the building layout and possible renovations needed for daycare licensing and fire safety.

Concerns about meeting fire marshal codes and daycare regulations.

Requirements for nursery rooms to have direct exterior exits.

Potential structural changes including:

- Adding walls and exterior doors

- Modifying stair access

- Reworking heating systems

- Installing ventilation and plumbing updates

- Adding safety doors with push bars and alarms

Room-by-Room Planning

The group walked through the building and discussed possible uses for rooms:

Northwest room: planned for 1–2 year olds because it has a sink.

Nursery/tot rooms: possible sleeping and activity areas separated by a portable wall, but lacking nearby bathrooms.

Resource room: considered for 2-year-olds but too small to meet required square footage.

Second-floor double room: ideal for 2½–3 year olds because of a Jack-and-Jill bathroom.

Laundry/kitchen area: would require major upgrades including ventilation, appliances, plumbing, and drainage.

Additional classrooms and office/break room possibilities were considered throughout the walkthrough.

Operational Concerns

Questions about:

- Parent drop-off and parking

- Playground access

- Blocking off the alley behind the building

- Emergency evacuation access for both daycare and Church users

Next Steps

The group decided to:

Meet with the fire marshal for a walkthrough and feasibility review.

Continue brainstorming room layouts.

Locate drainage lines for kitchen planning.

Contact the Iowa Conference trustee because the Methodist conference owns the building and may need to approve changes.

**TRUSTEES MEETING
MAY 14, 2026**

Attendees: Bruce Timmins, Pastor Alyssa, Richard Gilmore, Toni Adrian, and Julie Timmins.

The meeting opened at 6:05 PM and closed with prayer at 6:32 PM.

Key Discussion Items:

1. Employment Inquiry

A woman who visits the resource center asked about performing odd jobs.

After reviewing her documentation, Pastor Alyssa determined she did not provide documents establishing eligibility to work in the U.S.

Additional follow-up was planned to determine whether she has other qualifying documentation.

2. Driveway Project

A second estimate was received, but additional omitted items could increase the overall cost.

The project does not require connection to the storm sewer, but runoff cannot flood the street.

Trustees discussed redesigning the area, including removing grass, adding a sidewalk, and adjusting parking to better accommodate a potential daycare operation.

3. HVAC Controls

No recent progress had been made with the HVAC controls contractor.

Bruce agreed to follow up regarding both air conditioning and heating systems.

4. Digital Worship Sign

Bruce is obtaining quotes for a digital outdoor sign.

Benefits discussed included easier updates and displaying meeting information.

Concerns included cost, brightness, and potential city regulations.

5. Chimney Cap Repair

Repair will require access equipment such as a 60-foot lift or telehandler.

Bruce will investigate rental options and report back.

Repairs and Maintenance Updates:

Kitchen tables: Stainless steel tables installed; old butcher-block tables sold for \$350.

Finance office flooring: Materials are on-site; installation expected within a few weeks.

Window coverings: Delivered and planned for installation alongside the flooring.

Boilers: Boilers have been shut down for the season; one return tank shows significant corrosion and replacement estimates will be obtained.

Elevator lights: Planned conversion to direct-wired LED lighting.

Water softener: Service appointment will be arranged with the vendor.

Daycare Project Discussion

No new information had been received from the daycare group.

A building walkthrough had not yet occurred.

The daycare planners are reportedly reconsidering room locations, which may delay progress. Trustees noted the challenges of adapting an older building to current daycare requirements.

Main Action Items

Verify employment eligibility documentation for the resource center applicant.

Continue planning and estimating the driveway/parking project.

Follow up on HVAC controls and air-conditioning issues.

Obtain digital sign quotes and investigate any local regulations.

Determine a repair plan for the chimney cap.

Complete flooring, window coverings, elevator lighting, and water softener service.

Obtain a replacement estimate for the corroded boiler return tank.

Monitor progress of the daycare proposal and building walkthrough.

Kitchen/South air conditioner: Diagnostic work scheduled to determine whether repairs or replacement are needed.

Upstairs Jack-and-Jill toilet: Continued issues caused another \$300 water bill; temporary adjustments were made, but monitoring is needed.

Sanctuary lighting: Minor repairs remain; discussion included the aging high-ceiling lights and whether they can be lowered for maintenance.

Twelve members of the United Women in Faith met May 8th at the Church. There was a potluck lunch with each member bringing a favorite dish their mother used to make. Vic said grace before the lunch, which was delicious and plentiful! Marilyn, Barb and Connie were hostesses. Alberta read the devotions from Proverbs 31:25-51. Connie gave the treasurer's report saying she had not received the May statement as of meeting time. The balance for last month was \$1860.17. Connie gave out brochures from Choices explaining their mission. It was decided to give \$100.00 to Choices.

Charlotte received a cupcake for her May birthday. Thank You's were read from the Lutheran women for the leftover quilt supplies and materials we gave them. Marilyn will let us know about the June meeting.

The Washington UMC Worship Committee met at the Wesley Center Library on Tuesday, May 19, 2026, at 5:15p.m.

Linda opened the meeting with a devotional called 'Growing God's Garden', followed by prayer. Those present were: Linda Soukup, Chris Marshall, Pastor Alyssa Nantt and Shirley Textor. Alison Greiner, Sue Meeks, Dana Rembold and Jean Potratz were unable to attend. Minutes from the April 21, 2026 meeting were approved.

Committee Reports:

Technology: New microphones for the praise team and Pastor Alyssa are much clearer. Both choir/pastor and congregation appreciate them. Pastor Alyssa reported that a new HP laptop has been purchased for the worship service and has been mostly set up by Carolyn Skubal at Impressions Computers. She still needs to discuss any setup requirements with DB Acoustics and is waiting on their response. Linda asked if any congregation members would be interested in learning about computer operation for worship services. Pastor Alyssa said that she had some people to suggest, and that learning should be very easy since PowerPoint is the main program that we will use.

Gratitude: Shirley reported that notes were sent to Church visitors in April. In May the committee will complete care notes to homebound members at 1:00 p.m. on Thursday, May 28th.

Youth and Adult/Education: We have two people who will be transferring memberships from other Methodist Churches this Sunday to our Church, including Bruce Timmins from the West Burlington Methodist Church and Mardee Wood from St. Mark's in Iowa City. A baptism for Janet Graber will be scheduled within the next few weeks as well. Confirmation classes will also be added in the fall if there is interest. Alyssa has a 6-week curriculum that she likes for small rural churches that is flexible.

Ushers/Greeters/Hospitality: Linda gave a rotation update for the Acolytes. Sunday hospitality service at the back of the Church as created by Marilyn Whitenack was discussed. The group expressed appreciation for Marilyn's work with her large assortment of food and drinks, as it draws people together. Beginning in June, Shirley will be completing the Holy Spirit study of Adam Hamilton's study book called, 'Revival'. Pastor Alyssa's bible study is underway with the book of Judges on Thursdays at 5pm in Fellowship Hall. Vacation Bible School planning was discussed. Pastor Alyssa and Alison have talked about a backpack project this year, which can be opened to the congregation once we have more information. This would potentially be in coordination with the UP Church. We will know more next month.

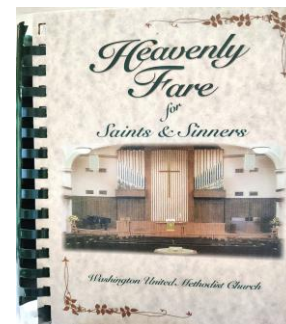

Ranch House Steak

From the kitchen of Bev Griggs

½ c. flour	2lbs. Round steak, cut into serving pieces
2 tsp. dry mustard	½ c. water
1/8 tsp. pepper	1 T. Worcestershire sauce
Salt to taste	

Roll meat in combined flour, dry mustard, pepper and salt. Place in a baking dish and drizzle water and Worcestershire sauce. Cover with foil and bake 1 hour at 350°. Very moist.



Kumula (Potato Dumplings)

From the kitchen of Linda Boston

5 c. raw potatoes	¼ c. whole wheat flour
1-1/2 tsp. baking powder	1-3/4 c. white flour
2 sticks oleo/margarine	<i>(oatmeal can be substituted</i>
2 tsp. salt	<i>for some flour if desired)</i>
Ham or beef broth	

Grind potatoes and drain. Add remaining ingredients. Form into dumpling-size ball and drop into ham or beef broth. (I use ham broth.) Cook uncovered 10 minutes. Makes about 25. Butter is good on them.
