## YOU NEED TO CHANGE THE BATTERY IN YOUR SMOKE DETECTOR!

"Change your clock, change your battery" is an easy way to remember.

This simple chore could and will save your life in the event of a fire.

Fires in the US have decreased from 2.27 million in 1986 to 1.35 million in 2021. There are still over 480,000 structure fires annually.

Every 23 seconds, a fire department in the United States responds to a fire somewhere in the nation.

Research shows that 30 years ago, you had about 17 minutes to escape a house fire. Today it's down to three or four minutes. The reason: newer homes and the furniture inside them actually burn faster.

Please take a few minutes and replace the battery in your detector.

Better yet, replace your old smoke detector with a new one with a 10-year battery and don't worry about it next year!




All are invited to join us following worship on November 26th to help with the Hanging of the Greens. Lunch will be provided afterwards for those who stay.
