Hello Saints!

Fa la la la la la la la! Let the Holiday Season begin! Hard to believe, isn't it? Tis the season to be jolly. The Holiday decorations are going up in the stores...we've

started our Christmas shopping...cantatas are being practiced...parties are being planned...yep. Tis the season all right. And we're asking ourselves – how did we arrive in November already? Wasn't school just starting like –yesterday? Where did 2025 go? An even better question might be – have I done my best for the Lord this year?

Have I lived this year with love and forgiveness or with hatred and bitterness?

One of the first sermons I preached here at Mt. Tabor UMC was on forgiveness. I asked the question: When we say the words of the Lord's Prayer, do we really mean it when we say, "and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us?" The word trespass in this passage means simply - sin. Do we really want the Lord of the universe to forgive our sins the same way we forgive the sins of others? As my husband Scott would say, that's a fair question. In Ephesians 4:32, it is stated that we should be ...forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you.

According to Dr. David Jeremiah, "We can't survive life's traumas if we don't learn to forgive others. When we forgive someone, we are not excusing or condoning their actions. We are choosing to release the bitterness that can poison our own personalities. We are letting a ray of compassion break through the clouds so we can forgive as God has forgiven us."

In these strange days where hatred and bitterness are escalating, let us continue to learn how to forgive. Remember this prayer from Saint Francis of Assisi:

Lord, make me an instrument of thy peace!

Where there is hatred let me sow love.

Where there is injury, pardon;

Where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope;

Where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy.

O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled, as to console;

To be understood as to understand,

To be loved as to love.

It is in giving that we receive, It is in pardoning that we are pardoned,

And it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. AMEN

I recently received a newsletter from the Akron Canton regional foodbank which is the source of our food supplies.

It reads in part:

"Due to ongoing inflation and economic challenges for our neighbors, the need for help with groceries is higher now than it was during the pandemic."

"Significant cuts to government programs have reduced our ability to sustain food distribution at the same level provided to our region in 2024."

"Cuts to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Medicaid will likely increase demand at a time when food supplies to the Foodbank are reduced."

In our case, the recent closure of the Minerva food program will also likely increase the pressure on our Mt. Tabor's Table program as Minerva's clients look for other sources of food support.

Please be assured that any contributions you can make to Mt. Tabor's Table will be put to good use for our neighbors. Donations can be made in the offering plate, online, or by mail. Please note in your memo line "Mt. Tabor's Table".

Updates from your Trustee

By now we are hoping the new boiler is up, running, and keeping you warm! Thanks to all of your generous donations we were able to procure, install and pay for this project from the capital campaign funds we collected. The cost was \$37,300 for this project.

We also were able to replace the failed air conditioner in the sanctuary at a cost of a little over \$5,000. This was also not anticipated. As you all are aware, the major purpose of the drive was to create a capital fund to complete various needs for the church properties. As of the end of September you had donated over \$52,000!

One of the major goals was to put a new surface on the parking. In order to do that job properly we needed to replace the damaged sidewalk at the east end of our lot. That cost was \$4,200. As you can see with unexpected costs of the a/c unit and the boiler, we were required to spend over \$42,000 of unanticipated funds. This \$42,000 plus the \$4,200 put our outflow at over \$46,000, using up the bulk of our funds collected. For this reason, the parking lot repair has been postponed until spring.

As always the needs for repairs and improvements will be addressed as a necessary need we all face, whether at home or church. Your continued support is much needed and extremely appreciated. By the time you are reading this, Council will have met and taken whatever steps we can to complete the parking lot project in a timely manner, as it is still a priority.


