Living Boldly

We have been going through 1 Peter in our worship services. People who have decided to follow Jesus were living in a society who were against Christians. They persecuted Christians. The people would falsely accuse the Christians of doing things that was against the law. They were suffering due to these accusations, mainly because of their faith. These people were being persecuted because they were living boldly for Jesus. Those who were living compromised lives, were not persecuted because they were not a threat. If the same thing started happening today, are you living a life that would be a threat, or would they look at you and say, no big deal, they are not living bold enough to do anything.

I find most people just want to live their lives without causing any waves in our society. But, we are suppose to live for Christ, boldly proclaiming what he has done for us. The scriptures say, Joseph of Arimathea went BOLDLY to Pilate to ask for Jesus' body. He could have received some negative life pressure, because he was helping Jesus (Mark 15:43). The believers in Acts 4 were praying for the ability to proclaim Jesus boldly (Acts 4:30-31).

So Saul stayed with them and moved about freely in Jerusalem, speaking boldly in the name of the Lord. He talked and debated with the Grecian Jews, but they tried to kill him. When the brothers learned of this, they took him down to Caesarea and sent him off to Tarsus. Then the church throughout Judea, Galilee and Samaria enjoyed a time of peace. It was strengthened; and encouraged by the Holy Spirit, it grew in numbers, living in the fear of the Lord.

Lastly...Saul, after coming to know who Jesus was, went about Jerusalem and spoke boldly about Jesus (Acts 9:28). Remember, he had been persecuting the Christians. The people who supported him, before his conversion, were still in Jerusalem and they were still against anyone who claimed to be a follower of Jesus. It was risky for Paul to do these things.

Has the Holy Spirit challenged you in your life to stand up for what you believe in? Have you been doing that, or would you get passed over because you are not a threat?

Tidbits From Our Youth Guy



Just an FYI. I did not write this. This is an excerpt from an email I received from Stew, Founding Director of Verge Network. None the less, I thought it would be good to share with all my family at GVCC.

"God's hope for the world is the local church". The local church is His Plan A, and there is no Plan B. God's agents of implementation are the people of the local church. New believers, volunteers, lay leaders, church staff members, and pastors are all called to fulfill the Great Commission. Christians are not just to be disciples, but are tasked to make disciples. We must never forget that God didn't just save us from something. He saved us for something.

Paul lays the groundwork for church leaders in Ephesians 4:11-13, "And He personally gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, for the training of the saints in the work of ministry, to build up the body of Christ, until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of God's Son, growing into a mature man with a stature measured by Christ's fullness."

These verses remind church leaders that our work is the development of God's people under our care. Nothing is more sacred or more strategic in His kingdom than this responsibility to equip others to serve in ministry. God did not intend for His church to be a community with a gifted pastor and staff members, but to be a community of gifted people. An inextricable connection exists between discipleship and leadership development.

Discipleship and development are two sides of the same coin. One side is character and the other side is competency. The Great Commission calls us to develop, not just do. We must make disciples, not just be disciples. We must build an army, not just an audience." -Stew

My question to you who are reading this is: Where are you? Are you just in the audience? Do you consider yourself a disciple or are you a disciple maker? You know, if you are a disciple maker...Awesome! You get the mission. If you would consider yourself in one of the other groups, my questions to you would be: What's holding you back? What are you waiting for or what are you afraid of? Don't you want to be a part of something more than yourself? Do you want to leave a legacy? The only one in the way of that, is you. In today's world we have so many resources at our finger tips. There really should not be any reasons why we are not making disciples...really they are not reasons. Text and On-line





We just want to remind you that we have text and on-line giving. Several people have been using it and find it to be very easy and convenient in helping them give their weekly tithes and offerings, without writing a check or remembering to bring cash.

**On-line/text giving takes about 2 minutes to set up for the first time and only a few seconds, each time after that. You can use a debit/credit card or bank account. Text the \$ amount that you want to give (example: \$10) to 719-345-1320 and it goes to the general account, immediately. You can also set it up to have re-occurring giving taken out at different times during the month. If you want to designate your donation to a certain account, you will put the dollar amount in and type the name of the designated area: (example: \$50 building). If the fund name does not match, you will receive a message with the list of fund names to choose from. This can also be done from the online giving tab in our website www.grandviewcc.com.

If you have questions, there are text giving guides on the back table in the sanctuary and at the "Welcome Center" or talk to Allison.
