### **Telling the Story**

It's hard to believe that it's been a year since I began at CTK. In that time, we've had the opportunity to be together Listening, Loving & Learning as our core values suggest. In fact, some of you may remember that a year ago I promised to be intentional in listening to you and your stories, thoughtful in learning about our gracious God with you, and deliberate in loving the people of God both at Christ the King and beyond. To the best of my abilities I've tried to carry out these tasks and have had a great time in the process.

But none of these are tasks that I can do alone. But like the continued task of Listening, Loving, & Learning together as a congregation, this broader task is one that no one can tackle alone. These words have the opportunity to ring true for us in new ways on September 13, 2015, as the ELCA will celebrate "God's work. Our hands." Sunday. Joining other Lutheran congregations across the country we will remember that service for us is not relegated to our spare time, but at the very heart of what it means to live in Christ. Together we will be going out into our communities, cleaning up neighborhoods, collecting supplies, serving those who long for hope when the world has all but forgotten them.

You may have already read about this opportunity in our newsletter, and hopefully you've "saved the date" on your calendar. Now the time has come for us to begin our work together in preparation! Members of Christ the King will have the opportunity to work with The Place of Forsyth County, our local social service agency, in their endeavors to eliminate poverty in the county in one of three ways:

- 1. Be part of a group working at The Place between 10 AM -1 PM to help with volunteer projects including light/moderate physical activity such as upkeep, beautification of grounds and restocking/organizing shelves.
- 2. Be part of a group assisting with preparations for the Open Bowl fundraiser to be held later in the week at Christ the King, celebrating The Place's 40th anniversary this year.
- 3. Be part of a group that stays at CTK and learns more about poverty in our county while participating in hands on work to support the work of the Place. This work will be particularly suited for those children and older adults who have a more difficult time traveling off site.

If you plan to participate onsite or hope to participate but are as yet unable to commit, there will be time to sign up or jump into help along the way. However, if you plan to join one of the groups going off site to work or are willing to step forward to help lead one of the projects at Christ the King, we need to hear from you now in order to make necessary arrangements.

As such, we are asking that you <u>respond</u> by Wednesday, August 5, indicating the names and ages of all the people in your work party, your email address, which project you would like to work with, and what t-shirt size(s) you wear. You will receive more information as the date approaches.

On this day and beyond, we have the opportunity to be a church that rolls up our sleeves and gets to work! I sincerely hope that you will consider sharing a couple of hours of your time as we join together and express our gratitude for God's grace in Christ Jesus right here in Cumming!
