HYGIENE PRODUCTS & SERVICES	Workers in laundromats, laundry services, and dry cleaners

DEFENSE INDUSTRIAL BASE	Workers who support the essential services required to meet national security commitments to the federal government and U.S. Military, including but not limited to the Department of Defense, the Intelligence Community, and NASA. These individuals include but are not limited to, personnel supporting aerospace, space, and other defense and intelligence activities, including: engineers (various disciplines), manufacturing/production workers; IT support; security staff; security personnel; intelligence support, aircraft and weapon system mechanics and maintainers; suppliers of medical supplies and pharmaceuticals, and critical transportation
