

Jennifer Beasley is Vice President of Television Development at Buffalo Gal Pictures and President of the newly launched Fiasco Global Media. A WGC-nominated writer turned Executive Producer, she brings over two decades of experience across Canadian television and film, spanning scripted comedy and drama as well as feature development and production.

Jennifer began her career in the camera department before transitioning into scripted television in 2008. A graduate of the Canadian Film Centre's Prime Time Television Program, she launched her writing career on the award-winning comedy *LESS THAN KIND*, where her co-written Season 2 finale earned a WGC Comedy Writing Award nomination. She went on to write and story edit for critically acclaimed series including *CRA\$H & BURN* (Showcase) and *MEN WITH BROOMS* (CBC).

At Buffalo Gal Pictures, Jennifer has played a key role across development and production, earning Supervising Producer and Production Executive credits on features such as *A VERY SORDID WEDDING* (2017), *LOOK AWAY* (2018), *SIBERIA* (2018), and *JT LEROY* (2018). Her recent television credits include Executive Producer and Producer on the four-season Indigenous-led comedy *ACTING GOOD* (CTV Comedy/APTN), one of CTV's most-watched comedies, and Executive Producer on the procedural *THE SPENCER SISTERS* (CTV/The CW), a co-production with Lionsgate Canada.

Her most recent feature credit is Executive Producer on *RUMOURS* (2025), a political satire directed by Guy Maddin and co-directed by Evan Johnson and Galen Johnson, starring Cate Blanchett and Roy Dupuis.

In early 2025, Jennifer launched Fiasco Global Media, an independent television development company focused on character-driven series built around authentic voices, distinctive perspectives, and richly drawn ensembles. The company develops stories grounded in lived experience, with an emphasis on bold, emotionally resonant characters that travel across markets while remaining rooted in place. She previously served on multiple On Screen Manitoba committees and was Co-Chair of the Board of Directors from 2020–2023.

Tanya Brunel, Red River Métis from Manitoba, has been developing and producing motion picture, television and digital media content with a focus on Indigenous narratives since 2001.

Her recent projects include the multiple award-winning films JULIANA & THE MEDICINE FISH, THE CORRUPTION OF DIVINE PROVIDENCE, feature documentaries THE COVER UP and COMING HOME, and the six part limited drama series LITTLE BIRD. LITTLE BIRD, distributed internationally by Fremantle, premiered at Series Mania in France, where it won the Audience Choice Award. It was also nominated for 19 Canadian Screen Awards, winning 13, including Best Drama Series. Her latest project, MANY WOUNDS, a feature film based on the New Zealand film Once Were Warriors, starring Sera-Lys McArthur, Alex Meraz, and Kiowa Gordon, is scheduled for release in 2025.

Tanya is an alumni of the Transatlantic Partners, Producers Without Borders, the Banff Diversity of Voices Initiative, and the Banff Spark Accelerator for Women in the Business of Media. She most recently served as Program Manager for the National Screen Institute's 2022 Indigenous Storyteller Edition, and is currently a mentor for Cultural Industries Ontario's Cinema Ascent program and the Empowering BIPOC program at PictureNL.

Tanya is a board member of the Reelworld Screen Institute and the Canadian Media Producers Association (CMPA) serving as the Vice-Chair of Industrial Relations and the Indigenous Producers Working Group.

Tanya was twice nominated for the CMPA Established Producer Indiescreen Award in 2020 and 2023 for her work as a Producer.

Vanessa Caceres was born in Colombia, where she studied Industrial Engineering before moving to Canada in 2003 and setting her sights on film production. In 2005, her first production, the short film CARJACKING, was selected for the Montreal World Film Festival. In 2009, she was a line producer on TRANSIT, which was released theatrically in Canada by eOne Films. Her first feature as a producer, GENERATION WOLF, had an extensive festival run, winning Best Latin Film at the Borrego Springs Film Festival, and was acquired by Samuel Goldwyn Films in 2016. Her second feature, THE OFFICE GAMES, was later acquired by Quiver Distribution.

Vanessa's commitment to her craft led her to several industry programs, including the Sundance Collab Producing Program (2020), the Reelworld Producer Program (2021–2022), and the SODEC Lab at Hot Docs (2023). Representing Reelworld, she appeared at Content Canada (2022) and Prime Time Ottawa (2023), and in 2024 she completed the Training Lab organized by Amazon MGM Studios.

Her most recent dramatic feature, INVISIBLE AMERICA, which she both wrote and produced, shines a light on the plight of migrant workers in North America and is currently on the festival circuit. Vanessa also ventured into documentary film with MY FRIEND OMAR, supported by the CMF, Radio-Canada, and CBC. The film, which follows the battle of a seasonal worker fighting for status in Canada, premiered on television and major platforms in May and June 2024.

She is passionate about socially engaged, character-driven stories with international reach.

Uga Carlini is a multi-award-winning producer, screenwriter, director, and the founder of Towerkop Creations—a production company devoted to heroine-centered, emotionally charged storytelling. Since 2010, Carlini has carved out a distinct creative identity across fiction, documentary, hybrid forms, music videos, and commercial content, crafting work defined by emotional precision, mythic resonance, and a deeply human lens.

Her producing slate includes the internationally acclaimed ALISON, the Netflix hit ANGELIENA, and the hybrid feature BEYOND THE LIGHT BARRIER for Amazon Prime. Alongside her feature work, she has created high-impact music videos for Sony—reaching millions of viewers—and produced content across reality, branded storytelling, and short-form formats. Recognised as a 2025 Chicken & Egg Award Nominee, GEMS 2025 Emerging TV Producers Program participant, and 2023 Academy Gold Fellowship Nominee, Carlini continues to expand her creative footprint with female driven heroine storytelling.

Through Towerkop Creations, she champions minority voices and stories often excluded from traditional market pathways, developing content with clear export potential and multi-territory growth. Her work sits at the intersection of resilience, identity, and reinvention, drawing from lived experience and a global creative lineage.

Carlini's Canadian development slate currently includes the midlife immigrant comedy TV series THE MAN MANUAL and two prestige features shaped by her signature blend of emotional depth and global appeal. Guided by her belief that “we make films that remember who we are, reveal who we can become, and deliver globally resonant stories for today's audiences,” Carlini brings a uniquely personal, courageous, and creatively generous vision to the evolving landscape of Canadian cinema that can travel globally.



With a diverse range of credits in a variety of roles, Laurie is known for her strong narrative instincts and strategic oversight – bringing deep experience and a steady hand to every phase of production.

Laurie also played key roles on critically acclaimed documentaries such as THE WILD HORSE REDEMPTION (CBC/TIFF selection), and THE SUICIDE TOURIST (CTV/Gemini winner). Beyond her professional work, she has dedicated more than 25 years to producing, writing, and co-directing films for Hope International Development Agency, helping raise millions of dollars for communities in need around the world.

Flordeliza Dayrit is the Co-Founder and Chief Creative Officer at Milo Productions Inc., an international media company dedicated to producing culturally rich, globally engaging entertainment for young audiences. A visionary Filipino-Canadian storyteller, she is committed to telling meaningful stories that highlight under-represented cultures, and diverse histories, for kids and families.

Flordeliza is recognized as a Netflix Diversity of Voices Fellow, a Banff Sparks Recipient for Women in Media, and has been named one of the world's Most Influential Muslims by The Muslim 500. Her creative work blends cultural depth with adventure-driven storytelling, inspiring young audiences to see themselves in global narratives.

She is the co-writer and director of *Time Hoppers: The Silk Road*, the first installment in Milo Productions' adventure franchise. The film was released across MENA and Africa in more than 300 theatres in October 2025, marking a significant milestone for diverse children's content in mainstream cinema. It is set to expand its reach internationally with a first quarter of 2026 theatrical release across the United States and Canada in over 750 screens. A UK release will follow later in 2026.

Flordeliza's work aims to bridge cultures, connect young audiences to world history, and inspire curiosity about global civilizations. With a focus on authentic representation, she continues to develop film, television, publishing, and interactive projects that spark imagination in children worldwide.

Paula Devonshire is an Indigenous Canadian Mohawk from the Bay of Quinte First Nation. She has collaborated with renowned filmmakers such as Neil Jordan, Atom Egoyan, George A. Romero, and Alex Kurtzman. She was the first Canadian to participate in the Inside Pictures Producer Program in London, England.

Devonshire worked as a TV production executive at eOne, where she produced the TV adaptation of John Grisham's THE FIRM. Her production credits also include popular shows like VIKINGS, PEOPLE OF EARTH, the Emmy-nominated STAR TREK, and CLARICE, based on The Silence of the Lambs.

She produced two sequels to the critically acclaimed film GINGER SNAPS with Copper Heart Entertainment, where she also contributed to the Oscar-winning animated film RYAN. Additionally, she produced George Romero's DIARY OF THE DEAD (Sundance, TIFF) and SURVIVAL OF THE DEAD (Venice, TIFF). She also worked on REAL TIME, which premiered on opening night at Slamdance and TIFF, as well as Atom Egoyan's REMEMBER (Venice, TIFF), starring Christopher Plummer (Venice, TIFF). Other projects include INDIAN HORSE, which was executive produced by Clint Eastwood, Neil Jordan's GRETA, starring Isabelle Huppert and Chloë Grace Moretz, and Zoe Hopkins' RUN WOMAN RUN.

Devonshire recently premiered three films at TIFF in 2025, BLOOD LINES by TIFF Top 10 winner Gail Maurice, STEAL AWAY by world renowned Clement Virgo, and NIKA & MADISON Nika & Madison by award winning director Eva Thomas. Paula was presented with the CMPA Indie Screen award for Feature Producer of the year at the opening night of TIFF 2025.

Lauren served as Executive Producer on THE STICKY for Amazon. Her directorial debut short film THINGS WE FEEL BUT DO NOT SAY screened at festivals in North America before premiering on CBC. Her latest short film ERASE & REWIND won the Golden Sheaf Mental Health award at the Yorkton Film Festival. Her feature screenplay AFTERWARDS was named to the WScripted Cannes Screenplay List in 2024 under head juror Vanessa Kirby. Her earlier documentaries *NOT A STRANGER* and *MELTING STARS* received multiple festival honours, while her short film *MURPHY'S LAW* (CBC, CBC GEM) won Best Horror Thriller at the Wild Bunch Film Festival.

Kate has directed and produced factual and lifestyle programming for Oxygen, HGTV, W Network, CBC, History, Discovery, Fuel TV, and Channel 4. She recently worked in the Challenge Department for *FEAR FACTOR: THE NEXT CHAPTER* with Johnny Knoxville and served as Segment Director on Netflix's hit *MILLION DOLLAR SECRET* Season 2.

They've also created five short films for Sesame and a 2022 Kidscreen and Youth Media Alliance Award-winning series of digital shorts for Peacock Jr. called MARIA: MINI-EXPLORER. Their work includes live-action content for several WGBH/PBS Kids series including THE RUFF RUFFMAN SHOW, DESIGN SQUAD GLOBAL (Daytime Emmy nominated) and the PINKALICIOUS & PETERIFFIC SHOW. Karen A. King is an award-winning producer, broadcaster, and senior executive recognized for her groundbreaking contributions to Canada's screen industry. A member of Canada's Who's Who, she was the first Black woman in Canada to produce a feature film and the first to premiere at the Cannes Film Festival. As Senior Production Executive at Global Television, Karen oversaw acclaimed scripted series including DA KINK IN MY HAIR and COMBAT HOSPITAL. At Quebecor, as Executive Director of Independent Production, she managed multimillion-dollar production funds, led the launch of Toronto 1, and advanced inclusive commissioning strategies across commercial, documentary, and scripted projects. Earlier, at the National Film Board of Canada, Karen served on the Special Mandate Team for Cultural Diversity, where she produced award-winning documentaries and initiatives that broadened representation and proved that stories from diverse communities could achieve both critical and commercial success. Recipient of the Excellence in Media Award and named a Woman of Honor, Karen remains the only two-time winner of the Canada Award for programming that best reflects the nation's diversity on and off screen. She is the founding Vice President of the Black Film and Video Network, a former director of Women in Film and Television (WIFT), Canadian Women in Communications, the Advisory Panel of the Ryerson School of Media and the Broadcast Standards Council of Ontario. Karen is a gifted speaker and trainer committed to making the industry more inclusive so it can better serve today's markets.

She has directed and produced two seasons of the animated youth series called LES MÉTIS: NOTRE CULTURE, NOS HISTOIRES (19x13min); the Géméaux-nominated non-scripted tween cooking series, PETITES BOUCHÉES DU MONDE, (33x13min), and the fictional teen series about girls in a hockey league called GANG DE HOCKEY (8x13min). She also directed and produced a diverse portfolio of non-fiction series and independent films such as ALIAS MARIE-SOLEIL (1x48min), QUIMSACOCCHA (1x8min), AU CŒUR DU YUKON (7x52 min), and 180 (14x22min). Her projects have received support from Telefilm Canada, Ontario Creates, Hot Docs, the Canadian Council for the Arts, the Ontario Art Council, among others.
