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Angela OnuoraDirector **This Naija Girl Studio**

I am an award-winning filmmaker and interdisciplinary artist, director, producer, writer, actor, TV host, music composer, and concept developer based in Kitchener-Waterloo, Ontario.

I am a current MFA student in Film at the prestigious York University, a 2019 graduate of Conestoga College from the Broadcasting Performance and Digital Media Graduate Program; founder of The RISE Class - a crash course in video production designed to empower the most underserved and underrepresented in the community; an Equity, Diversity & Inclusion advisory committee member to The Region of Waterloo Arts Fund; a film production mentor at the COVE/COVOX Arts Incubator.

My recent film is a historical documentary titled "Operation Lights Out - The Story of CANAIRELIEF", which tells the little-known story of the Canadian humanitarian effort during the Biafran War in Nigeria, fifty-two years ago. The official selection at six film festivals and winner of "Best Documentary" award at Toronto International Nollywood Film Festival & Lake International Pan African Film Festival; Special Recognition Award at Silicon Valley African Film Festival; Special Recognition award from the US House of Representatives; Recognition of Outstanding Achievement from The State of California Senate; and Special Jury Prize at 2022 Eastern Nigeria International Film Festival.

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Asis SethiProducer | Director **Fly Away Films Inc.**

An alumni of Women in Director's Chair and a former Playback Magazine's 10 to Watch, Asis Sethi is a South Asian Canadian filmmaker who graduated from Humber College where she currently teaches film and television directing. Her career in broadcasting spans over 15 years as a producer and a host on lifestyle shows. Her REMI Award winning short on menstruation, 'A BLOODY MESS', was screened at 30 film festivals. Her 16-episode documentary series on Sikh shrines in India, 'DARSHAN DEKH JEEVA', was funded by the OMNI Documentary Fund. Asis directed a documentary on post 9/11 effects on turban wearers in North America titled 'THE COLOURFUL CROWN' which premiered on OMNI Television nationally. Her short film on postpartum depression titled 'ROCK THE CRADLE' was funded by the Canada Council for the Arts and will start the film festival run in 2023.

Asis is an alumni of CineFAM's Limitless program through which she developed a proof of concept for her feature 'SLAM DUNK, SEHAJ!'. It was supported by the CFC/Netflix Calling Card Accelerator and also won Caribbean Tales' The Big Pitch at the Toronto International Film Festival in 2022.

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Sepehr SamimiProducer | Cinematographer **Understory Films Inc.**

Sepehr (he/him) is an Iranian–Canadian documentary cinematographer and producer (BFA film production from SFU). He specializes in filming on the frontlines of urgent social and political movements across the world: In 2017 he shot If I Was To Retain You, a feature doc about the umbrella movement in HongKong. In 2018 he worked on Magnitude of All Things, Jennifer Abbott's hit NFB documentary featuring global climate movements. Sepehr has filmed and currently co-producing Standing with the Ancients, a feature doc about Ada'itsx (Fairy Creek) movement, the largest act of civil disobedience in Canadian history. In 2022, he was among 14 filmmakers selected for the Doc Accelerator program at Hot Docs festival. When not engaged in key creative roles on independent docs, Sepehr works in the Vancouver film industry in the camera department of feature films and TV productions.

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Jordan MolaroPresident **Nu Media Films Inc.**

Jordan Molaro ia an Anishinaabe/Métis writer, editor, and director. Born and raised in the North End of Winnipeg, he was introduced to filmmaking at the age of thirteen when he was cast for a lead role in the film, "The Fragile". After receiving a scholarship to the Manitoba Theatre of Young People, he was inspired to pursue creative writing and he enrolled in the Film Studies program at the University of Manitoba.

His credits include award-winning short film "The Sacred Seven" which screened at numerous film festivals around the world. In 2012, he co-founded and launched the Nu Media Education program which works with indigenous youth on and off-reserve. This hands-on "all things film" program gives the opportunity to the students to create short films and be exposed to the film industry. These student films have screened at many international film festivals. The Nu Media Program was profiled by CBC National News, Netflix, Vice Media, Huffington Post, and most recently the Hollywood Reporter in 2022.

In 2015, he produced an Indigenous We Day entitled, "Ignite Your Spirit" which took place at the Canadian Museum of Human Rights. He also had the opportunity to work on the national television series entitled, Taken: The Series. The series profiles cases of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls.

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Lu AsfahaWriter | Director **Defar Media**

Lu Asfaha is an award-winning Toronto filmmaker whose films cross genres to externalize the internal. And she's had a busy year. In 2022, her short horror film FRESH MEAT premiered at Inside Out Film Festival, as well as screening at historic Black film festivals Pan African Film Fest and BronzeLens. It then won Best Canadian Short at Regent Park Film Festival and was broadcast nationally on CBC's Canadian Reflections. Lu was BlueCat Screenplay's 2022 Feature Winner and took home their Fellini Award for best international script. She is a recent graduate of the CFC's 2022 Norman Jewison Film Program Director's Lab. Lu directed 3 episodes of the East African-Canadian comedy series VIRGINS! which was released on CBC Gem. Yep, in 2022.

Lu has written and directed 4 other short films; the CBC short documentary FREEDOM SUMMER, the fantasy short PALADIN, and the dark comedy DEAD END. Most recently, she made short body horror SIGHT about a woman so consumed with envy she undergoes a horrid transformation. She was previously a Reelworld Emerging 20, a Hot Docs Film Festival Doc Accelerator Fellow, a ScreenCraft finalist, and won the RBC Emerging Director Award at Regent Park Film Festival. Lu also has 8 years of experience as an editor and assistant editor, working on Critics Choice-nominated series SHINE TRUE and the CSA-winning documentary MR. JANE & FINCH. Whether it's horror, comedy, or documentary; writing, directing, or editing - as Lu always says "the story is king."

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Ambrose Okundaye Producer | Director Dite Pictures Entertainment Inc.

Ambrose Aibi Okundaye is the Producer, Writer/Director and driving force behind Dlite Pictures Entertainment Inc, a new film production outfit dedicated to the productions of inclusive Afrocentric independent Canadian films.

He directed Goldilocks and the Three Dreads, a 35mm short film, and Ripples, with financial supports from City TV, a division of Chum Television. Both films were broadcast on City TV and other Chum stations across Canada in 2004 and 2007 respectively. He later co-produced and co-directed First Day a short film in 2012.

As Co Production company, Dlite Pictures Entertainment is currently in post-production on a horror feature film production, titled The Wiccan Girl, directed by Austin Odigie. The film was shot in Ottawa in August 2022.

Feature films script written by Ambrose A. Okundaye entitled Boiling Point, Boiling Point 2, Abuja Heist, Blinder's On, and Dawn of Light are currently on Dlite Pictures Entertainment Inc development slate.

Boiling Point is in development with Telefilm Canada and creative BC.

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Gavin SealDirector | Writer **Loaded Pictures**

Gavin Seal is a South Asian Québécois Canadian filmmaker whose mission is to dissolve otherness using the universal language of cinema.

His work as a writer/director includes the fiction films, "Followers" (Fantasia, Reelworld) and "Case Claus'd" (Montreal International Black Film Festival, CBC Short Film Faceoff finalist), as well as the documentary, "Good Luck Have Fun" (NSI, Just for Laughs). Gavin has also served as a segment director for the Canadian Screen Award-nominated TV series, "Interrupt this Program" and as a producer on films such as, "The Long Way Home", commissioned by Hot Docs and directed by Oscar-nominee Ariel Nasr and Aisha Jamal.

Gavin is developing his first feature film, "Laughing with God" with support from the TIFF Filmmaker Lab, FNC Nouveau Marché, and Berlinale Fiction Toolbox Programme at EFM. The film is adapted from his own short film screenplay, "Do Not Resuscitate" which won the Writers Guild of Canada prize at SODEC's Sprint for your Script competition.

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Shirley CheeChoo
Writer | Director | Producer
Spoken Song Production Inc.

Shirley Cheechoo (Cree) was born in Eastmain, Quebec on the eastern shores of James Bay. Shirley is the Founder and Artistic Director of Weengushk Film Institute. She is an accomplished and awarding winning artist, actor and filmmaker, and has been working in the Indigenous community for over 30 years. She is the proud recipient of numerous awards both for her own work and for recognition of her profound contributions to arts practice throughout Ontario. This multi-award winning filmmaker is the first person from a First Nation to write, produce, direct and act in a feature length dramatic film in Canada, entitled Bearwalker, which had a market screening at the Cannes Film Festival in France.

Shirley began directing films in 1998, after working as a playwright, actor and director of notable plays. Her directorial debut is the award winning short film Silent Tears, in which she chronicles the events of one harsh winter trip with her parents to a northern trap line when she was eight years old. It was screened at the 1998 Sundance Film Festival, and was also awarded the Telefilm Canada and Northern Canada Award for Best Canadian Aboriginal Language Program.

Shirley's play, PATH WITH NO MOCCASINS, gave her an opportunity to speak about her life and the struggle to retain her identity and Cree heritage. She continues to teach drama workshops to Indigenous youth and young learners across Canada. In 1984, Dr. Cheechoo founded De-ba-jeh-mu-jig Theatre Group, located on Manitoulin Island, and this touring company has become one of the foremost and respected independent Indigenous theatre companies in the world.

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Dayana StanislausProducer **Sunrays farmstead Inc.**

Dayana is an author, marketing strategist, producer, director, TV/Radio host, actor, and a fashion model. She is also a recipient of International Women Mentor, Community Ambassador and people's choice awards. In 2023, Dayana was accepted into the Banff Diversity of Voices Fellowship. She was a 2022 CMPA Diversity Producer Mentee working on the Documentary Ray of Hope produced by Ryan Singh Productions Ltd and Sunrays Farmstead Inc. Dayana is also the owner of Daya Films and TV Productions and Distribution Ltd and a member of the DOC Canada.

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Amar WalaProducer **Scarborough Pictures**

Amar's work traverses a range of style and form. Starting with a scripted background, Amar brings that same visual, story-driven approach to his documentary work. His debut feature, The Secret Trial 5 ('14), established him as a daring new voice in Canadian cinema and was named one of the Top Ten Docs of the Decade by Realscreen in 2020. He is a recipient of the prestigious Vanguard Award from the DOC Institute. Amar is also the founder of Scarborough Pictures, a Toronto based production company that makes vibrant, powerful content across film, television, and digital platforms that acts as a hub for BIPOC creators.

Tai Amy Grauman is Métis, Cree and Haudenosaunee from Ardrossan, Alberta. She is an actor, playwright, director and producer. Tai is an artistic associate at Savage Society and completed her thesis for her MFA in theatre practice at the U of A in 2023 with a focus on her artistic research of 'Metis women's love stories'. In her artistic practice she focuses on telling the stories of her ancestors, all the Callihoo women who came before her with a specific focus on their love stories. She was named the Métis Nation of Alberta's outstanding youth of 2020. Her play You used to call me Marie toured Alberta and Saskatchewan to Batoche Days, Métis Crossing as well as many other Metis communities. And is playing the National theatre in 2023. This past year she adapted her upcoming play Wiwimaw into a short film alongside Filmmaker Heather Hatch. She also recently adapted Mary's wedding: A Metis Love story. At the Citadel theatre. Selected Acting Credits include: Mary's Wedding: A Métis love story, (Citadel Theatre), Honour Beat (Grand Theatre), Thanks for Giving (Arts Club). You used to call me Marie (Savage Production Society). Upcoming: Tai is working on a narrative scripted series called Metis Love stories: a scripted adaption of her play You Used to Call me Marie. Tai was a cohort in the whistler indigenous film accelerator program for the winter of 2022.

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Navalik Tologanak Owner Tolok Productions

I am a proud Inuinnaq from Cambridge Bay, Nunavut. I am a journalist and emerging filmmaker. I am a residential school survivor. Sent away to Inuvik and Yellowknife for 12 years, I lost traditional skills and my language. I fought hard to relearn Inuinnaqtun and graduated from the Indigenous Languages Program from the University of Victoria in 2019 at the age of 65. I began my journalism career in 1995, writing for Nunavut news. I've been photographing and documenting events in my community in Inuinnaqtut for 27 years. I dedicate much of my time to community service. My experience on the NWT status of women council, the Pauktuutit Inuit women's association of Canada, the Aboriginal Healing Foundation has made me intimately aware of the legacy of residential schools in Canada from direct personal experience and as a journalist and activist. I am honoured to be one of the Inuit committee members for the National Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Sharing Circle. 29 July 2022, I was one of the residential school survivors who attended a private meeting of survivors with Pope Francis. I also spoke at the 2nd National Truth and Reconciliation Day ceremonies in Ottawa, 30th September 2022.

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Helena Morgane Director | Writer | Actor Gold Water Media

Helena Morgane is an Afro-European Filmmaker-Actor/multidisciplinary creative based in North America, committed to the craft of complex intersectional storytelling.

She is an alumni of the BIPOC TV & Film x Warner Bros. Episodic Writers Lab, The Barrow Group and Black Women Film! Canada. Her work has screened at international festivals.

A prolific creative and polyglot, she works globally, having collaborated with organizations such as Interscope, T.D.E., Shopify, NIA Centre for the Arts, and artists like Kendrick Lamar and Drake.

Helena was a TEDx Speaker Coordinator, and as the Associate Programmer for TIFF Rising Stars 2020, she had the pleasure of hosting mentorship sessions with David Oyelowo, Tantoo Cardinal and the Casting Society of America.

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Raghed Charabaty Writer | Director Charabaty Films

Raghed Charabaty is a Lebanese-Canadian filmmaker and writer based in Toronto. Their films have won prizes at TIFF: Canada's Top Ten, Festival du Nouveau Cinema and the Starfish Art Awards.

Raghed was recently selected for the 2022-2023 BIPOC TV & Film x Warner Bros. Discovery Access Canada - Writers Lab.

Raghed is a recipient of SSHRC Award in Honour of Nelson Mandela 2018. Their work can also be found in the permanent art collections at the Anna Leonowens and SMU Art Galleries. Raghed holds an MFA in Film Production from York University and a BFA in Film Production and Art History from NSCAD University.

Raghed is also an experienced editor, compositor and sound designer, working with clients ranging from wildlife filmmakers, to the Canada Council for the Arts and Snoop Dogg music videos. As a synesthete, their work often features magical realism, vibrant colors and intricate soundscapes. Their personal films deal with revolutionary joy, curiousity, and desire as spectacle.

Preeti Torul is an actor, screenwriter, comedian and filmmaker represented by Grand Wave Entertainment. Preeti started out at The Second City Toronto in 2013 and was cast as a writer and repertory player in the inaugural Bob Curry Fellowship in 2015. Since then, she has performed stand-up across North America. Her first televised stand-up performance at the 2019 Winnipeg Comedy Festival, is now streaming on CBC Gem.

Preeti's on screen credits include 'Bria Mack Gets A Life' (New Metric Media/Crave), 'Note To Self' (CBC Comedy), 'Odd Squad' (PBS), 'Nine Films About Technology' (FXX/Hulu) and 'Wedding Season' (Netflix). Preeti has written for CBC's 'Air Farce' and 'TallBoyz' Season 3. Her original one-hour scripted dramedy; 'DEMONS', was selected for the 2022 Emerging 20 Reelworld Film Festival Screenwriting program and is currently in partnership with Archipelago Productions to pitch to international markets.

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Alexandra MacLean Actor | Writer | Stunt Performer



As a graduate of the 2022 BIPOC TV & FILM Writing for Kids TV Intensive, Alexandra was 1 of 6 pitch competition winners for her original pilot, and has been selected to the 2023 WildBrain Writing Summit Initiative.

In addition to her 12 years of film & television experience, Alexandra has also earned a Double Major Degree in Accounting and Management with Dean's List First Class Honours from Mount Saint Vincent University.

Patrick (also known as Nang K'uulas) is a Haida award-winning film & television director, social entrepreneur, and university instructor from Haida Gwaii, BC. Selected as young Entrepreneur of the Year by the BC Aboriginal Business Awards, Patrick has founded over a dozen start-ups, social, creative, and non-profit initiatives that resulted in him being selected as one of the top 15 Emerging Innovators in Canada by Ashoka Changemakers, and one of the top 50 Young Cultural Innovators in the world by Salzburg Global Seminar.

Inspired by his cultural upbringing, Patrick endeavours to use technology, media, and education to empower locals in addressing the social & cultural issues within Canada's remote and Indigenous communities.

With over 15 years of experience working within the Vancouver film, television and photography industries, Patrick currently operates film production company InnoNative, Indigenous modelling agency Supernaturals, and a media training and production initiative called the Haida Gwaii Media Collective.

Anish Bhalla is an accomplished writer and producer, whose work with Canada Basketball and the Toronto Raptors organization has earned him a seat at the table amongst the top creatives in Canadian basketball content. Anish's biggest project, "Bhalla", which won the Just For Laughs ComedyPro Pitch Contest, has just been picked up by Wind Sun Sky productions.

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Patricia Chica President | Producer | Director Flirt Films Inc.

Patricia Chica has produced over 60 hours of content and significant experience producing, directing and creating award-winning films and television programs for major networks and clients in North America, France and the UK. Exceptionally adept at overseeing all aspects of the storytelling process from conception to production. Chica has completed her auteur-driven film MONTRÉAL GIRLS, that she co-wrote, directed, and produced. It is scheduled for release in North in 2023. Her TV concept SOLEIL & LUNA (a Queer/ LatinX dramedy series) has garnered significant momentum in the past year, getting interest from OUT TV and receiving development funding from the CMF. 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Camille Beaudoin Writer | Director | Producer Mosaic Entertainment

Camille is an Indigenous Producer, Writer, and Director with over 20 years of experience in the film, television, and interactive media industry. She has spent the last sixteen years as Producer at Mosaic Entertainment guiding the creative of world class screen content including three feature films, three mobile games, countless hours of online video, and over 100 episodes of scripted TV. She worked closely with Writers, Directors, Department Heads, and Post Production team to make award-winning scripted productions including the winner of Kidscreen's Best Teen Movie #Roxy starring Booboo Stewart (Disney Descendants) and Danny Trejo (Spy Kids, Machete), and four seasons of Tiny Plastic Men (nominated for Best Comedy Series at the Canadian Screen Awards three seasons in a row and listed on Vulture.com as one of Canada's top 25 essential sitcoms).

Now focused on building her career as a Writer / Director, Camille recently directed six episodes of the series Couleurs Du Nord for Lopii Productions (TFO) and wrote and directed nine episodes of the series Bears' Lair (APTN). Hisham Kelati is a Toronto-based stand-up comic and comedy writer, known for his vivid and engaging storytelling.

As a writer he's written on hit CBC shows TallBoyz and Run the Burbs and was a winner of CBC's Creative Relief Fund program and a finalist in the 2022 JFL/CBC Comedy Pitch program.

As a stand-up, he's performed on multiple festivals including Just for Laughs Montreal (New Faces Canada 2019 and the Hannah Gadsby Gala in 2022), headlining at Just for Laughs Toronto and featured at Sled Island Fest, Toronto Sketchfest and CBC's Accent on Toronto.

Marion is a twice nominated contender for Best Female Improviser by NOW Magazine in 2014 & 2015. Marion's responsible for creating and starring in 3 successful web series', Moniquea Marion 365, Food Porn, and Fuel Up.

Currently, she's writing and coordinating on Nelvana's new CGI show - Millie Magnificent.

Her second, BAKED GOODS is a serialized drama/comedy that dives into the impacts of marginalization and legalization of cannabis on a racially diverse community in Scarborough. Her third project is a mystical realism feature film, A FARM ON BLUE MOUNTAIN.

His work has been profiled by the CBC, Graffiti Arts magazines and a variety of other print and digital publications.

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
Sage Daniels Writer | Producer Code Breaker Films

With his trademark red glasses, cool hair, and African dashiki, he brings a curious and fun approach to learning while embracing and celebrating differences.

The show promotes diversity, unity, respect and self-love, encouraging acceptance of differences and the opportunity to expand a child's ideas about the world. In 2021, KKZ received funding from Shaw Rocket Fund to update its show concept. Hey, Kujo! was developed as an updated version, which takes place in a diverse an bustling community centre with some familiar faces and new friends.
