



Vision Views are meant to inspire the vision for your home. Spanish revival architecture is popular in San Antonio, and current residential building reflects this significant trend. This style encompasses most architecture with a stone/stucco exterior and a red barrel tile roof including: Spanish Hacienda, Tuscan, Santa Barbara, Mediterranean, and Floridian. In San Antonio, Tuscan homes tend to utilize more stone than Spanish Hacienda which are primarily stucco with large covered porches.

## Spanish Revival Architecture General Characteristics

- Low pitch tile roofs
- Thick walls
- Recessed windows
- Rustic to contemporary
- Interior tile work
- Beams
- All stucco, stone/stucco, all stone, brick accents

## Fine Details

- Asymmetrical
- Terracotta tile
- Arches
- Built in niches & alcoves
- Hand painted tile on stair risers
- Wooden ceiling beams
- Decorative wrought iron railing
- Ornate tile, wrought iron, and wood work
- Plaster interior walls
- Stucco over adobe brick, or adobe brick exterior walls
- Half round arches, doors, and windows
- Tile roof
- Low-pitched flat, gable, or hip roof, typically with no overhang
- Rich fabrics
