Introducing our latest Special Project:

GMHS TV STUDIO

Former Granby Education Foundation (GEF) board member Al Wilke knew he wanted his \$10,000 GEF donation to spur the development of a game-changing STEM project at the high school, so he turned to the GEF board and Dr. Jordan Grossman, superintendent, to make it happen.

After the success of a recent GEF grant for digital video cameras to livestream school events, the idea for the GEF to give \$100,000 for this state-of-the-art TV studio was the natural next step. The TV studio supports current classes—Journalism, Principles of Speech and Communication, and Sports Marketing—and the Bears Broadcasting Club. It also gives opportunities to this year's technology students to construct the studio set for the new school news channel.

Technology teachers Tim Barnett and Nick Gaeta are encouraging GMHS faculty to reimagine their teaching methods and find ways to incorporate the TV studio into their classes, offering students hands-on experiences that blend technology and the arts.

This \$100,000 studio allows the high school to showcase its many talented artists, actors, musicians, and athletes through featured productions. In the future, students may even collaborate on community projects such as public service announcements and highlight reels of community events.



The success of livestreamed GMHS events like Coffeehouse concerts and basketball games jumpstarted the discussion about building a quality video production program.

"Students need hands-on experiences using technology, developing skills like writing in a real-world context, and seeing the connection of STEM and the arts," says Al Wilke.

HIDDEN FIGURES MOVIE SCREENING AND DISCUSSION



Each organization gave \$2,648.50 to purchase equipment for quality livestreaming of GMHS events not open to the public due to COVID-19 gathering restrictions. The club was started by seniors Nick Boyd and Owen Danke who not only learned how to do livestreaming on their own, but also wrote the grant, and trained other club members. The club livestreamed fall and winter sporting events as well as the winter and spring Coffeehouse concerts and uploaded them for future viewing on YouTube, bringing a service to Granby that will be enjoyed by friends and family, near and far, long after the pandemic.
