A Brief History:

By increasing community involvement, expanding the capabilities of area educators, encouraging creativity in teaching, and stimulating an interest in lifelong learning, the Foundation works to foster innovative educational opportunities for area residents of all ages.



The General Fund

The Granby Education Foundation raised more than \$16,000 toward its General Fund in its 2006 Fiscal Year (July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006). This fund supports the Foundation's Community Mini-Grant Program. In its 2006 Fiscal Year, the Foundation awarded \$10,350 in mini-grants from this fund. The balance was invested by the Foundation, putting us in a position to support worthy projects and take advantage of exciting opportunities as they present themselves. In addition, our annual fundraising success is helpful in showing potential grantors (particularly other charitable foundations) that the Granby Education Foundation has the solid support of the community and is an organization that is here to stay. We are grateful to all of you who have supported our organization, many of you on an annual basis, by making contributions to our General Fund.

Mini-Grants



The GEF Prize Patrol surprised Frank M. Kearns Primary School students and faculty, awarding them with \$1,500 for Family Literacy Night, a program designed to encourage reading.

The Granby Education Foundation's Community Mini-Grant Program continues to grow. Between the Fall of 2005 and the Spring of 2006, we received 17 mini-grant requests and awarded nine grants in a variety of disciplines. The following grants were awarded.

American Sign Language Club

The GEF awarded \$750 to the American Sign Language Club at Wells Road School for the purchase of start-up materials, including instructional videos, games, books and materials. The club, which had 14 members at the time, has since grown to include more than 50 members.

Visit by Children's Author Vicki Cobb

The GEF awarded \$3,000 to fund visits to Kelly Lane, Wells Road and Kearns Schools by popular science book author Vicki Cobb.

Folding Curtain and Frame for Drama Productions

The GEF awarded \$1,500 to the drama department at Granby Memorial Middle School for the purchase of a folding curtain and frame that will allow spaces other than the G.M.H.S. auditorium stage to be used for drama productions.

Spanish Exchange

The GEF awarded \$1,000 to help fund bus transportation for Spanish exchange students and their hosts to visit New York City.

G.M.M.S. Teen Read Week

The GEF awarded \$300 to the Granby Memorial Middle School Media Center to fund prizes for a special "Teen Read Week" event.

Family Literacy Night

The GEF awarded \$1,500 to fund an exciting night out for Kindergartners and their families. The event, which featured talented puppeteer Tom Knight, was designed to encourage early literacy.

Aeronautical Club at GMMS

The GEF awarded \$1,000 to the Aeronautical Club at Granby Memorial Middle School to fund the purchase of software and kits.

Shakesperience at GMMS

The GEF awarded \$800 to fund a performance of *A Midsummer Night's Dream* by the professional acting troupe, Shakesperience. The performance was given for all 7th and 8th graders.

Opera Express at Granby Schools

The GEF awarded \$1,000 to bring Opera Express, the educational outreach arm of Connecticut Opera, to Granby for a number of performances in the schools.

The Arts Endowment

The GEF continues to work hard to raise funds for its Arts Endowment. In October of 2006, the GEF brought the music and magic of Broadway to Granby when it hosted students from the Hartt School Music Theatre Program for a musical revue entitled, *On Broadway (Way Off Broadway)*. More than 600 people attended the event. In addition, a group of the Hartt students conducted a workshop with Granby High School students.

The previous year, renowned singers/songwriters Livingston Taylor and Cliff Eberhardt were the talk of the town after hosting an entertaining evening for area residents; and students of all ages got to act alongside the professional

actors of the Freestyle Repertory Theatre to create improvisational theatrical performances that made audiences howl with laughter.

The Foundation will continue to sponsor this kind of high quality artistic programming for Granby school students and area residents through its Arts Endowment. Once fully funded, the Arts Endowment will generate at least \$10,000 a year, which the GEF will devote solely to the arts here in Granby.

Salmon Brook Ecology Center

The Salmon Brook Ecology Center continues to hum with activity. The students raise rainbow trout, native brown trout, and native brown trout fry in the Eco-Center. They also raise lettuce and basil in the hydroponics tanks. Seventh graders use the Eco-Center to study bacterial decomposition, plant photosynthesis, UV light and dehydration for food preservation, and human body systems. In addition, they get hands-on practice following directions, making observations, and recording and using data. Each spring, the seventh graders help release some of the fry into local streams. The FishKids Club, a group of dedicated volunteers who work after school, on weekends, and vacations to provide additional care for the fish, work with DEP staff to release the remainder of the fry and the larger trout.

A Fun Night Out...and More Than \$12,000 Raised!

The GEF's Gran-Bee trivia bee has become an annual tradition in Granby. Teams arrive from all over town in zany costumes (such as the Three Faces of Johnny Damon) with creative team names (such as the Wannabees), and silly antics (such as the Hillbilly Bees). Emcee Bill Percival, who wears his own zany costumes (in 2006 he was The Great Carnac), entertains the crowd and

keeps the competition light-hearted. Those who don't want to compete turn out in droves to support their favorite teams—sometimes with signs and prepared cheers and swarms of loud children screaming for their teachers... or their moms and dads.

The third annual Gran-Bee was held on Friday, April 7, 2006.

Forty teams, representing town boards, churches, businesses, schools, neighborhoods, sports teams, and groups of friends, competed. Nearly 600 people attended the event, which raised more than \$12,000 for the Foundation's General Fund.

One by one, teams were eliminated until The Fabulous Faculty, made up of Granby Memorial High School faculty Ann Puzzo, Lauren Shafer and John Crand, and The Holcomb Farmers, made up of Lloyd Graves, Jonathan Kirschner and Chris Riley, were left to battle it out for the title of Grand Bees. The question was "Where are 47 czars buried?" With the answer of "the Kremlin," The Holcomb Farmers walked away victorious carrying with them three shiny trophies and three six-month memberships, courtesy of the Farmington Valley YMCA.

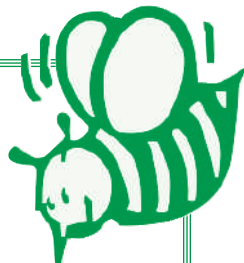
How You Can Help

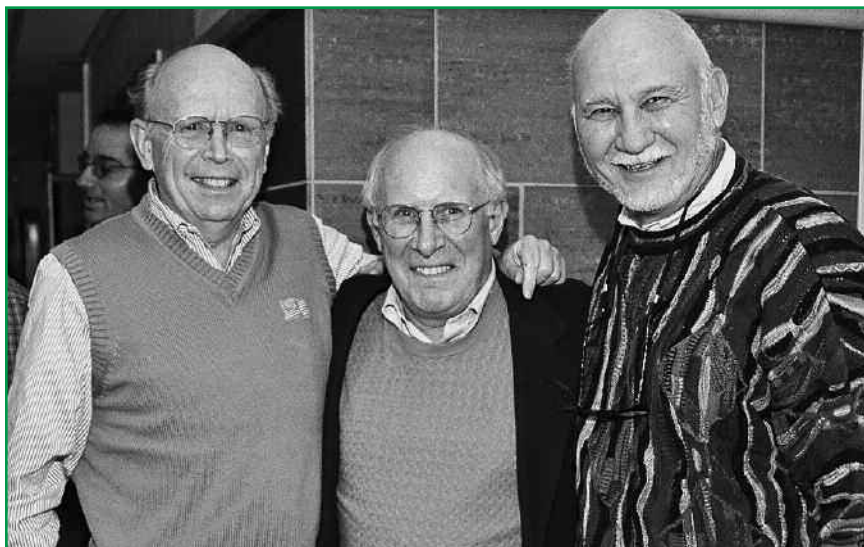

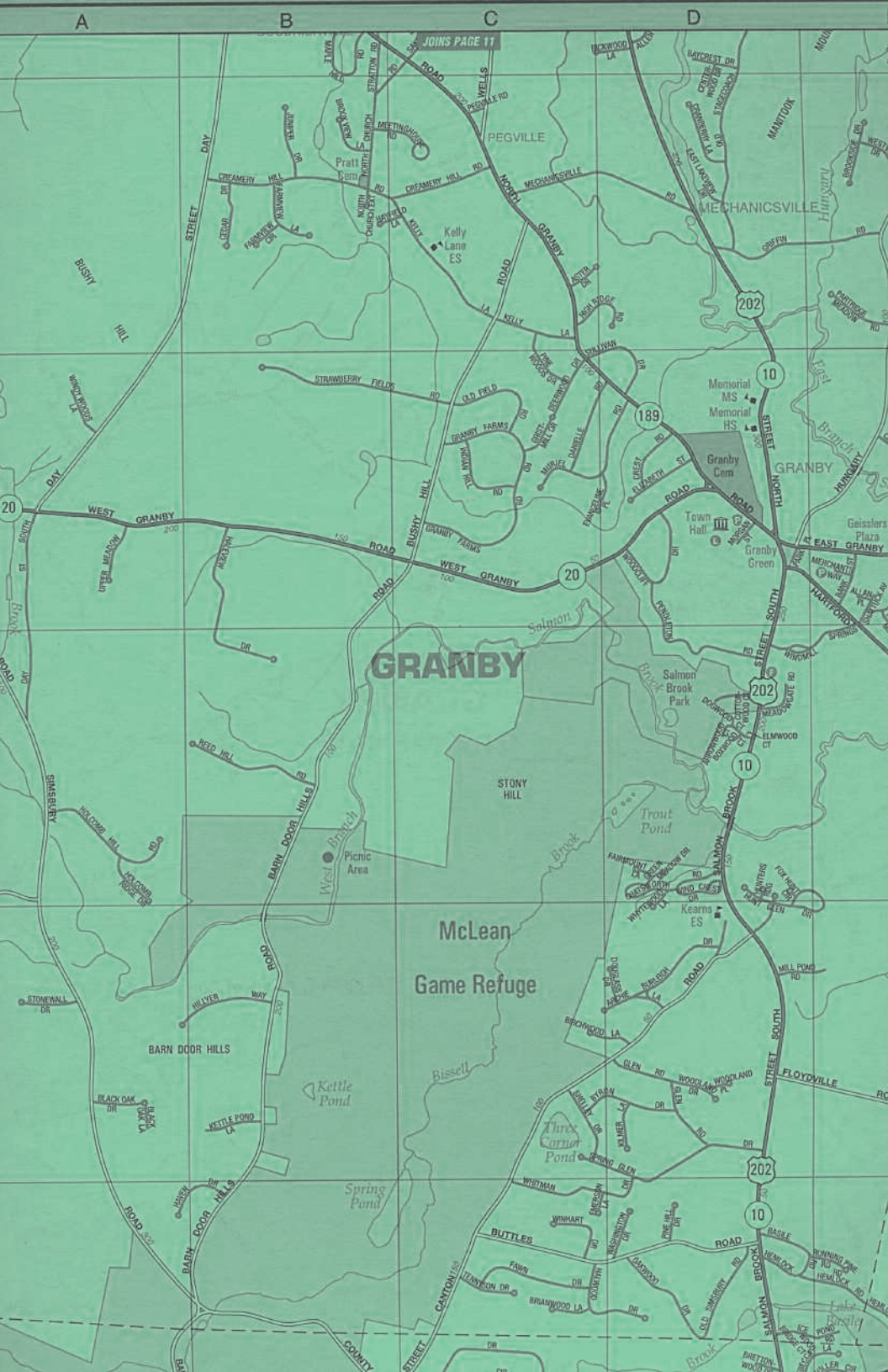
