Community Grant Program

The General Fund

The Granby Education Foundation (GEF) raised more than \$34,100 to benefit its General Fund during the 2014–15 fiscal year. The GEF is grateful to its supporters for showing such generosity.

The General Fund supports the Foundation's Community Grant Program. In 2014–15, a total of \$21,794 in grants was awarded. The balance was saved, putting the Foundation in a position to support worthy projects as they come along, such as the Summer Drama Academy. It also is helpful in showing potential grantors (particularly other charitable foundations) that the Granby Education Foundation has the solid support of the community.

Community Grants

The Granby Education Foundation's Community Grant Program continues to make an impact on our community's educational environment. This year the GEF was able to introduce a third winter grant cycle. Between the fall of 2014 and the spring of 2015, the GEF received 13 grant requests and awarded 11 grants. In 2014–15, the recipients ranged from pre-school age to senior citizens; and from school-based programs to community non-profits. Snowshoeing Fitness Unit

Kearns Primary School was awarded \$1,440 to create a snowshoeing unit that would teach outdoor fitness techniques and encourage a positive attitude for healthy living through winter-based activities. This grant was made possible by the Nannie Brown Tribute Fund. *(Application submitted by: Karl Gates, Kearns Physical Education Teacher)*

The Amazing Nano Brothers Juggling Show

Through the use of extraordinary visuals created through juggling and lighting, the students at Wells Road and Kelly Lane Schools were able to explore nanoscale science and technology. A grant for \$1,630 covered presentations at each school. *(Application submitted by: Judy LaRocque, Wells Road School Science Teacher)*

Catapult Program

Valley Pre-School was awarded \$700 as seed money for the development of a puppetry unit as part of their after-school Catapult Program. *(Application submitted by: Maureen Williams, VPS Board Member)*

GoPro Video Cameras

\$2,500 was granted to GMHS to purchase ten GoPro video cameras to be used by the school to create video projects that are currently used in all disciplines across the curriculum. *(Application submitted by: Casey LaPlante, GMHS Media Specialist)*

Paleontology Lab

GMHS was awarded \$2,630 to purchase accurately reproduced skulls of some of the most important hominids and primates. These skulls will allow history and science students to perform in-depth experiments in the classroom. *(Application submitted by: Joseph Jarvis, GMHS Social Studies Teacher)*

Ride to Read Program

\$1,200 in seed money was granted to the Granby Public School District to pilot this program that is designed to increase reading proficiency, brain function, and the ability to focus while incorporating physical activity. *(Application submitted by: Patricia Law, GPS Head of Curriculum)*



Arts Endowment Grant Program

The Arts Endowment

The GEF Arts Endowment exists to provide a permanent source of funding to support and promote initiatives in the arts. Our goal is to fund opportunities within our community that expose multiple generations to exemplary works of art. The Foundation has endowed \$200,000 for this purpose.

Arts Endowment Grants

The GEF Arts Endowment Grant Program distributed more than \$8,891 in its fifth year. The Foundation received five grant applications and all five requests were awarded. The following grants were awarded between the fall of 2014 and the spring of 2015. Percussion Concert

Valley Pre-School was awarded \$400 to sponsor a percussion program that gives children a direct, hands-on experience with many cultures through music and a diversity of instruments. *(Application submitted by: Maureen Williams, VPS Board Member)*

“Fiesta del Norte” Assembly

This program was extended to GMMS and GMHS after its success in the spring at the Kelly Lane and Wells Road Schools. An additional \$900 was awarded to bring the well-known Mariachi group Fiesta del Norte to perform for students in support of their Spanish language curriculum. *(Application submitted by: Laura Iapichino, GMHS Spanish Teacher and Mark Neri, GMMS & GMHS Band Teacher)*

Mid-Stage Curtain

GMHS was awarded \$5,456 for the purchase and installation of a mid-stage curtain on the stage of the auditorium. The curtain will increase the versatility of the space for use by the students and community, allowing for contiguous space usage and providing the tools necessary to enhance the curriculums of the drama and music programs. *(Application submitted by: Nikki Currie-Huggard, GMHS Drama Teacher; Karen Kudish, GMHS English Teacher; and Emily Cote, GMHS Student)*

Writing Workshop

Writing expert Barry Lane spent a hands-on day at Wells Road School working with the fifth grade students on writing strategies including: content, elaboration, and revision. He then conducted an after-school workshop for teachers from both Wells Road and Kelly Lane schools. A grant for \$2,700 was awarded to fund this motivational and educational program. *(Application submitted by: Cynthia Garrey, Wells Road Language Arts Teacher)*

One School, One Book

Wells Road School was awarded \$1,725 in grant monies to pilot this family literacy program that allows a school to create a school-wide book club. *(Application submitted by: Anna Forlenza-Bailey, Wells Road School Principal)*

Summer Reading Program

A grant of \$1,669 was provided to Kearns Primary School to develop and pilot a summer reading platform for the reading intervention/support program. *(Application submitted by: Sarah Schrandt, Kearns School Reading Specialist)*

History Day

GMMS was awarded \$1,600 to establish a formal club that will participate in the national History Day Program that encourages exploration of local, state, national, and world history. This grant was made possible by the Cal Heminway Tribute Fund. *(Application submitted by: Jodi Okenquist, GMMS History Teacher)*



Chemistry in Art/Art in Chemistry

A grant of \$1,335 was awarded to GMHS for the continuation of this program that integrates the two seemingly different disciplines of science and art in an authentic and real-world way. Students will study the chemistry behind the Raku ceramic process and then employ their creativity to create their own pieces. *(Application submitted by: Baokhanh Paton, GMHS Science Teacher and Hollie Hecht, GMHS Art Teacher)*

Hands-On Art Fun Day

The GEF continues to support this annual event, with a grant of \$800, which allows community members of all ages to try their hand at various art forms with the guidance of area artists who share their talent, techniques, and expertise. *(Application submitted by: Robin Sidwell, Granby Artists Association)*

Special Projects 2014-2015

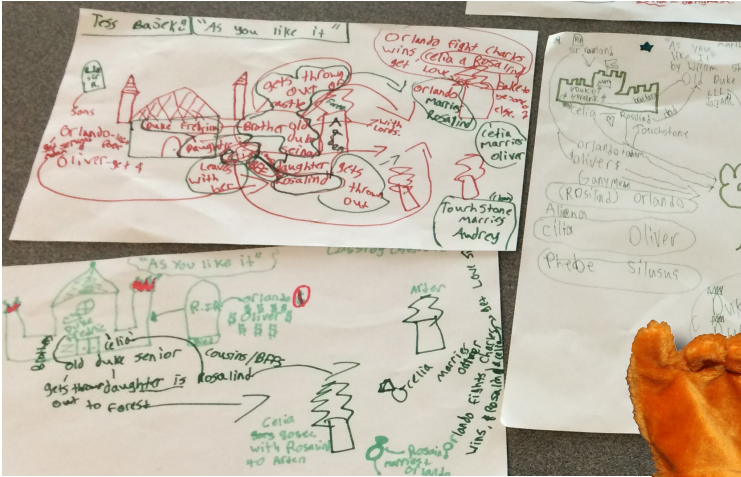
Peter Pan

A grant was awarded to Good Company Theater in the amount of \$4,000 to pilot a partnership with the GMHS Drama Department in which community members of all ages were able to work together on the *Peter Pan* production. This collaboration was an historical first and allowed cast and crew to collaborate and share resources, cultivate creativity, build community, and soar to greater heights—literally and figuratively! Summer Drama Academy

The Granby Education Foundation was pleased to sponsor a second year of the Granby Public School’s Summer Drama Academy in June 2015 at the \$12,680 level. During this summer enrichment program, artists from Hartford Stage instructed students in the foundations of acting which included: the art of building an ensemble, developing a character, practicing proper vocal and movement techniques, and strengthening concentration and focus skills. At the conclusion of the program, they used these skills in a performances of well-known scenes from a variety of Shakespeare’s plays. (*Application submitted by: Alan Addley, GPS Superintendent*)
