He has become a spokesman for the national marrow donor program which connects blood-cancer patients to marrow donors for life-saving transplants.

The Texas Country Rock artist released "Against the Grain" which quickly saw songs like "Me, You & Emmylou," "Bye Bye City Lights" and

"Supernatural" become fan favorites. His motto "Smile Hard" has since gone on to become his life's mantra and inspires people worldwide each and every time he takes the stage. His performance at this year's Best Cellars 2014 event will give guests an opportunity to enjoy the music of one of Dallas' most sought-after singer/songwriters.

The Best Cellars Dinner Dallas 2014 event benefits **The T.J.
