THE T.J. MARTELL FOUNDATION PRESENTS \$100,000 GRANT TO YOUNG INVESTIGATOR AT THE GLOBAL ACTION SUMMIT

AWARD IN MEMORY OF WARNER MUSIC NASHVILLE LINDSAY WALLEMAN



On Tuesday, November 18th, The T.J. Martell Foundation for Leukemia, Cancer & AIDS research and Global Action Platform announced the Young Investigator Award for Sarcoma Research at the Global Action Summit which took place at Music City Center in Nashville. The Young Investigator Award Grant was presented to Chunlei Jin from the Department of Pediatrics Research at The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston. Jin's focus is on the mechanism of tumor metastasis in osteosarcoma, a form of cancer that claimed the life of Lindsay Walleman, the Northeast and Midwest Regional Promotion Manager for Warner Music Nashville who lost her battle with Sarcoma in 2013. The Young Investigator Award for Sarcoma Research was created in her memory. Walleman lost her fight with cancer at the age of 28.

Approximately 400-500 top senior level decision makers from the corporate, government, academic, media, investments and NGO communities attended the invitation only summit. The T.J. Martell Foundation has been a leader in establishing and funding some of the nation's most prominent and innovative research and medical advancements in the fight against Leukemia, Cancer and AIDs. The foundation has funded more than \$260 million of truly impactful science.
