Findings of Fact

1. The Petitioner has filed a timely petition under s.77.82(2), Wis. Stats., and in accordance with s.77.82, Wis. Stats., to enter the land as Managed Forest Land.
2. The lands described in the petition meet the eligibility requirements of s.77.82(1), Wis. Stats.
3. The facts in the petition are correct.
4. A merchantable stand of timber will be developed on the land within a reasonable period of time.
5. The use of the land as Managed Forest Land is not incompatible with the existing uses of land in the municipality.
6. There are no delinquent taxes on the land.

Conclusions of Law

The Department of Natural Resources, pursuant to s. 77.82(8), Wis. Stats., based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact is required to approve the petitioners' petition and designate the land described in the petition as Managed Forest Land.



Mandatory Practices:

You must complete or establish mandatory practices in the manner prescribed by the end of the year listed below; if not, the department may be required to issue a non-compliance fee or withdraw your property from the MFL program.

If withdrawn, your property may be subject to substantial property taxes and a withdrawal fee.

You must file two cutting notices at least 30 days before you may cut or harvest timber. You must file a Wisconsin Cutting Notice and Report (Form 2450-32). Additionally, you must file a separate county cutting notice with the County Clerk prior to any harvest. The cutting prescriptions must be within the guidelines of the Department of Natural Resources Silviculture Handbook at <http://dnr.wi.gov/forestry/Publications/Handbooks/24315/> and the Forest Management Guidelines at <http://dnr.wi.gov/forestry/Publications/Guidelines/>.
