he Russia-Ukraine war, which began on 24th February last year completes one year. The UN General Assembly called for ending the war in Ukraine and demanded Russia's immediate withdrawal from the country, in line with the UN Charter. He added his voice to international condemnation of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine, telling the Human Rights Council that it had "triggered the most massive violations of human rights we are living today".

Because of this conflict, millions are displaced, millions of people lost their livelihood, and their dear ones, extreme poverty, and hunger are rising and nearly 40 percent of the population of Ukraine require aid and protection. Almost 10 million people, including 7.8 million children, are at risk of acute post-traumatic stress disorder. Russia is also suffering the deadly consequences.

War always causes grave global crisis and results in people's suffering. Most of the world leaders called for 'encourage every meaningful effort to end the bloodshed and to prevent further escalation, at long last, give peace a chance to silence the guns in Ukraine.' Life is a living hell for the people of Ukraine! The guns are talking now!

The month of March is blessed with the observances of International Day of Prayer and International Women's Day. In Bible we see a woman -Hagar - who painfully chosen the desert to escape from life experiences and then being seen by God in her hurts, bitterness and loneliness. Being powerless and afraid, she was fleeing to wilderness firstly. But God meets her in the desert and sends her back with a promise that I will bless you and be with you.

The second time God meets Hagar when she was forcefully sent to the wilderness by her master. Being exhausted, fiercely thirsty, and utterly hopeless, she started to weep. She thought she and her dear child were going to die, but gracious God willed her to live. He spoke to her audibly, He opened her eyes to witness the new streams near by.

God speaks tender words to Hagar. Even though she was part of a bad human plan, God promises her that it would be turned into a blessing. And asks her to trust Him for a much brighter future. Yet He blesses Sarah as the mother of the Promised one. Instead, God used Hagar and Ishmael

and his future wife's descendants to form a great nation made up of 12 tribes. (Genesis 21



e live in the age of the Holy Spirit as promised by our Saviour Jesus Christ. This means that for those who are born into the family of God, through the new birth as the result of forgiveness of our sins and sanctification by the blood of Jesus Christ, this new life opens for us the way into the Kingdom of God. We experience God's presence in our day-to-day life. This helps us to see beyond our physical life, our capacity, and our situations and circumstances, and understand the spiritual realm. We only need to trust God. King Solomon, the man of great wisdom in his time, puts it this way: 'Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight. Do not be wise in your own eyes; fear the Lord and shun evil' (Proverb 3:5-7, NIV).

The King reveals the secret of the amazing victorious Christian life that one can live and witness. The secret is that we never, ever, lean on our own understanding. Ignoring God's omnipresent existence will bring us down and make our life miserable. New life without God's continual presence will draw us back to our former life without God. This makes our life even worse. Jesus cautions us when He said, "Whoever is not with me is against me, and whoever does not gather with me scatters. When an impure spirit comes out of a person, it goes through arid places seeking rest and does not find it. Then it says, 'I will return to the house I left.' When it arrives, it finds the house swept clean and put in order. Then it goes and takes seven other spirits more wicked than itself, and

they go in and live there. And the final condition of that person is worse than the first" (Luke 11:23-26, NIV).

We encounter people who go through longterm illness and difficulties, and we see unending fears and distress. In such things, it is easy to blame God and doubt His presence, power and faithfulness. Satan's main weapon against God's people is creating doubt by using convincing halftruths about God and our lives. That's why the Word of God tells us, 'Be alert and of sober mind. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour' (1 Peter 5:8, NIV).

'Leaning on our own understanding' means taking pride in our wealth, our knowledge and our strength. That means we limit the value of our soul and lose the true purpose of our lives. This proves dangerous to our soul. The Word of God asks, 'What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul?' (Mark 8:36, NIV). Such a person not only damages their own soul, but also underestimates others. The prevalence of wickedness in the world is the consequence of people who follow their own evil ambitions. 'There are six things the LORD hates, seven that are detestable to him: haughty eyes, a lying tongue, hands that shed innocent blood, a heart that devises wicked schemes, feet that are quick to rush into evil, a false witness who pours out lies and a person who stirs up conflict in the community' (Proverbs 6:16-19 NIV).

We cannot hide from the eyes of the Lord. He sees everyone, everywhere, for he fills the heavens and the earth (see Jeremiah 23:24). He is the everywhere, ever-present God.

The unchanging truth is that God loves us unconditionally and His faithfulness is unfailing. Here is what the Word of God says,

"Yours, Lord, is the greatness, the power, the glory, the majesty, and the splendour, for everything in heaven and earth is yours. Yours, Lord, is the kingdom; you are exalted as head over all. Wealth and honour come from you; you are the ruler of all things. In your hands are strength and power to exalt and give strength to all" (1 Chronicles 29:11-

You may be someone who is exhausted depending on your own understanding: trying everything without seeking God's help, and needing to come to your senses by turning to God for His help. Your life is bigger than any treasures of this world. Your soul is meant to live forever. The cross of Jesus Christ is the only way to meaningful and everlasting life. There should be nothing hindering our way to that everlasting life: if we submit ourselves to Him, who is the way and the life, He will make our paths straight. He frees us from fear of hell and death, and gives us everlasting life. If we ask His Holy Spirit to take control of our lives, and submit to His authority and power, God takes control of our lives. He opens our eyes, and we learn to look at our lives through his eyes. We say 'no' to evil and acknowledge God's presence, honour him in everything we do and bring joy to our lives, and walk in God's light.

Take this good advice for your good self: acknowledge God's presence by asking the Holy Spirit to take control of your life, so that you no longer depend on your own worldly understanding and are misled and lost to sin and its dominion. Humble yourself before God and trust in Him with all your heart. Submit to His authority and obey His voice. He will make your life worthwhile and empower you to enjoy your life in the light of God.

The women and her noble, yet a simple act faith and her contribution was totally ignored by the crowd. But Jesus appreciated this poor widow's offering and acknowledge her contribution that was ignored by others. Giving importance to valuable and meaningful contribution of the woman, Jesus openly made his statement, 'Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others' (Mark 12: 43 NIV).

Other incident is mentioned in Mark 14: 1 -9. This took place when Passover festival was just away from two days. Jesus was reclining at the table with his disciples and while other people were around him. The Passover celebration that particular time was significant for God the Father, and His Son and for whole world, as Jesus himself was going to be offered as the lamb of God to be killed for the sins of whole world. The woman comes with an expensive perfume alabaster jar. She breaks it and anoints the feet of Jesus. This also a significant gesture. which indicates the death of Jesus. None of the disciples, and those were around understood the importance of this women. Some of the men targeted her with criticism, but Jesus acknowledged her extraordinary act by stating, 'Truly I tell you wherever the gospel is preached through out the world, what she has done will also be told, in memory of her' (Vs 9 NIV).

HEALTH AND HYGIENE

Women were not having knowledge and awareness about the diseases and the importance of taking preventive measures and early treatment. They were not taking care of their own health as they were taking care of their children.

JESUS AND WOMEN

Every gospel speaks about Jesus and woman in many circumstances. Jesus demanded women's development. It was the age when women were not considered a human with values. Significance of Women's Day

In many countries, there is a holiday on this day; women are given leave in schools, colleges, and offices on this day. Clara Zetkin was the first to think about celebrating Women's Day internationally. Clara Zetkin first suggested celebrating International Women's Day in 1910 at an

International Conference of Working Women in Copenhagen. At that time, 100 women from 17 countries around the world were involved in the press conference. Everyone supported this suggestion and in 1910, Women's Day was given international status at the Copenhagen Conference of the Socialist

International.

At that time its main objective was to give women the right to vote because at that time women did not have the right, to vote in most countries. International Women's Day was first celebrated in 1911 in Switzerland, Austria, Denmark, and Germany, in 1917, the Soviet Union declared this day a national holiday. And it spread to other surrounding countries as well. It is now celebrated in many eastern countries as well, Why is International Women's Day celebrated only on March 8? Now the question arises: why and how was the day of March 8 chosen for International Women's Day from the last Sunday of February? In fact, Clara Zetkin, who brought the concept of International Women's Day, did not set any date to celebrate Women's Day, During the war in 1917, the women of Russia decided to go on strike for 'bread and peace',

This strike was also historic because the women's strike had forced Emperor Nicholas to leave his post there. After that, the interim government gave women the right to vote. At that time the Julian calendar followed

in Russia and the

Gregorian calendar

followed in the rest of

the world. The date on which the women started this strike was 23rd February. This

day was March 8 in the Gregorian calendar (according to the Julian calendar of Russia). At that time, the Gregorian calendar runs all over the world.

Therefore, since then, International Women's Day started being celebrated on 8th March. This day is not just a day of celebration but also gives guidance to women in their own interest for the times

Now our children became doctors, engineers, advocates and IT Professionals and degree holders in many fields.

Now Villivakkam Corps constructing a new Prayer Hall-cum-Community Center. 
