n that cold night, the doors of all the houses and inns were closed against that man and that pregnant lady in Bethlehem. What on earth is as heavy as a locked door? Everywhere, every time somebody locks the door against some others. There is a story of such a locked door at the beginning of the Bible. Not only they were expelled, but also placed a Sword of Fire at the door to prevent anyone else from entering. What a horrible experience! Bethlehem, the place where the 'Word' Became 'Flesh'! Yes, this place gives us the invitation and responsibility to eat more this word. Because there is something in Jesus that can quench all man's inquiries and hunger. This is a time when human's words do not become flesh. We can eat more words as the distance between words and reality increases- yes, Bethlehem compels us to meditate more on this Word.

It's a place that teaches us how to live happily in our limitations. When all the doors of the inn are locked against a man and his wife, they seek refuge in a manger. When people think there is no way to move forward, when tragedies come, when it seems to no longer exist, they tell 'my door is closed'. But He became the door of happiness, peace, friendship, hope and love to many those who found refuge in him. Do bitter experiences have to make us more bitter? No! If there's a painful thing that has ever happened in my life, that's also came crossing this door! Yes, the peace, comfort, fearlessness and the protection that a door offers us is not a small thing. There can be many reasons to be afraid outside the door in this most depressing period of the century, but let's believe inside of this door we are safe.

The door which is locked in the Garden of Eden was opened in Bethlehem for every one of us. As in the first book, there is a hint in Revelation- the last book of Bible, one man is standing anxiously outside of a door asking permission to let in. No matter how much we stumble, how far we gone, how much broken we are, one day this door will have to be opened for Him. Bethlehem urges us to live simply beyond celebrations and decorations and to bring joy and beauty in ourselves

and others. Let's open the door for our Saviour Jesus who is the only reason for our Great Joy and Hope!

into this world and lived amongst us. It is wonderfully stated in John's Gospel, 'In the beginning was the Lord's servant. In such a hopeless life, this message comes alive for those who are willing to hear: "NOTHING IS IMPOSSIBLE WITH GOD".

God's promises are true. St. Luke gives us an account of that first Christmas when Mary was

> given a unique and unusual message of Jesus' birth. We find that in Luke 1:26-38. The promises of God proclaimed by the angel to Mary are very true for our lives, no matter whatever situation we may be facing at this time.

'FAVOURED', 'THE LORD IS WITH YOU', 'DO NOT BE AFRAID', are the words we read in verses 26 to 30. The good news is that, although this was specifically told to Mary at that first Christmas, it is relevant to those who are willing to seek God's will in their lives.

For me, favoured means: God has pleasure in me; His acceptance of me; choosing me for himself; having a greater plan for my life to join with him in blessing people around me. The Bible says, "For the Lord God is a sun and shield; the Lord bestows favor and honor. No good thing does he withhold from those who walk uprightly" (Psalm 84:11).

Jesus is called 'Immanuel' - God with us (Matthew 1:23). Jesus promised to be with us all the time; in good times and in times when things do not favour us. Jesus said, "Surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age" (Matthew 28:20).

If we trust in God, we need not fear. The word 'FEAR' appears in the Bible approximately 365 times. This is enough for us to go about our daily tasks with the promise of God. Fear is the weapon mainly used by Satan. Jesus sets us free from the bondage of sin and its fear. Having God's presence in our life, we can confidently face any situation without any fear. As King David said, we may also say, as we trust in God, "Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death I will fear no evil" (Psalm 23:4).

CHRISTMAS AND ITS RELEVANCE TO OUR PERSONAL LIVES

hristmas is about the word incarnation. We sing it every year ✓in our Christmas carols, especially "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing" in which a line says, "Veiled in flesh, the Godhead see; Hail the incarnate Deity." If we look at the word incarnation, we can understand what Christmas is about. The Apostles' Creed teaches the doctrine of the Incarnation when it says, "conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary." although we do not find the word incarnation straight. Famous preacher Reverend Spurgeon said, "The birth of Jesus is the grandest light of history, the sun in the heavens of all time. It is the pole star of human destiny, the hinge of chronology, the meeting place of the waters of the past and the future." The Incarnation is such a difficult and powerful doctrine that sometimes we drift away as Christians. We sometimes completely ignore it: We emphasize the crucifixion, resurrection, ascension, and the imminent return of Jesus. But we don't emphasize the Incarnation as much as we really should. In such scenario, how would we relate the Christmas to our present age? What is its significance in our personal lives?

When we deeply understand the scriptures and their message to us, we can understand the importance of Christmas, the Lord's arrival on the earth.

Revealing the Father

Revealing the Father is the number one focus of Jesus ministry. Jesus' vision is to bring Heaven to Earth. His mission is to seek and to save the lost. The method that Jesus employed to seek and to save the lost and to bring Heaven to Earth was always – to reveal the Father! The trinity operates as one, with one purpose and one heart they work together to accomplish their task of restoring to humanity an accurate image of who the Father is. In everything that

Jesus did, He was expressing the nature of the Father by demonstrating the will of the Father. Jesus gives perfect expression to the unseen hand of the Father, which is directing His every movement. Jesus gives perfect expression to the nature, character, and image of the Father. The Father is in Christ fully expressing Himself to the world. Everything that Jesus did was a perfect expression, a perfect reflection, and a perfect revelation of who our Father in Heaven truly is. If we have not yet experienced this divine truth, our faith must be questioned.

Redeeming the Mankind

To "redeem" means to buy back something that has been lost, sold or given away. Because of Birth Sin and our personal sins, we were slaves of the devil. But Jesus freed us, giving us the freedom of the children of God, for, by His Resurrection, He destroyed death and gave us the life of grace. Jesus Christ redeemed us by His Passion, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension. By sinning, man failed to love God, but Christ's work of redemption was an act of infinitely perfect love and obedience, which made up His whole life on earth. His infancy spent in Egypt and His thirty years at home in Nazareth were as much a part of our redemption as were the three years of His active life and His Death, His Death on the Cross was the climax of His earthly lifetime of obedience to the will of the Father.

Reconciling with God

Christ came to bring peace between God and mankind. This idea is marvellous! Christ's job was to restore harmony between us. What sin disrupted; Jesus restored. To do this, Christ entered the world with the fullness of God dwelling permanently in Him as part of His nature, not as something that was given to Him to help Him accomplish this task. He was fully God and yet willingly became fully man so He could usher in a contract of

peace for us. He became a delegate for both parties, the result was the reconciliation of all things, and this pleased the Father. "When you were dead in your sins and in the uncircumcision of your sinful nature, God made you alive with Christ. He forgave us all our sins, having cancelled the written code, with its regulations, that was against us and that stood opposed to us; he took it away, nailing it to the cross" (Colossians 2:13-14). Whatever separation existed between God and mankind before Christ, has been removed and nailed to the very cross that brought us peace. This image is a reminder that harmony has been restored.

The significance of Christmas is that Jesus, the Saviour is born to save the world from sin and as a result God established His Kingdom on earth. The fall of man in the book of Genesis is the foundation of Christmas. The fall of man into sin at the Garden of Eden necessitated the need for a Saviour to be born to deliver the world from sin. The birth of Jesus Christ brought about the Good News and that is why the Gospel is simply referred to as the GOOD NEWS.

May we realise and recognise this truth to live our lives believing in Jesus so as to receive the fruit of our utmost faith, the Heaven. Wishing everyone a Christ centred Christmas!

A Promise of Redemption

After man disobeyed God in the Garden of Eden, God gave his promise that he would provide a redeemer. That redeemer was his Son. As our doctrine says that we all are depraved because of disobedience which is a result of sin. We also reminded in the scriptures "For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God" Romans 3:23, and we need to be redeemed. This incarnation of Christ brought redemption through his blood and brought us the gift of salvation. Redemption is used in both the Old and New Testaments of the Bible. In the Old Testament, redemption involves deliverance from bondage based on the payment of a price by a redeemer. Fundamental to the message of the New Testament is the announcement that Jesus of Nazareth is the fulfilment of Israel's messianic hope and that, in him, the longawaited redemption has arrived. Deliverance of humankind from its state of alienation from God has been accomplished through the death and resurrection of Christ. In the New Testament, redemption requires the payment of a price, but the plight that requires such a ransom is moral, not material. Humankind is held in the captivity of sin from which only the atoning death of Jesus Christ can liberate. Let this Christmas season be a reminder that we need redemption on a day-to-day basis, from our short falls, depravity and sinful nature.

A Promise of Eternal Life.

It was God's unconditional love that no human must perish. As promised, he

brought his begotten son to bring us eternal life. Death should not be the final destination, and God wanted that His images must be with him eternally on a everlasting manner. So this Christmas promise brought eternal life to people who believe in Jesus. "And this is the promise God has promised us, even ETERNAL LIFE!" (1 John 2:25 NKJV). Apostle Paul states, "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 6:23). In this verse, the Greek word for gift is charisma. Charisma means a gift of grace, an undeserved favour. Thus, eternal life is not something we deserve or earn. Eternal life is an undeserved gift of God's grace and favour. "In spite of your sanctification as Christians, still you will not have earned eternal life; it is the gift of God's grace". Jesus said, "My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me; and I give eternal life to them, and they will never perish; and no one will snatch them out of My hand" (John 10:27-28). For the believer, eternal life begins in the present, and now. Jesus described eternal life in the present tense. Thus, eternal life is not just in the future, but is a present possession of the believer which continues. When we think about Christmas, we must also think about our life on the earth and beyond the earth. There is a promise of eternal life, but there is a condition too. This Christmas allows us to think to set our minds on this promise to be fulfilled in our lives.

As we pass through this festive season, may I request each one of the readers to recollect these promises and check whether you are fit to God's promises that might be fulfilled in your personal life? May this Christmas fulfil God's promise in your life resulting you to be his dear child. Once again, I wish you all a happy Christmas and blessed new Year.

believe that there will be no Christian who do not know and sing the hymn - O, Come, Let Us Adore Him. It is a well-known song during the Christmas times. This hymn is a call for God's faithful, joyous people to contemplate the "King of Angels" in Bethlehem's manger. The first verse puts out the invitation.

"O come, all ye faithful, joyful and triumphant!

O come ye, O come ye to Bethlehem.

When we sing "O, Come, All Ye Faithful," we are reaffirming that the baby in Bethlehem's manger is indeed God in human flesh, Christ the Lord.

It came in my mind what would have been the thoughts of the authors originally written in Latin as Andesite Fiddles by John Francis Wade, John Reading, King John IV of Portugal and anonymous Cistercian monks. As a Christian and an officer, I sing this song and many times wanted to understand its deeper truth. As I explained, it is invitation encouraging the people to come and adore. What does it mean to adore? The dictionary meaning is to worship. For many Christians, worship is what we do on Sunday morning. Singing a few songs, listening to a preaching, sharing communion, and doing whatever else is scheduled for the Sunday morning meeting time. Why worship God? For some people, the answer is because it's what they grew up with. It's just what they do. Worship is bowing before our superior, in this case, God. I want to encourage through this article, the need for our adoration towards Lord Jesus.

Adore Jesus for his 'Divinity'

We strongly believe and affirm that Jesus is truly and properly God, which is also in our articles of our faith. The Christian faith would not exist if Jesus was simply a great moral teacher or prophet. Everything about the Christian faith rests on the divinity of Jesus, hence its importance for Christian faith, life and practice. The Bible provides compelling evidence of Jesus' divinity. We see in the Gospels that "were written within living memory of the events they recount." Matthew identifies Jesus as Emmanuel, which means "God with us". Emmanuel describes the concept of the incarnation—God becoming

man. The identity of Jesus as "God with us" is consistent with John 1:1, which refers to Jesus as the "Word who was with God, and who was God". The mind-wrenching reality John tells his readers is that this God— the God who is the Word—became flesh. It is more important to understand the self-revelation of God in John 1 is God becoming flesh. These facts show the need for us to adore him.

Adore Jesus for his 'Supremacy'

The supremacy of Christ is a doctrine surrounding the authority of Jesus and His God-nature. In the simplest of terms, to affirm the supremacy of Christ is to affirm that Jesus is God. To speak of "supremacy" is to speak of that which is "above" or "over" others. It reaches the level of the "Super." In our language it refers to that which is greatest in power, authority, or rank. It is also used to describe that which is greatest in importance, significance, character, or achievement — the "ultimate." In all these areas of consideration, Jesus ranks as the ultimate or supreme supreme in power, rank, glory, authority, importance, etc. The supremacy of Jesus teaches us that He is not simply a spiritual being above the rest. St. Paul tells us that through Him all things visible and invisible, in heaven and on earth, i.e., spiritual, and physical, were created. Hebrews 1:4 tells Jesus is superior to the angels. This truth negates any tendencies toward angel worship. Jesus created the angels and is above them. We are explicitly told He is greater than them. Therefore, we need only adoring Jesus.

Adore Jesus for his 'Humanity'

If there is anything of which modern Christians have been certain it is that Jesus was a true man, bone of our bone, flesh of our flesh, in all points tempted as we are. We need only read the Gospels to attest to the fact of Jesus' genuine humanity. To emphasize the deity of Christ in no way diminishes his humanity, and to highlight his humanity in no way detracts from his deity. The properties of each nature retain their own integrity even in their union in the singular person of the Son.

The humanity that Christ assumed was complete; he took to himself all that it means to be human—body, soul, mind, and will—with only sin excepted. Jesus's humanity is evident from the following considerations in the New Testament. His humanity is apparent throughout the "whole course" of his obedience. His conception, birth, development, limitations, suffering, death, burial, resurrection, ascension, ongoing priestly work, and final return give powerful testimony to the genuine humanity of Christ.

Adore Jesus for his 'Humility'

In all the Scriptures we will find no greater insight than that which pertains to Jesus, the ultimate example of humility. Before He came to earth as a man, Jesus had existed throughout eternity past as deity, the eternal Son of God. Although He would of necessity exist endlessly as God He did not go about independently exercising His Godhood: "but made Himself of no reputation." Instead of manifesting all of His innate glory, He functioned as any human slave would: "taking the form of a servant and coming in the likeness of men." During His earthly ministry, He Himself would emphasize His servanthood role. "The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many" (Matthew 20:28). In His majestic salvation mission, Jesus, the Son of God, would voluntarily accept the path of humility. "He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross." Jesus' humility is an expression of his Holiness. We must inherit that our hearts must be captivated by the beauty of holiness which is evident in the humility of the Lord Jesus Christ.

As we celebrate another Christmas in our lives, the true call of adoring Jesus must be practiced and trained, in order for us to move in our day-to-day spiritual journey. Our focus on Jesus will help us to reach our destination. Let our adoration and exaltation be acceptable in the sight of the living God. Wishing all the readers a Happy Christmas, full of divine blessings!

THREE WISE WOMEN OF THE CHRISTMAS

ou may certainly be wondered when you first look at the title of this article, pointing yourselves to the wise men who came to see Jesus from the East. The women I speak here are not those eastern wise, but or more significant than them. Women are crucial figures in the history of Christianity. And if it wasn't for the faith and obedience of women, the divine message of Christmas may never have been told. The way Jesus is introduced to us is different in every Gospel story. With regard to the women, it is only Luke's Gospel that tells us about the moment Mary found out about God's plan for her to carry the infant Jesus. Luke goes into extensive detail about Mary's conversation with the angel Gabriel, and especially about her visit with Elizabeth, as both women awaited the birth of their sons. Later he singles out Anna, an aged prophetess who witnessed Jesus being presented at the temple. It is impossible to tell the story of Jesus without acknowledging the women involved in the first Christmas, who carried the promise and presence of God into the world.

Mary-the Woman of Sacrifice

Mary appears by name in the Synoptic Gospels and in the book of Acts. Luke contains the most references to Mary and places the greatest emphasis on her role in God's plan, Fearful and troubled, Mary found herself in the presence of the angel Gabriel listening to the divine announcement. She could never have expected to hear the most incredible news—that she would have a child, and her son would be the Messiah. Although she could not comprehend how she would conceive the Savior, she responded to God with humble belief and obedience. Although Mary's calling held great honor, it would demand great suffering too. There would be pain in childbirth and motherhood, as well as in the privilege of being the mother of the Messiah.

Mary was willing to submit her life to God's plan no matter what it would cost her. Obedience to the Lord's will meant Mary would be disgraced as an unwed mother. Mary may not have considered the full extent of her future suffering. She may not

have imagined the pain of watching her beloved child bear the weight of sin and die a terrible death on the cross. But surely, she knew that her life would hold many sacrifices as the mother of the Messiah. Being chosen by God for a high calling requires total commitment and a willingness to sacrifice everything out of love and devotion to the Saviour. We must realise that walking with Jesus means walking down some scary paths. And it almost always requires some form of sacrifice—even when that sacrifice is simply giving up on the expectations we may have been carrying.

Elizabeth- the Woman of Servanthood

Elizabeth, a descendant of Aaron, was selected by God to be the mother of John the Baptist, the great prophet who would prepare the way before Jesus Christ. Elizabeth, the mother of John the Baptist, appears in only one chapter in the Bible—Luke 1. Her reputation as a woman who was barren changed to one who had a miraculous birth in old age. Elizabeth expressed her appreciation for God's blessing: "Thus the Lord has dealt with me, in the days when He looked on me, to take away my reproach among people" (Luke 1:25). Mary and Elizabeth were able to comfort and encourage each other during their pregnancies. For three months, during Elizabeth and Mary's pregnancy, the two women spent their time together. We don't know what they talked about or what they did together, but we do know that they were there for us.

God has a way of putting people in our lives at just the time we need them. The name Elizabeth means "God keeps his oaths".

When Elizabeth went years without conceiving, she had no idea that in her twilight years, God would keep His promises to her. God has given Elizabeth the gift of discernment and prophecy and allowed her the privilege of being the first person to recognise that Jesus is indeed 'the Lord'. God took Elizabeth from out of her shadows and used her.

Anna- the Woman of Persistent Faith

Anna was an old prophetess who, with Simeon, greets the new-born Jesus as he was presented at the temple. Despite living under the shadow of age and isolation, Anna was deeply committed to God to the extent that she was a permanent resident in the temple, worshipping, fasting and praying. She chose to share her faith to as many people as she could. She chose to serve the Lord. She chose to fast and pray, worshiping the Lord Day and night. She chose to tell them the news of the Saviour that was coming, no matter how long it might be before he came. She knew her purpose and she didn't let anyone's opinions or comments keep her from it. Anna's choice would not only affect her life in an abundant way, but also the lives of others ever since.

As a prophetess, we could imagine Anna enjoying God's presence every single day. While Israel was weary and looking for its redemption, Anna had hope knowing full well that God sent already His promised Saviour - His only begotten Son. And this she knew because of her intimate relationship with God. Her life was a living testimony that proves anyone of any age can serve God. Age is not an issue with God; He is the Alpha and the Omega. What matters is that we obey Him.

All three of these women carried inside of them the promise of their saviour, the Messiah. The Christmas women all spent time in the presence of God so, when God's promises were present in their lives, they immediately recognized them. woman's life in the Christmas story affected people around them as they pointed the world to Christ. These three believed in the promises of God and trusted in God's timing. We must be like the Christmas Women and carry inside of us the promise and the presence of God. We need our lives to affect others, so they look to Christ, to live out a strong faith, believing in His promises with a confident trust in His timing to fulfil them. "Silent Night"! Holy Nighthis is the Story......


ogether with Joseph Mohr, a Catholic priest who wrote the original German lyrics, Gruber composed the music for the Christmas carol Silent Night. On Christmas Eve of 1818, Mohr, an assistant pastor at St Nicholas, showed Gruber a sixstanza poem he had written in 1816. He asked Gruber to set the poem to music. The church organ had broken down, so Gruber produced a melody with guitar arrangement for the poem. The two men sang Stille Nacht for the first time at Christmas Mass in St Nicholas Church while Mohr played guitar and the choir repeated the last two lines of each verse. For a long time, many thought that Silent Night was written by Haydn, Mozart or Beethoven. In later years, Gruber composed additional arrangements of the carol for organ and for organ with orchestra, as well as scores of other carols and masses, many of which are still in print and sung today in Austrian churches.





Hintersee, and in 1837 of the Alpine village of Wagrain. Here he created a fund to allow children from poor families to attend school and set up a system for the care of the elderly. Mohr died of respiratory disease on 4 December 1848, at the age of 55 Legacy.

Mohr's final resting place is in the tiny Alpine ski resort of Wagrain, where he died in 1848. The Joseph Mohr School stands as a fitting memorial, and close to the grave of the man who wrote the words heard around the world. The village school is named after him, and his grave has been kept in a place of honour in the nearby churchyard cemetery. An outdoor exhibit detailing the life of Joseph Mohr is situated on the walkway between the church and the parish house where he once lived. In 2006, the town's Waggerl Museum set up a permanent exhibit – Joseph Mohr – Vicar of Wagrain.

In Austria, Stille Nacht is considered a national treasure. Traditionally, the song may not be played publicly before Christmas Eve.

Until 2006, it was thought that Mohr and Gruber had collaborated on just one composition, but another was located in the Wagrain parish archive by the Salzburg Archdiocesan authorities. The "Te Deum" with text by Joseph Mohr and melody by Franz Xaver Gruber can be heard in an audio exhibit at the Waggerl

Breast Diseases and Early Detection of Breast Cancer

mastitis seen in a breast feeding mother. Tuberculosis can cause chronic abscess. A dilated milk duct (duct ectasia) can cause pain, infection or nipple discharge.

he reasons why one should know about the breast diseases in that

- 1. Breast cancer is the most common cancer in women
- 2. Most common cause of cancer death in
- 3. More than 6 million people affected every year.
- 4. Young onset CA breast is on the rise.
- 5. Life time prevalence in CA breast is 1/28.
- 6. Kerala, Tamil Nadu and Delhi have highest incidence of breast cancer. The global incidence of breast cancer is 14% of all cancers. Breast or Mammary gland is a modified sweat gland. Present in both males and females which enlarges in response to ovarian estrogen and progesterone.

The most common Breast Complaints are:

Mass /lump

Skin or Nipple changes

Nipple Discharge85% of breast conditions are benign or harmless. That means only 10 - 15% of the cases are malignant or cancers.

Causes of Breast Pain

- 1. Cyclical associated with menstruation,
- 2. Peri-menopausal or hormone replacement therapy
- 3. Weight gain, excess caffeine intake, lack of support
- 4. Infections breast abscess or causes unrelated to breast like cardiac pain, acidity, muscle or bone pain and anxiety.

FIBROADENOMA

Fibroadenoma is a most common benign lump in the breast seen between the ages of 15 and 25 years. Only the large lumps need be excised. Breast Cancer Most common cancer in females more seen in developed, western countries. Median age of occurrence is 47 years. 2-5% of cases runs in families. Some genetic mutations increases the risk of breast carcinoma. Other conditions that have high-risk of breast cancer are:

- 1. Diet low with phytoestrogens and high alcohol intake.
- 2. Infertile woman.
- 3. Attaining early menarche and late menopause
- 4. Previous therapeutic radiation (thoracic) may predispose carcinoma breast especially when RT is given at younger age mainly for Hodgkin's lymphoma.
- 5. Oral contraceptive pills and hormone replacement therapy (HRT) for more than 5 years.

Conditions that lower the risk of cancer breast are:

- 1. Early child-bearing and breastfeeding
- 2. Early 1st child birth
- 3. Vitamin C and regular exercise.

Breast cancer clinically present as

- 1. Breast lump
- 2. Dimpling skin
- 3. Retraction of nipple.
- 4. Ulceration, discharge from the nipple and areola.
- 5. Skin ulceration and fungation. How to diagnose?One with a suspicion of breast

lump or breast cancer should consult a doctor. Method used for a diagnosis is tripple assessment which include clinical evaluation and investigations. Common investigations used are ultrasonogram or mammogram and tissue sampling by cytology (FNAC) or pathology (BIOPSY). A very small needle is used for FNAC part of the lump or whole lump is excised for biopsy. If the diagnosis comes as breast cancer by this tripple assessment the next step is staging of the disease. For which further investigations are being done. Treatment and outcome depends upon exact staging of the disease. Early breast cancers can be effectively treated with breast conservative surgery. In late stages breast has to be removed completely. Other methods of treatment are radio therapy and chemo therapy. Breast conservative surgery is superior since it has psychological advantage with breast preservation. Breast reconstructive surgeries are also done in good oncological centres. Also monthly breast self examination and early detection of cancer helps in breast preservative/conservative surgeries and give good aesthetic outcome. Remember prevention is better than cure.

We all have a memory of some child among our family or friends asking so many questions. This happens especially with growing kids & sometimes it is... well, annoying.
