BIBLICAL FOUNDATION OF SOCIAL JUSTICE

Let's take a look at the Biblical foundation of Social Justice!

The Salvation Army is committed to social justice because it is foundational to the character of God, as ascribed by the Psalmist: 'Righteousness and justice are the foundations of your throne.' (Psalm 89)

The writings of the Old Testament have a repeated theme to care for the outcast, marginalised and powerless. We frequently read to care for 'the orphan, the alien and the widow.' (Psalm 146:9)

In fact, this Hebrew bedrock, exemplified in the prophets, insists on the dignity of the poor, and commands us to resist any temptation to view the powerless and marginalised as beneath us or somehow different from ourselves.


In the New Testament, with the coming of Jesus a new day dawns and we see justice now lived out on the margins of society. This is a major shift: from theory to practice.

Jesus does not deviate from the Hebrew Scriptures, and personally tends and cares for the very same kind of vulnerable people that God cares for in the Old Testament.

From the Desk of the Directors (cont'd.)

We find an early pattern in the gospel of Luke where, in rapid succession, Jesus cares for a leper, a paralytic, a widow, and the sick and demonized (Luke 5-7). Luke is sending a clear message. Jesus has a focus – the people living on the margins of society, the outsiders, isolated from community.

Biblical justice is a powerful force that goes much further than mere human activity and a desire for equal opportunity. It includes ultimate resolution beyond life on this earth and inspires justice champions when all seems otherwise despairing and overwhelming.

Foundational Biblical justice, exemplifying the character of God, bellowed by the prophets, personified in Christ and promised in eternity gives us grounds for lively confidence and counter-intuitive optimism.

Biblical justice is our unshakeable, unbreakable, immovable foundation.
