Mary Magdalene is one among them from whom the Lord had cast seven demons. Really, she was a person of high calibre and also extremely happy and grateful to the Lord for healing her. The Bible tells that on 'first day of the week' Mary and other women came to the tomb. 'When was the sabbath day changed?' We hear this question very often by the people who observe Saturday as the day of rest and worship. It was changed when Christ arose from the dead. The Gospel writers emphasizes that it was the first day of the week when Jesus arose from the dead. Jesus was dead during the sabbath day; He became alive on Sunday. From that time on, believers have been gathering together on the first day of the week. Pentecost also occurred on Sunday, the first day of the week!

At this point, we cannot forget Mary, mother of Jesus, who was informed by the angel even before the birth of Jesus that 'a sword will pass through your soul' kept that truth in her heart and stood courageously beside that cross with tears and prayers for her son. Worth remembering is the courage of Pilate's wife, who gave her husband a timely message 'not to interfere with the righteous man' despite the thought of losing their authority. It is very amazing that the women who witnessed and faithfully followed Christ in his ministry, crucifixion and burial were also able to witness his resurrection!

Even though Mary and other women went to the tomb, they had no hope to receive the Risen Jesus. His beloved disciples, John and Peter also had no expectation to find Jesus alive when they rushed to the tomb. But the joy that Mary and the disciples filled when the risen Lord appeared to them was indescribable! – They exulted "He is not Here...He is Risen!"

Several of the main characters in the crucifixion and resurrection story of Jesus did not agree about much of anything, but they did agree about this: the story of Jesus was over.

Pontius Pilate believed he was the final word on all things that happened in his region. It was a troubled part of the Roman world but, despite the challenging situation, Pilate was accustomed to having unquestioned authority. If he decided an innocent man needed to die to keep the peace, so be it. He handed Jesus over to be crucified, and the oft-practised theatre of killing on a cross was performed on his orders. Later, after hearing of Jesus' death, Pilate issued his final instructions to the religious leaders. 'Take a guard,' Pilate answered. 'Go, make the tomb as secure as you know how' (Matthew 27:65). There was essentially a triple lock on Jesus' tomb: a large stone was rolled in front, an official seal served as a powerful warning and armed guards watched to ensure that no one interfered. Pilate was certain that he was the final authority on the story of Jesus.

Mary, mother of Jesus, understood the anguish of seeing a loved one suffer. She watched as opposition to Jesus grew, and she would have worried day after day that something terrible would happen. Eventually, the powerful enemies of Jesus moved against him. Following his arrest, rumours probably circulated about the beatings, the torture and the humiliation he was enduring. She would have felt so helpless, so broken to know that her son was experiencing such pain. Mary would have given her own life to save his, but that was not possible. The best his mother could do was to stand close by until the bitter end, not wanting him to face those final painful moments alone. She was there, near the Cross, as Jesus took his last breath (John 19:25). Filled with despair, Mary was certain that his excruciating death was the final

chapter of the story of Jesus.

Peter knew his ministry was over and, in truth, he knew it deserved to be. After all, he had denied Jesus, not once, not twice, but three times. Right when Jesus needed him the most, he had failed miserably. After the cock crowed, and Peter remembered Jesus' words - that before the cock crows, Peter would disown Jesus three times - he bowed his head in defeat and wept bitterly (Matthew 26:75). Peter had never known utter despair like this. Despite promising his friend and rabbi that even if others denied him, he never would, it had taken only a persistent servant girl to make him unravel and fall apart. In denying Jesus, Peter had lost the ministry that had become his life and joy over the past three years. With his friend's public death on the Cross, combined with his own repeated denial of being one of his disciples, Peter believed his part in the story of Jesus was now over.

But the story of Jesus was not over. They each forgot one very important thing: God always has the final word.

On that first Easter morning, when everyone assumed that the whole story of Jesus had already been written, the heavenly father wrote the most powerful chapter yet. The large stone was rolled away, the seal was broken and the guards were overcome with fear (Matthew 28:2-4). This all demonstrated that no people or power on earth can prevent God from having the final word. Jesus was risen, alive again, and because of that powerful truth,

everything had changed. Pilate and the circumstances he dictated did not have final authority over God's Son or his followers. Mary was able to see her son's death not as the end, but as part of the continuing story of God's compelling grace for humankind. And in the days that followed, Peter discovered that his post-denial ministry would be even greater than he dared hope or imagine (John 21:15-19).

Perhaps you are facing challenging situations in your life right now. Be assured of this: God will have the final word, and no enemy or circumstance can stand against the word of our Almighty God.

Perhaps someone you love is suffering deeply, and you feel inadequate to relieve their pain or heal their hurt. Remember, God will have the final word, and that word will be filled with grace, and hope, and ultimate victory.

Perhaps, like Peter, you no longer feel worthy to be used by God. Possibly at one time you abandoned him and are convinced he has now abandoned you. Be certain of this: God will have the final word, and it will be a powerful word of restoration and renewal. And who knows? Perhaps, like Peter, you will discover your most impactful ministry is yet to come.

My prayer for you, and for the whole of The Salvation Army, is that this Easter will proclaim anew that the story of Jesus is not over, and that God always has the final, victorious word. It will be a triumphant word that reminds us that God is greater than any foe that stands against him.

It will be a powerful word of grace and hope for the broken-hearted and hurting. And it will be a restorative word, reminding us that no sin is greater than his redeeming grace.

God will have the final word, and it will be a word of victory!

The Cross of Jesus and Me....

he very first job that I had to do on my return to India as I retire from active service of officership, is to help my grandchildren in their studies. I enjoy doing so, for it helps me to understand them better. Shanaya attends Catharism class in her School. She is preparing her test paper on religion. Beside other questions, she could be asked on 'Stations of the cross' (according to the Roman Catholic Teaching). While I was helping her, I realised why she thinks that the 14 stations would be surely one of the questions she will be asked, because the Christian around the world are observing forty days of lent.

The events around Jesus' death on the cross is the central of the fasting and prayers in church congregations, which are not only observed in RC church but many churches. In many of the Salvation Army Corps, special bible studies, fellowships and various activities take place during lent leading to Good Friday and celebration of Jesus resurrection on Easter Sunday.

In many of the Salvation Army Corps, there is tradition to have three hours worship and meditate seven saying of Jesus on the cross. In the lives of those, who truly encounter the resurrected Christ in their lives, the cross remains centre of their witness, its importance is beyond any Christian traditions, for it becomes their lives. If such is person you are, then you would also relate yourself with me to the Cross of Jesus in everyday life, living witnesses of how God has loved us in Jesus Christ our Savior.

The Cross of Jesus for me is God's fulfilled promise of his everlasting Love for me. At the very moment, we know and experience this truth and confess our sin and ask Jesus to come into our lives, this promise of God becomes true reality. God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life (John 3: 16). When we encounter this truth, the cross no more remains a history or religious symbol, but becomes reality of our lives, and it only become so, when in faith we claim God's promise in faith and sincere prayer. God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us (Romans 5: 8). Friends do not let your souls wonder in darkness of sin but claim on the promise of God for your salvation. Bible tells us, 'If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness' (1 John 1:8-9).

The Cross of Jesus for me is to know God's amazing grace that is made available for me. My salvation is completely free. Our good deeds or any religious ritual is not enough to save us from sins. Jesus had paid the price by giving himself to take away our punishment. Bible gives us that assurance on which we can claim. For you know that it was not with perishable things such as silver or gold hat you were redeemed from the empty way of life handed down to you from your ancestors, but with the precious blood of Christ, a lamb without blemish of defect (1 Peter 1: 18 - 19 NIV). This way, God has shown his enduring grace to those who seek him. No human endeavours can make us holy or take away our sins, it is purely and wholly God's act of grace towards us. Saint Paul describes this way, 'For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast.' (Ephesians 2: 8-9 NIV).

Anyone can excess to this grace by faith in Jesus, and not by your own doing. We all need God's grace to walk uprightly in this new sanctified life. We no more live on our own strength but live by God's grace. It is my experience as well as many God's people. As Saint Paul explains how God answered his prayer, as God assured him that God's grace is sufficient, even when he is weak (2 Corinthians 12;9-10).

The Cross of Jesus assured us complete freedom and victory over sin. On the cross every kind of sin was nailed down and was put to the end. The cross though became emblem of suffering and shame for which the lamb of God was slain, becomes victory for me and you. As Isaiah prophesised about Jesus' sacrifice on the cross, 'He was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed. We all like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all.' (Isaiah 53: 5 -6 NIV). If you are struggling to live a victorious life, then you need to turn to Jesus and claim and cling to victory he has won for us. God has given us victory through our Lord Jesus Christ that should give us power be



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steadfast, immovable, always abounding living and serving him knowing that whatever we do is never go in vain (Read 1 Corinthians 15: 57 – 58).

Moreover, Jesus our Lord calls us to take up our cross and follow him. He said, 'Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me.' (Matthew 16:24). God loved us in giving his only Son on the cross: Jesus fulfilling that promise and gave his life to die on the cross, sanctifies our life as we seek forgiveness of our sins. He gives us full access to God's grace, and he make us live a victorious life. But he also calls us to bear our cross and follow him. y greetings to you as we recognise and celebrate Easter 2024!

The Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead was a reality. When God raised Jesus from the dead. He gave new life. We observe Easter as a mark of resurrection of the Lord from the death. The resurrection of Jesus is unique, even within the context of many other claimed miracles about Jesus. Indeed, it is foundational to the Christian faith.

While we observe and enjoy the fruits of the resurrection, it is also important for us to know the meaning of Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Resurrection of Jesus Christ is giving Hope, Resurrection of Jesus Christ is giving Power, Resurrection of Jesus Christ is giving courage to introduce Jesus (sharing the good news to the people)

Resurrection - Hope

As we are celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ it is giving the hope of immortality. Because Jesus Christ was raised from the dead, we who trust Him and have the same hope for ourselves. Resurrection changes our sorrows to joy, our sickness to health, weakness to strength, fear to courage, hopelessness to hope. The hope of forgiveness, the hope of peace, the hope of assurance, the hope of heaven and that hope is centered in the person – Jesus Christ. In John 11:25, Jesus said "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die. Jesus raised 3 people from the dead during his earthly ministries: Lazarus, the daughter of Jairus and the son of the widow at Nain. These 3 were rosed to die again but Jesus was not. These 3 they get back their earthly body but Jesus resurrected.

The empty tomb and empty cross give us the hope that Jesus resurrected for you and me. Jesus is the hope of hopeless. If there was ever a day that gives us hope, it is resurrection Sunday! In fact, that's why the church gathers week by week on Sunday. Through the resurrection the Sabbath becomes the Lord's Day (Worship Day) It became the day of worship to celebrate and commemorate the resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ!

Resurrection - Power

Resurrection power is the work of God in the life to come that reaches into our present and brings us into a union with Him. The announcements that the angles gave the women who came to the tomb, was that Jesus has risen. The message Jesus gave the two disciples on the way to Emmaus was that He

We no longer look for Jesus Christ among the dead. He has risen from the dead. The message to the apostles and to Thomas was that He has risen! And Jesus appearing to Mary was declaring that He had risen! And lastly saw Him ascending into heaven. Jesus died to forgive our sins and arose to make us righteous people. (Romans 4:25)

And the message that God gives to us is that Jesus has risen! 1 Corinthians 15:20 What does the resurrection mean to you? We have to live resurrected life, new life. God has accepted sacrifice of Jesus Christ that He given for us. The power of Resurrection is the power that keeps the things and people alive. It is the power that makes whatever is dying to come back to life. It is amazing power of God that gives hope to hopeless situations and makes the impossible possible. We need the power of God to truly love one another and forgive as we have been forgiven.


The redemption of Jesus Christ is not happening accidentally. It is well planned. It is prophesied. Declared and preinformation. It happened JUST AS HE SAID.

n the busy schedules of our modern lives every moment is filled with noise and chaos. In such times the the concept of "PAUSE" holds a profound significance for Christians seeking to deepen their relationship with God. To pause is more than a temporary break or momentary cessation; it is a deliberate, intentional stop amidst the chaotic rhythm of life. In the context of the Christian life, the act of pausing is not just a break from the routine; rather, it is a deliberate and sacred moment of introspection, communion, and spiritual renewal. As we journey through the season of Lent, it is my intention to explore the significance of the pause, how it can draw us closer to God, and its transformative power in our spiritual development.

Understanding "Pause" in a Christian Context:

The idea of pausing finds its roots in the Bible, where God often calls His people to stop, reflect, and connect with Him. In Psalm 46:10, the Lord declares, "Be still, and know that I am God." This divine call to stillness, to pause, invites believers to step back from the constant noise of the world and focus on the presence of the Almighty.

The word "pause" in the Christian sense is not a mere cessation of activity but a purposeful break to redirect our attention to God. It involves a conscious effort to disengage from the worldly distractions that hinder our spiritual growth and listen to the whispers of the Holy Spirit. As we embrace this sacred pause, we open our hearts to God's guidance, wisdom, and transformative power.

• Pausing for Intimacy with God:

Intimacy with God is at the heart of the Christian journey. Just as a married couple needs quiet moments together to nurture their

relationship, believers need to pause and create sacred spaces for intimacy with God. This pause is an invitation to enter into the secret place of the Most High, as described in Psalm 91:1: "He who dwells in the secret place of the Most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty."

During Lent, Christians are encouraged to intensify their search of intimacy with God through prayer, fasting, and reflection on Scripture. The Gospel accounts reveal that Jesus often withdrew to solitary places to pray (Luke 5:16). In the midst of His demanding ministry, Jesus understood the importance of pausing to commune with the Father. His example encourages us to prioritize moments of solitude and prayer, especially during seasons like Lent.

These intentional pauses allow us to draw near to God, seeking His face and surrendering our burdens at His feet. In Matthew 6:6, Jesus teaches about the value of private prayer: "But when you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you."

· Pausing for Spiritual Reflection:

The season of Lent provides a unique opportunity for believers to engage in spiritual reflection, examining their lives in light of God's Word. This reflective pause involves taking stock of our actions, attitudes, and priorities, aligning them with the teachings of Christ. In Luke 10:38-42, we encounter the story of Mary and Martha. Martha is busy with many tasks, while Mary sits at the feet of Jesus, listening. Jesus commends Mary for choosing what is better. This narrative emphasizes the significance of pausing to be present with God, prioritizing the relationship over busyness.

In 2 Corinthians 13:5, the Apostle Paul urges believers to "examine yourselves to see whether you are in the faith; test yourselves." Lent serves as a designated period for this self-examination, a time to assess our spiritual journey, repent of sins, and realign our lives with God's will. By pausing to reflect, we can identify areas of growth and transformation needed in our lives.

· Pausing for Transformation:

The pause in the Christian life is also a powerful catalyst for transformation. In Romans 12:2, Paul encourages believers, "Do not conform to the pattern of this world but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will."

As we intentionally pause during Lent, we create space for God to renew our minds and transform our hearts. The disciplines of prayer, fasting, and meditation on Scripture allow the Holy Spirit to work within us, shaping us into the image of Christ. This transformative pause is not a one-time event but a continual process of becoming more like Jesus in our thoughts, words, and actions.

As we journey through the season of Lent, why can't we take an opportunity to this sacred pause as a gift from God. In the midst of our fast-paced lives, intentional pauses for intimacy, reflection, and transformation draw us closer to the heart of God. Through prayer, fasting, and meditation on Scripture, we create space for the Holy Spirit to work in us, shaping us into the likeness of Christ. May this season be a time of profound pause, leading to a deeper understanding of God's love and a more vibrant spiritual life.

WHEN CHRIST DIED?

shifted in the spiritual realm.

I would like to point out three things that happened in the spiritual realm that changed the human race forever!

1) The Torn Veil: The veil held significant value to the Jewish community, especially for the Pharisees because in earlier times only the High Priest was allowed to enter the sacred space (Holy of Holies) that too once a year to atone through a sacrificial lamb. This was the same temple which Solomon had built to worship God, which also once was the dwelling place of the Ark of the Covenant, But when Jesus died and took His last breath on earth, there was an earthquake and the veil was torn in half from the top, signifying that the sacred space of God where His Spirit dwelt was now available to everyone. This also means that God - The Father now was able to justify every sinner as righteous, from past, present and future who would repent and believe that Jesus died for their sins. Because now the sacrifice has already been made. This also signifies that God's character was still intact while also saving the condemned creation at the same time. The accuser had realized that he disgracefully failed (Colossians 2:15) and has been defeated (Revelation 12:10)

2) Dead rose from the grave: This event played a magnificent role in proclaiming life after death to the Pharisees and Sadducees

who rejected Jesus who claimed "I am the way, the truth and the Life". In the Gospel of Matthew ch 57:51-53 it says "At that moment the veil of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. The earth quaked and the rocks were split. The tombs broke open, and the bodies of many saints who had fallen asleep were raised. After Jesus' resurrection, when they had come out of the tombs, they entered the holy city and appeared to many people.

It is important to note that these people came out of the tombs only after Jesus' resurrection on the third day and why not at the earthquake. There is a wonderful explanation to this which we will see below.

3) The mystery of the Jesus' Three days in the tomb: There are two passages in the bible that speak of this. 1 peter 3:18-20, explains one reason, which is proclaiming to the spirits in prison, these are the spirits of rebellious angels who disobeyed God and took daughters of men as wives during the times of Noah, mentioned in Gen 6. They are imprisoned there 2 Peter 2:4 records this. The reason Jesus went there according to 1 peter 3:18-20 is because He displayed his victory to them and condemned them for their ways.

Another passage mentioning this is in Ephesians 4:7-10 which mentions that Jesus went down and took captives with him when he ascended high in heaven, This signifies the ultimate resurrection of Old testament believers of God who knew Yahweh -God of Israel but did not know Jesus. When Jesus proclaimed to the evil spirits He also preached to the Old Testament believers and since Jesus is the only way to Heaven, they witnessed the prophesied messiah in Abraham's bosom and Jesus took them up in heaven and this is why Jesus foreshadowing the thief's death said today you will be with me in Paradise! Revelation 1:18 says Jesus holds the keys of Death and Hades; this is both literal and spiritual, as we know that there are angels imprisoned in hell.

Because of the atonement paid for our sins once and for all by Jesus himself, we now have a direct access to God, the Veil has been torn, death has no power and we have an assurance of Eternal life. John 10:28-30.

t is not that the capital punishment of nailing on the cross was ceased after Christ's death, Peter and many others were later hanged on the cross. So what was different about Jesus' cross?

When Jesus dies, at that exact moment things greatly shift in the Spiritual realm!

As Christian believers we have to realize that, God and Satan are in conflict with each other, but this conflict is not about strength or might, if it were so, God being the most powerful entity, Satan never had any chance of winning, but this is a conflict of character! Remember Satan is not a name, it is a tittle which means accuser or adversary, There are many instances, where we see Satan accusing, E.g., Satan accusing Job, Satan accusing Joshua (Zechariah 3:1-2). Just as Satan's nature is to accuse, God's nature is to be Holy, Just and Merciful.

Satan- the accuser had no idea what Jesus's death would change. If he had the slightest idea that through Jesus's death the entire human race could have a chance to receive eternal life and reverse the curse of death, he would have made sure that Jesus does not die on that cross. Yes, Satan is smart and cunning but he is not an 'all knowing' being. As mentioned before this fight was not about power but about God's character. The tragedy of sin at Eden questioned the Just and Holy nature of God, this was a planned indirect intent of accusing God by Satan; How can a just God who hates sin, tolerate his creation now full of sin? How can God go against his own will?

Satan knew there was no way that any angel or human could reverse the curse of death but God himself but he did not know how Jesus would reverse this! When Jesus died on the cross, Satan thought he had won because he killed Jesus and there was no hope for mankind. But he was wrong; the moment Jesus breathed his last, things

His eternal plan is wise and His grace is deep and wide in Christ to give us salvation even the weakest and most unrighteous. John 5:7-8 The sick man answered him, "Sir, I have no one to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up, but while I'm coming, another steps down before me."Jesus said to him, "Arise, take up your mat, and walk." The sick man who wanted to be healed in the pool of Bethesda was trying to jump into the pool for 38 years. Jesus came to him and healed him. He said to him, "Behold, you are healed; sin no more. The Lord took us to the place of our sickness, took upon Himself all our sicknesses and suffered on the Cross, so that we might be healed all sin is removed from the heart of God. The body of Jesus, crucified for sinners is buried. Rom 6:4 We were buried therefore with him through baptism to death, that just like Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we also might walk in newness of life. Our sins in God's heart are buried with Jesus, our sins are no longer visible in God's heart, and Christ, who was resurrected without sin on the third day, is revealed to us in our new life -Halleluiah praise be to God in the highest. To sanctify us daily, the Spirit of God leads us in the path of righteousness. Philippians 2:13 For it is God who works in you both to will and to work, for his good pleasure.

ime and place is not a barrier for a sound meditation. People always prefer to be at a calm and quiet place for a successful meditation. The Seashore meditation at the dawn of Easter Monday at the Shanghumugham Beach, Trivandrum, ISW in the year 2010 was one of its kind happened in the history of the Salvation Army!

It is customary to have week-long Prayer and Meditation Meetings on every evening of the Passion Week. The series starts with a March of Witness on the Palm Sunday morning along the public road, waving palm leaves, beating the drums and tambourines and singing praises of Jesus. The Good Friday meeting is a 4-hour long service. The main theme of meditation is based on the 7 sayings of Jesus on the cross. On the Easter dawn 4 am there is a Candle-Light Procession, followed by the Sunrise Service at 5 am. It will be followed by Easter Sunday Holiness Meeting at 9 am. All meetings are marked by good attendance. The Trivandrum Central Corps (ISW) in that year had decided to extend further the fellowship meeting one day more. The Easter-Monday at 4 am! A Seashore Meditation!

Organizational Hurdles

The organizing of such an event at an odd hour was a bit challenging. The sea shore selected had been a sensitive area. The beach having been used by different religious groups for their sacred rituals had been met with some violence earlier. The police authorities were reluctant to give permission at first as they don't want to take a chance for another communal clash. They feared that other religious factions could make some troubles. We have convinced them that it's only a prayer

meeting for religious harmony. We had to go to several Police Stations one after the other, located many miles apart, as this area was under the jurisdiction of several Circles. After a weeks' ordeal we got the sanction at last! Corps Commanding Officer Captain Jacob Joseph (now Lt. Colonel), CSM Willy Pulimugath, Corps Secretary Manuel George, Treasurer Georgekutty were determined to go ahead with the spiritual outreach as planned. We were sure that we would get it as we have prayed for two days at the spot before jumping into the event. Afterwards we met the Priests of other Local Churches and local people of the area and sought their support and also had invited them to the prayer meeting. The time selected was quite odd. 4 am! Early in the morning! Special buses were arranged to take the Officers, soldiers and children, the Training College Staff and Cadets to the Meditation Point, which was 15km away. Special platform was set up on a mobile vehicle and also the sound system as permission were denied for them on the ground.

Drama by Young People

Young people had re-enacted a drama on the plot of Jesus' reunion with his disciples 'having-put-his-hand-to-the-plow -(net)and-looking-back' attitude; Jesus retrieving and making them fishers of men eventually. A 'Catamaran' was rented out. An interesting thing was that the actors have started the "make up" for the drama from 2am! Jesus and the 12 disciples looked original. The drama was Directed by C. M. Chacko (Promoted to Glory) and background music track by Jose Bappayya. It sounded very effective. The cadets sang a touching Malayalam song "Galilee... Have vou seen my Master?" written and composed by Major John Samuel, Training Principal. Renowned artist Narayana Bhattathiri had designed an attractive brochure for the event.

When the prayer was over, alas! it was a real time of fisher men dragging the net to the shore! We all had joined with them and drawn the net ashore containing lots of fish. We all felt the same mood as described in the gospel of John! Afterwards we served "Appam" (bread) and fish stew curry to all the participants. A great sense of satisfaction infilled in our hearts.

Main Theme of Meditation

The main theme of meditation was presented by Colonel Jaya Paul (Promoted to Glory), Territorial Commander, an eloquent speaker, based on a note by Commissioner William Francis (Canada). We owe to Colonel for he had graciously agreed to speak at an odd hour away from the church! The theme was the everchallenging conversation between Jesus and Simon Peter written in the 21st chapter of the gospel according to John. Jesus asking him three times, "Do you love me more than these"? Colonel Jaya Paul gave an inspiring and moving message. Cool breeze grazing the murmuring waves had touched every person present there. It was really nothing else than the embracing of Holy Spirit. We could see the fishermen drawing their nets for their worldly life. Peter and his friends were doing the same. 
