ith great joy we celebrate our independence and remember our heroes who fought for our freedom. Know Relevance of our Spiritual Freedom

We, the followers of Jesus, also know that Jesus has freed us from the bondage of sin and evil. Jesus said, "Very truly I tell you, everyone who sins is a slave to sin. Now a slave has no permanent place in the family, but a son belongs to it forever. So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed" (John 8:34-36, NIV). Jesus had to pay the greatest cost to free us from the curse and power of evil. As Peter, the disciple of Jesus, describes in his letter, 'For you know that it was not with perishable things such as silver or gold that you were redeemed from the empty way of life handed down to you from your ancestors, but with the precious blood of Christ, a lamb without blemish or defect' (1 Peter 1:18-19, NIV).

Our spiritual freedom should inform how we respond to the constitutional freedom of our country. During the last days of Jesus' ministry on earth, the Pharisees of that time wanted to trap him by proving that he was against the government. Their question was whether paying the poll-tax to the government was right or wrong. Jesus replied, "Give back to Caesar what is Caesar's (the Roman ruler at that time), and to God what is God's" (Matthew 22:15-22). Jesus teaches us to be legally responsible to our government, and spiritually accountable to God.

Consider Guidelines

Saint Paul provides us with powerful guidelines to emphasize how we are to use this freedom Jesus gave us responsibly. Here is what he says, 'You have been set free from sin and have become slaves to righteousness. I am using an example from everyday life because of your human limitation. Jus as you used to offer yourselves as slaves to impurity and to ever-increasing wickedness, so now offer yourselves as slaves to righteousness leading to holiness. When you were slaves to sin, you were free from the control of righteousness, What benefit did you reap at that time from the things you are now ashamed of? Those things result in death! But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the benefit you reap leads to holiness, and the result is eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord' (Romans 6:18-23, NIV).

Our spiritual freedom should empower us to use our country's constitutional freedom with higher commitment and love towards our fellow citizens. These days, as we experience tremendous tension between communities, it becomes

As Saint Paul wrote to the Christians in Corinth, 'Whenever anyone turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away. Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. And we all, who with unveiled faces contemplate the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his image with everincreasing glory ... '(2 Corinthians 3:16-18, NIV).

As we take part in commemorating India's Independence Day, let me encourage you to be true citizens, making every effort to be responsible. Know that 'it is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Eket stadium funeral to follow fatal Nigeria accident

ollowing the tragic and fatal road accident in the Salvation Army Akwa Ibom South East Division, Nigeria, on 29 June 2023, Territorial Commander Commissioner Daniel Kasuso and Commissioner Tracey Kasuso (Territorial President of Women's Ministries) travelled to Akwa Ibom on 6th July with Lt. Colonels Joseph and Ngozi Mbagwu, Secretary for Personnel and Territorial Home League Secretary respectively.

Accompanied by Divisional leaders from the five Akwa Ibom State divisions, the territorial leaders visited each of the bereaved families to offer counsel and reassurance of God's continual love. Prayers and messages of hope and comfort were given in moments of sober reflection as the families of those promoted to Glory (passed away) shared their feelings with the commissioners. There was consensus for a mass funeral service to be held on 28 July at Eket Stadium.

Commissioner Daniel Kasuso established a committee to arrange the funerals, made up of Salvationists, divisional leaders serving in Akwa Ibom and representatives of the bereaved families, and coordinated by Major Udo Uwak, Divisional Commander, Akwa Ibom South East. The number of mourners expected to attend the funeral is between three and four thousand.

Immediately after the funeral service, each casket will be conveyed to its respective home for a brief committal, with officers assigned to perform each ceremony.

The territorial leaders acknowledge the support of General Brian Peddle in assigning Commissioners Keith and Yvonne Conrad (respectively International Secretary and Zonal Secretary for Women's Ministries, Africa Zone, International Headquarters) to represent him at the massed service of those promoted to Glory.

God foreshadowed the entrance of Jesus Christ, who came to free humanity from sin—the spiritual slavery that results in death—when He delivered the Israelites from captivity in Egypt.

GOD'S ANSWER TO OUR LOSS OF FREEDOM

Jesus declared He was the one God's people had been waiting for ever since humanity fell when He started his brief earthly ministry. He accomplished this by reciting a specific passage from the book of Isaiah, which, as his audience was aware, made reference to the Messiah or Saviour of the World.

The lines, which were written some hundred years prior, foretold of an upcoming new freedom. Jesus was stating that the future had come to pass as He got up to read. He would bring about liberty.

"He also received the prophet Isaiah's scroll. He located the writing and unrolled the scroll to reveal it. 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor.'

He then sat down after rolling up the scroll and returning it to the attendant. And he was the centre of attention for everyone in the synagogue. And he started to tell them, 'Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." (Luke 4:17–21, emphasis added).

What is Faith and What is Prayer?

hereas scholars have defined Faith and Prayer. They argue that in case anything is hard to be recognized as Truth, it is taken to be believed that there is nothing evident to convince it with physical proof or material evidence.

What is the need for Faith?

Faith is necessary to please God. Without Faith, no one can obtain recognition from God Yet, faith alone is not sufficient to be accepted by God, because Faith without Prayer and works is almost dead or inactive. However, it does not mean that good deeds and righteous activities can please God and obtain recognition. Genuine Faith and righteous works can please God. They should go hand in hand for the healthy, happy, and hearty communion of the brethren in a Christian congregation. Christianity is the amalgamation of Holiness and Heavenly Happiness co-existing in worship. Prayer and Holy lifestyle of the members in a

Christian Church (Read Romans 10: & 17; Hebrews 11:1, 6 & 7; James 5:15, etc)

Apostle Paul Vs Apostle James?

Apostle Paul is reckoned as the 13th Apostle, as he came into the school of the Apostles some years after the ascension of Lord Jesus Christ into Heaven. Paul was selected by the Lord to convey the Gospel to many countries outside of the Land of Israel; Soon he become an Apostle for the Lord. As a scholar himself Academic Education under the famous Professor, Gamaliel of the University of Alexandria, Paul taught the word of God vehemently and authoritatively, with excellence in spiritual knowledge and wisdom. Apostle Peter, the most prominent of the Apostles wrote about Paul in the 2nd Epistle of Peter Chapter 3, verses 15 through 16, that Paul had written several serious spiritual sermons, which are incomprehensible for the spiritually ignorant and instable in spirituality.



Apostle Paul argued logically and spiritually that Faith is the basement of salvation consisting of Conviction, Confession, Contrition, and Conversion mentally and spiritually. He declared vehemently that without faith, no one can be saved. He gave more prominence to Faith than Works, for Salvation. On the contrary, Apostle James argued that faith without works is dead and that it is insufficient, ineffective, and meaningless without works. In the Epistle of James, Chapter 2, verses 17 through 20, the Apostle demanded reasonably to execute proper spiritual works to materialize one's Faith and Belief.

Nevertheless, Apostle Paul argued systematically and spiritually that good deeds and righteous works cannot please God. He ascertained that good deeds and activities of righteous works cannot please God. He ascertained devoid of Faith will not bring forth spiritual fruits Apostle Paul gave more importance to faith than to works.

What is the inter relation of Faith and Prayer?

Prayer is the link of every person with God. It joins man to God. Some people say that Prayer is a bridge between Man and God. It symbolizes that there is a distance between Man and God, but it can be bridged up by Prayer.

Now let us conclude that Prayer must be the embodiment of faith. Above all we should bear in mind that we can pray to God directly without any mediator Besides it is reliable that anyone can pray directly to God. May God bless you.

Salvation Army Work in Thailand Officially Recognised

Following a meeting of The General's Council on 13 June 2023, General Brian Peddle has approved the official recognition of the commencement of the Army's work in the Kingdom of Thailand, making it the 134th country in which The Salvation Army has a legally and officially recognised ministry.

Ithough the process for registration of The Salvation Army as a legal entity began in 2016, it was only on 28 April 2023 that the government of Chiang Province approved the establishment of The Salvation Army, with the work in Thailand coming under the direction of the Singapore, Malaysia and Myanmar Territory.

PIONEERING WORK

The Salvation Army began to explore the possibility of ministry in the country during a visit to Chiang Mai, northern Thailand, in 2012.

Recognised as a developing country with a population approaching 70 million, a need for the saving gospel of Jesus Christ and the work of the Army

camps

was identified as, despite a strong economy, freedom of religion and open and friendly ties with the West, wealth and prosperity is enjoyed by some whilst others are still living in poverty.

Pioneering work in Chiang Mai was undertaken in August 2014 when International Headquarters appointed Majors Ken and Neva Phiouthong to initiate research and development, work that continued to advance under subsequent officers and lay personnel. There has been a worshipping community since 2015, with the joyful enrolment of soldiers under each leadership team.

The activities of The Salvation Army in

Thailand have been diverse, including assisting flood victims, visiting prisons, and offering support to the homeless and those living in poverty. Other work to share the good news has included for underprivileaed children, sports ministry, team and women's group Bible

studies, fundraising, fellowship events, men's fellowship gatherings and home visits.

> Currently the corps (Church) has 15 senior soldiers, eight recruits for soldiership, five Sunday school participants, six corps council members, eight in the women's group and seven people attending online meetings.
