Jeremiah 29:11 is one of the most quoted verses in Scripture: *"For I know the plans I have for you,"* declares the Lord, *"plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."* These words are a beacon of hope, but to truly grasp their depth, we must understand their context and meaning.

As we enter the year 2026 let's focus on God who is the Alpha and Omega, the Creator, Preserver and Governor of the Universe. He is very loving and intentional God. BLESSINGS OF FLOWING RIVER

General Lyndon Buckingham addressed the people who gathered world to make sure they are fully immersed in the river of God's love, grace and Holy Spirit refreshing in Together 2025 gathering at Birmingham, United Kingdom & Ireland Territory.

In Christianity, rivers symbolize life, abundance, and the flow of God's blessings, serving as powerful metaphors for His presence and provision. Rivers in the scripture carry deep spiritual meaning they're not just physical streams of water, but symbols of God's life-giving presence, renewal, and blessing. A flowing river can speak to each one of us several truth such as:

Source of Life:

Just as a river sustains the land it touches, God's Spirit sustains our souls. "Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb, through the middle of the street of the city; also, on either side of the river, the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, yielding its fruit each month. The leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations". (Revelation 22:1-2) In Revelation, the "river of the water of life" flows from God's throne, reminding believers that true life and refreshment come only from Him.

Jesus Himself declares in John 14:6, "*I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me.*" Here, Jesus identifies Himself as the

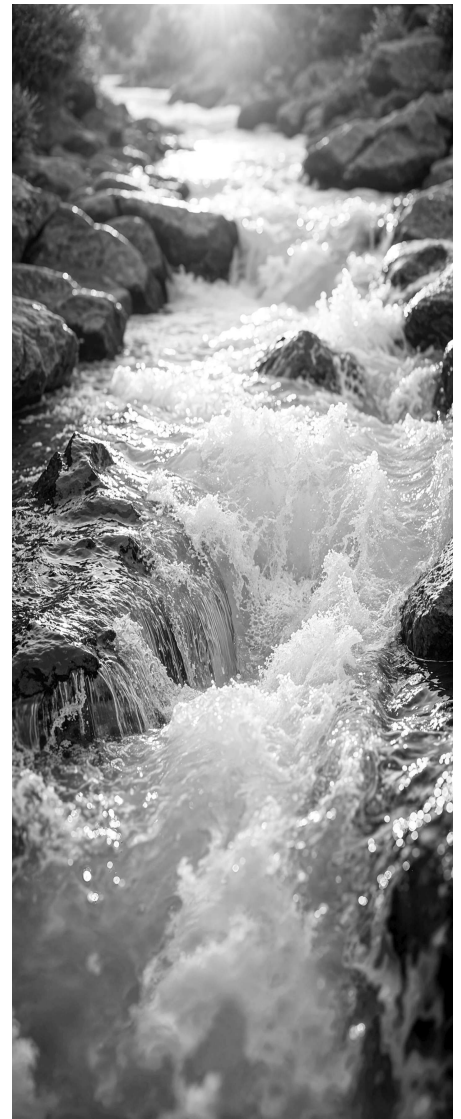
exclusive source of eternal life and the means by which humanity can be reconciled to God. The water is frequently used in Scripture to symbolize life and sustenance. In John 4:14, Jesus offers the Samaritan woman "living water," saying, "Whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst". Indeed, the water I give him will become in him a fountain of water spring.

Continuous Renewal:

Rivers also symbolize purification and spiritual refreshment. A river is always moving, cleansing, and bringing new life wherever it goes. This mirrors how God's grace continually washes over us, renewing our hearts and guiding us forward in faith. This is the river of the Holy Spirit, the "living water" Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me as Scripture has said rivers of living water will flow from within them (John 7:37-38). It is the presence of God infilling and indwelling the believer so they might be fully alive to his work in the world, released to participate in his work of redemption, renewal, grace, love, mercy and forgiveness.

Overflowing Blessings:

In Ezekiel's vision, the river from the temple grows deeper and wider, bringing healing and abundance. This reflects how God's blessings often start small but grow as we walk with Him, touching more lives along the way. There's this beautiful picture that comes to us in an Old Testament book from long ago. The prophet Ezekiel sees a river flowing from the throne of God and where this river flows, it brings healing, it brings restoration, it brings life, it brings transformation (Ezekiel 47:1-12). Wherever the river flows, there is evidence of God's love, God's grace, God's renewal and God's creativity.



Hope and Restoration:

The message of hope and restoration is a powerful reminder of God's unwavering commitment to renew and heal. It is a message of comfort and assurance, encouraging individuals to persevere with the belief that better days are ahead. Isaiah 43:19 says that "*I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland*".

God is able to bring hope and restoration to the people who are in the hopeless situations. As we step into the new year God calls the believers to have a faith to deeper trust, surrender, and intimacy with him in this new year. May the New Year enable every one of you to find peace within yourself and connect with your soul. I wish you a blessed New Year 2026.





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
