



As the world is facing the significant issues such as financial crisis, unemployment, poverty, exclusion of communities from the society, in 1995, Copenhagen, Denmark, hosted the World Summit for Social Development, and made the 'Copenhagen Declaration and Programme of Action'. here is a time to begin and a time to stop, and then to start a new chapter of your life. This is the cycle of officership in the Salvation Army. In various appointments, along with Commissioner Martha, we had to finish one chapter of life and move to the next as God sent us, through our leaders. Being appointed as international leaders for South Asia, though, was the last chapter of our journey of active officership. It has been a humbling experience to work under The General and Chief of the Staff and with other international leaders at IHQ.

As we finish this chapter of our active officership, we exit through the round rolling door of IHQ, knowing and accepting the start of a new chapter which is retirement from our active service of almost 43 years, but still continually and faithfully serving God's Kingdom, making ourselves available for him in the mission of saving souls and the life-transforming work of the Holy Spirit, in the lives of the people he will send us to.

We would describe our officership this way: "Our lives have been a living story of God's love and compassion, and he has not finished with us, as he continues moulding us to his will. We are still in his school of life, to pass into the everlasting life he has designed and promised in Jesus." Under his hands we

have learned some lessons, which have brought us to this stage of life, and we are still learning to be continually formed in the perfect likeness of Jesus, until our last breath.

Of the many lessons we learned, we want to mention a few here, trusting that they will be a blessing to those who are called to serve him in this life.

We have learned to depend completely on God - to simply follow him with complete trust, even when we do not know what the future holds. That's how we learned to lived out our officership. Knowing that we are not perfect, but in Jesus, by his grace, God has counted us perfect and has given us the opportunity to walk in his shadow, and this journey still will go on. Although we will not hold any position in the ranks of active officership, we remain faithful soldiers and remain in his service until we lay down our sword and happily cross over to the land where Jesus will receive us as victorious soldiers and messengers of God - just as Jesus said, "the one who stands firm to the end will be saved" (Matthew 24:13), and the Bible tells us to be faithful to Jesus even to the point of death, so that we receive our prize in heaven (Revelation 2:10).

Very importantly, we learned and agreed to completely submit to God's power and follow Jesus in every step of our lives. We are always aware of our weaknesses, but have complete confidence in God's power, and know for sure that we cannot do any good in our own strength but only by the power of Jesus Christ. We may be most imperfect people, but our Lord is supremely perfect. As the Potter, his gentle hands, once around you, will make you whatever he wants you to be. As Saint Paul said, "I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation ... I can do all this through him who gives me strength" (Philippians 4:13).

We both, in unison, agree with what Saint Paul said in his letter to the early Christians in Corinth, about how Jesus's grace is sufficient for us and his power is made perfect in our weakness, and therefore we emptied ourselves, letting Christ's power rest on us, as we submit to him and to his authority over our lives (do read 2 Corinthians 12:9).

It was very important for us in our officership to learn to give the uttermost priority to the will of God in our lives. Most of us find it difficult to overcome the temptation to put personal ambition over the will and plan of God for our lives. The hierarchical system of our organization sometimes makes it easy to develop the wrong priorities, which are not from God, who called you into his service. From the very beginning of our officership, God showed and warned us how that kind of thinking would hinder our will merging into his will, and thus we would drift away from his plan for us and the mission in which he brought us to be partners with him. Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others. In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus (Philippians 2:3-5).

Well, we could speak more of what we have learned throughout our journey, but let me say one most important thing, and that is: to respect the leaders, and without any complaint whatsoever, go where you are sent. This is one of the most difficult parts of life, and we can humbly confess, that by God's grace, we were able to successfully pass. All glory to God! We are thankful to the Holy Spirit for his gentle prompting, mentoring our souls, minds, and hearts to stick to the Calling and to God wherever we were sent, with only one purpose: to preach his gospel of God's kingdom and find joy in doing his will - even when things do not go according to what we may have desired and hoped for. We should allow God's Spirit to continually produce good work in and through us, to the very end (Philippians 1: 6). "For we are

ear comrade, we all know that the third John is a small book. In fact, it is the shortest book in the New Testament. As I was reading through this book, recently I read the apostle John's comments concerning those who were working and supporting in the early church, in verse 8, John wrote, "Therefore we ought to support people like these, that we may be fellow workers for the truth." John reminds Gaius of the responsibility that Christians have in helping the work in the kingdom. He says it is something we ought to do. This verse speaks of an obligation to the kingdom's work.

Another interesting observation from that verse is that when we support the work of the kingdom, we become "co-worker" in God's service with others who are working. The same word is used thirteen time in the New Testament. An interesting use of the word is found in 1 Thessalonians 3:2 which read, "and sent Timothy, our brother and God's co-worker in gospel of Christ, to establish and exhort you in your faith." The word is used here to describe Timothy was a co-worker of God's service. When Timothy was a worker in the kingdom, not only was he a fellow worker with Paul, but he was "God's co-worker." When we support a work in the kingdom such as this, we are (1) fellow workers with other Christians and (2) co-worker with God. What an amazing thought that I can be a co-worker with God. What an honor it surely is for each of us to be able to say that we are working alongside God in His kingdom, for His glory!

In 1 Corinthian 3:9 Paul wrote, "For we are God's co-workers; you are God's field, God's building. In this verse Paul wants to remind us

that we are the co-workers of God's gospel. Let us know His work in which we are the co-worker with Him, Matthew 28:19-20,"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the father and of the son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age.

Motherless Babies Home,

Aizawl Mizoram

otherless Babies Home was established in the year 1952, which was located at Tuikual South, Aizawl, Mizoram. It was the first Orphanage Home known in Mizoram. The first person appointed to look after the home was Mr. Lalhmingliana . Since 2014 It was under Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS) which recently subsumed under Mission Vatsalaya. 90% were funded by the scheme and 10% from the State Govt. And it has the capacity of 25 children and Age group 0-10 yrs. There are two main Board committee in the Home which are Management Board (from the Govt), Expenditure Board and Management Board (From the Salvation

Army) and 11 staffs (Superintendent, Counselor, Case worker, Paramedical staff, Helper, Cook, Physical Trainer (PT

Instructor), Home Mother and Driver) to look after the children from which 4 of the staffs were on a duty 24×7 hours. Recently there are 20 Children out of which 15 are Boys and 5 are Girls.

The children were admitted through Child Welfare Committee. Child Welfare Committee mostly admitted the children in the Home for the period of 1 year and after that a

careful investigation was done by the Case worker to make sure that if the parents were fit to take back the children or not. If not Child welfare committee extended their period of stay. There are two types of children:

Children in conflict with law and Children in need of care and protection. Children who

were admitted to the Home are the children who are in need of care and protection. After staying till the age of 10 the children were transfer to the other homes who were fit to take up the children.

Counselor help the children by carrying out activities according to the children needs and counseling to both the Parents and Children and establish the linkages with voluntary workers and

organization to facilitate rehabilitation and social reintegration of the children to ensure the necessary follow up . Helps the

children and prepare the case file of the child and different duties set by the Mizoram Juvenile Justice Act. Children were giving Diet and Nutrition in consultation of Dietician and follow Daily Routines set by the staffs. Children who were able to attend school were admitted to the School and go to school daily and they were given support by the staff in the Home. The Office staffs have case Investigation on regular basis, visits the children's relatives, pray for them and give them counseling on how to prepare themselves to look after their children after being restored from home. Also Home has part time doctor whom we call and consult as per needed.

There are some activities and programmes which we conducted yearly in Motherless Babies Home such as Sightseeing, Birthday Celebration, Montessori programmes, Free Medical/Dental Checkup, Orientation programme on water, sanitation and hygiene, Fellowship programme etc.

Much Hard work is really paid by the staff and especially the staff who were on a duty for 24×7 hours in elevating and bringing changes to the life of the children.

The main objectives of the home were to provide care, compassion, comfort and protection to the children and parents and restored to their family. Most of the children family came from the Lower Class who were drugs addict and alcohol abuser, so it's really challenging for the staff to transform them so we request you to support us and pray for the children and staff.



Through The Lord's Mercies, WE ARE NOT CONSUMED

The most remarkable and significant element was that God spoke to Moses His immense mercy in His own words, 'the Lord, the Lord God merciful and gracious, longsuffering and abounding in goodness and truth, keeping mercy for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sins, by no means clearing the guilt; _____' (Exodus 34:6-7). God's mercy reveals God's divine love. The prophet Micah also said, 'He does not retain His anger forever, because He delights in His mercy (Micah 7:18).

THE LORD IS ALWAYS MERCIFUL:

The Lord is merciful. He also enjoys showing mercy. This is a fundamental quality of God. According to the prophet Micah, "the Lord delights in mercy." (Micah 7:18). According to King David, the Lord is always merciful in all of his ways (Psalm 25:10). God's nature is continual mercy. It is unlimited (Psalm 25:6, Isaiah 54:8,10). The Lord's mercy exhibits pity on the afflicted on (Job 6:14), good deeds (Nehemiah 13:14) and good favour (Esther 2:17). God's mercy is always carries His love.

MERCY REVEALS COMPASSION:

We can use the word "mercy" to refer to many forms of compassion. When someone begs you to "be merciful," it means you should have sympathy for them. A tax collector appealed out to God in a parable told by Jesus, "Be merciful to me a sinner while praying in the synagogue." (St. Luke 18:3). The two blind men called out to Jesus and said, 'Have mercy on us, son of David (St. Matthew 9:27) on these two occasions, the word reveals compassion of God to be show on the needy

roots in His covenantal ties with people. He invites us to accept His mercy as He provides it to us. He is enveloping believers in His mercy (Psalm 32:10; Hosea 10:12). Furthermore, the definitions of Mercy and Grace (Caris), which are frequently interpreted as "loving kindness" or "goodness" in the Old Testament, are comparable. The Bible teaches that God is merciful, gracious, loving-kind, and giving. Those who have experienced God's love and mercy ought to repay the favour by being nice to their friends, family, and even adversaries (Colossians 3:12).

GOD'S MANIFOLD MERCIES:

God is merciful in His dealings with humanity. King David in a desperate situation testified, 'I am in great distress. Please let us fall into the hand of the Lord for His mercies are great, but do not let me fall into the hands of man' (II Samuel 24:14). Children of Israel confessed praying 'yet in your manifold mercies you did not forsake them in the wilderness (Nehemiah 9:19) and again, they prayed, 'Nevertheless in Your great mercy, you did not utterly consume them nor forsake them, for you are God, gracious ad merciful' (Nehemiah 9:31). David prayed, 'to the Lord our God belong mercy and forgiveness, though we have rebelled against Him' (Daniel 9:9). Many in her adoration sang, 'And His mercy is on those who fear Him' (St. Luke 1:50). St. Paul declared that 'God is rich in His mercy' while writing to the saints in Ephesians Church. (Ephesians 2:4).

WE NEED TO BE MERCIFUL TOWARDS OTHERS:

Sharing what the Lord gives us with others is something that God expects from us. Whether it's fresh start, riches, success, love, morality, or forgiveness, etc. the Lord says 'Execute true justice, show mercy and compassion, everyone to his brother (Zechariah 7:9). Jesus' emphasized saying, 'to have justice and mercy while paying tithe of mint and anise and cumin' (St. Matthew 23:23). Jesus also said 'therefore be merciful, just as your Father also is merciful (St. Luke 6:36).

WE NEED TO PRAY FOR GOD'S MERCY:

God is such a kind and generous being. God demonstrated His complete love for us on the cross. God loves us with all of His heart, soul, and power. St. Paul counsels Christians to ask for mercy. He said, 'Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need.' (Hebrew 4:16). In His Sermon on the Mount Jesus declared, 'blessed are the merciful, For they shall obtain mercy' (St. Matthew 5:7)

ecently we have been to the famous nature-wonder and tourist destination Borra Caves. This is situated 90 Km away from Vizaghapattanam, Andhra Pradesh, India. Borra Caves (Borra in Telungu means Hole) is 150 million year old limestone caves, largest and deepest in the country at an altitude of 1400 meters and occupying an area of 2 Sq.Km. and 80 m deep! It was our first experience to go down deep into the crust of the earth!

While I was inside the dark deep pit so many thoughts flashed through my mind.

First and foremost was about Hell. We normally are over-burdened with the concept of Hell.

Let me share some of my thoughts inside the Borra Caves.

- 1. Jesus visiting the hell (hades) on the following day of Good Friday. Ephesian 4:9 Now this "He ascended"- what does it mean but that He also first descended into the lower parts of the earth...where there is weeping and gnashing (Matthew 13:42) ... where the need to preach the gospel for those who are dead, that they might be judged according to men in the flesh, but live according to God in the spirit (1 Peter 4:6)
- 2. A classic example came to my mind was that of a Bishop's remark, a compliment, about salvationists, in a meeting hosted in honour of The General of the Salvation Army, at Kowdiar, ISW, years back. The Bishop remarked that "it is quite difficult to find salvationists in Heaven, because they would be busy at the front gate of Hell, preaching the Gospel! The Bishop had been complimenting the Salvationist's enthusiasm for Open-Airs!
- 3. The story of the unnamed rich man in hell yearning to wet his throat by the hands of the poor man Lazarus, whom he discarded on his earthly life but now enjoying peace on the bossom of Abraham in Heaven.
- 4. The common phrase, "what the hell he's doing out there".

The cave is being visited by young and old, hundreds in number. One of the

I took it out and started playing a common tune, which is emotionally received in India over the centuries, the National Song "Vande Mataram"!

Many youngsters looking at me in amusement and they might have thought, "what the hell he is doing out there"! Ha! Ha! Taking advantage of the situation, I immediately started PLAYING THE GOSPEL TUNE "How Great Thou Art"! and shouted Hallelujah! The mellifluous bamboo music and the shout of praise echoed in the changed atmosphere. I am not sure, how many of the passers- by had recognized the tune. But I was sure that a pinch of solace and divine presence had swept into many a hearts. There is no specific space or time to be a witness of Jesus. It was a "Heaven came down and Glory filled my soul"-experience for me.

Hallelujah! The angels are praising God and the Heavens resounding incessantly!

Hallelujah! Is also a word that could change the hell-like situation to a heavenly one.
