2017 Summary

The camper count has climbed back above four-hundred. This has been the goal since moving from a seven-week program to five weeks.

We completed transition to a new camp management software. Returning campers’ information from 2017 is saved – making it easier to register online this year. Donors with email receive a receipt the morning after their gift is recorded. Volunteers and staff now get weekly reports that are generated automatically.

The playground area has been updated and was actively used all summer and fall.

Camper Assistance funds for 2018 have already received a boost from the sale of three hundred calendars and beautiful hand-made items provided by volunteers and donors.

The chapel building has new carpet, upgraded air conditioning and other changes that have made it more useful.

The gymnasium now has brighter and more cost-effective LED lighting.

2018 Projects

This will be a year of primarily fixing up what we have. There are windows and doors to repair and replace. Lighting is being changed to LED one fixture at a time. Many of our buildings are due to be painted. Our winter volunteer season has begun.

The docks were damaged in the storm and will need repair this spring. Many trees were damaged or lost, but the Lord protected the people and buildings. The Lord is Faithful & True. **Thank you for praying with us.**

ONLINE REGISTRATION

FIRST TIME REGISTERING ONLINE?

Your name is in the Camp Horizon database if you received this newsletter in the mail. However, if you did not register for summer camp or a retreat in 2017 you do not have a user-name and password yet. We ask that you contact us so that we can connect your current record to the online login. Help us to avoid duplicates.

RETURNING CAMPERS

Camper forms that were completed in 2017 contain most of the information that you entered. The signatures were removed so that you will review and update information like T-Shirt sizes. Some things like email, phones, grade, and addresses can be updated. However, if you need to correct birthdates or gender you need to contact the camp office.

ENROLLED – NOT REGISTERED

When a parent selects a session (week of camp) and begins completing the camper forms, that camper is now “enrolled”. If you exit before completing the entire registration all of the forms that you complete are saved. All required forms must be completed before you will be allowed to make a payment. A weekly email reminder is sent to all enrolled but not registered campers.

Beginning April 15, enrolled but not registered camper applications that are 30 days old will be un-enrolled.

Beginning May 15, enrolled but not registered camper applications that are 10 days old will be un-enrolled.

WAITLISTED

If a session fills and an enrolled camper tries to complete their registration (pay their deposit), that camper is waitlisted. Enrolling does not “hold” your spot.

REGISTERED

A camper is registered when all forms are complete and a deposit has been made. Until the camper status is “Registered” the application is incomplete.

2018 SUMMER CAMP FEES

Summer Camp tuition for 2018 is \$275.00 per week. This includes a t-shirt and cabin photograph.

Tubing is \$40 per week (limited enrollment)

Transportation (South Florida – Hollywood & PGA Blvd) We hope to finalize plans for transportation at the January board meeting. The proposed cost is \$20 (\$40 round-trip).

Spending (Snak Shak). Please limit online prepaid spending to \$20 for Junior Camp and \$40 for Teen Camp. The store is open daily for Junior Camp and twice daily for Teen Camp.

SUMMER CAMP DISCOUNTS

EARLY REGISTRATION DISCOUNT

Complete Registration by February 28 for a \$30 discount. All discounts are applied after a deposit has been made. The online balance assumes the discounts.

SIBLING DISCOUNT

The sibling discount is \$15.00 and applies to each camper in your household. This discount is applied after at least two campers are registered (deposit required).

CAMPER ASSISTANCE

If you are not eligible for other discounts or are unable to afford the full tuition you can apply for Camper Assistance (certain rules apply). This is one of the online forms. This form is not visible on the camper dashboard until the camper is enrolled.

CAMPER EMAIL MESSAGES

The program for 2018 has not been released yet. We understand that the parents will be able to send one-way emails to their campers from the Camper Dashboard directly. The parent can send invitations to family members (and even themselves) which will contain a link to the email program directly and an access code. Plain text messages are free. We may have an option to allow attachments (not free). That information will be provided to parents early in the summer.

RECYCLING FOR HANDICRAFTS

There is always a need for bags with handles (gift bags) to send crafts home. When the crafts are planned later this spring we will update our wish list on the website.



The program is divided into four ten-week quarters. There are three quarters of Bible instruction and one quarter of Christian ministry.

The cost of the program including meals and lodging for the two days of classes each week is \$1,500 per quarter. Through special gifts to get this program started we are able to offer \$500 in tuition assistance for full-time students.

Information is also available on our website [CHBI.US] for those that wish to attend part-time. The second quarter begins January 8. The third quarter begins March 19.



SUMMER STAFF 2018

The online summer staff application goes live on January 1st. Please begin the process early so that we can get references and background screening completed.

Each summer we process over one-hundred summer camp staff applications. This year things will be simplified for our returning staff. Like the campers, forms with information that may only need to be reviewed contain 2017 information.

- Most of the process is completed **online** using a single sign-on link. Your work is saved as you complete each screen. You do not have to complete it all at one time. However, you will not be allowed to “submit” your application until all of the required modules are complete.
- All of the forms that require signatures will be provided by email as a single printable file after your application is submitted.
- Background Screening for returning staff (2013-2017) **may** only require the submitted online application and the signed forms. The BGS form has that info.
- References are contacted automatically using the email address that you provide. Two are required.
- New applicants (and those without a recent background screen) will still be required to complete an online background screening form and submit live-scan (digital) fingerprints.
